A regular meeting of the Houston City Council was held at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, May 16, 2023, with Mayor Sylvester Turner presiding with Council Members Tarsha Jackson, Abbie Kamin, Carolyn Evans-Shabazz, Dave Martin, Tiffany Thomas, Mary Nan Huffman, Karla Cisneros, Robert Gallegos, Edward Pollard, Mike Knox, David W. Robinson, Michael Kubosh, Letitia Plummer and Sallie Alcorn; Randy Zamora, Legal Department and Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director, present. Council Member Amy Peck absent on personal business. Council Member Castex-Tatum absent on City business.

At 1:37 p.m., Mayor Turner called the meeting to order and recognized Council Member David Robinson for a proclamation. Council Member Robinson presented a proclamation to the Houston Public Works recognizing the 63rd Annual National Public Works Week. The National Public Works Week is sponsored by American Public Works Association and the Canadians Public Works Association. Carol Haddock thanked Mayor Turner and City Council for recognizing Houston Public Works Week. The theme is Connecting the World to Public Works. She also stated that the Regional Barbecue Contest will be in Rosenberg, TX next week. The Barbecue team for Houston Public Works won the contest for TC Water Program. Ms. Haddock recognized the Chief Operating Officer, Randy Macchi.

Council Member Kubosh presented a proclamation to Booker T. Washington High School Boys Basketball Team for State Championship Day at City Hall. Council Member Kubosh also recognized Dr. Carlos Phillips, Principal, and Coach Benson Grayson This is Booker T. Washington High School's third State tournament appearance. Their first appearance was in 1946, where they played in the Prairie View Interscholastic Negro League. They competed against Galveston Central. Their second appearance was in 1952, where they competed against Wheatley High School. Their third appearance was this year, where they competed against Oakcliff Family Faith Academy. Booker T. Washington Boys Basketball Program placed second in the tournament. They have five seniors going to college and ten players returning to win the next State Championship.

Mayor Sylvester Turner presented a proclamation to Ralph Cooper, a longtime on-air personality and sports legend. He has been the voice of sports media for many years. He began his career at the Forward Times as a Journalist. Six months later, he began his journey in sports. In 1973, he started at KYOK, under the direction of Rick Roberts. In November of 2020, Ralph Cooper was inducted into the Texas Radio Hall of Fame. Mr. Cooper introduced his wife, Brenda Hudson Cooper and his daughter, Sidney Taylor Cooper. He thanked them for their constant support.

The Houston City Council reconvened at 9:00 a.m., Wednesday, May 17, 2023, with Mayor Sylvester Turner presiding with Council Members Amy Peck, Tarsha Jackson, Abbie Kamin, Carolyn Evans-Shabazz, Dave Martin, Tiffany Thomas, Mary Nan Huffman, Karla Cisneros, Robert Gallegos, Edward Pollard, Martha Castex-Tatum, Mike Knox, David W. Robinson, Letitia Plummer and Sallie Alcorn; Arturo Michel, City Attorney, and Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director, present. Council Member Kubosh absent on personal business.

At 9:03 a.m., Mayor Turner called the meeting of the Houston City Council to order and stated that they are going to the Mayor's Report.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Turner spoke on the budget for Fiscal Year 2024. The Committee meetings begin today. He declared that this is the best budget presented in eight (8) years. The budget coming up is a conservative budget. The fund balance is 16.6%, which is the highest it's ever been in a fiscal year. Over \$400M was placed in the fund balance. In order to build up the fund balance, you have to draw down to balance the budget. The budget would balance even with the absence of the ARPA funding. Also, the budget didn't include the sales tax projections for April, May and June. The debt is going down because of the low payout of pension funding. The budget also includes \$10M in a trust fund. Mayor Turner is proud of the fact that as he leaves office this year, the next administration won't have to deal with many of the bigger issues that he had to deal with during his time in office.

Infrastructure Week is this week. Mayor Turner thanked Carol Haddock and her entire team.

The Houston Police Department is receiving more than a billion dollars for the first time in the history of this city. The crime rate is going down. Kathryn J. Whitmire hired more police officers during her tenure as Mayor. She hired 2,600 police officers in ten years as Mayor of the City of Houston. Mayor Turner has hired 2,200 police officers during his eight years in office.

Police Chief Finner and his team are in Washington D.C. for National Police Week. Sergeant Kendrick Simpo was honored and recognized for the National Medal of Valor regarding the shooting at the Galleria Mall in Houston, Texas, from the Department of Justice.

There will be a Groundbreaking Ceremony for the Houston Area Women's Center Emergency Support Housing this morning. The City of Houston contributed \$15.85M to that project.

Friday, May 19, 2023, is Bike to Work Day and also the Annual Africa Day 2023 Reception. We're expecting between 600 - 800 people attending the Africa Day 2023 Reception.

Mayor Turner will host his 15th Annual Family Day in the Park on Saturday, May 20, 2023. The event will take place from 2:00 - 6:00pm on West Little York. J. Paul, Jr. and the Zydeco Nu Breeds will headline the event.

Ms. Etta Crockett, a political activist and community leader, passed away. Ms. Crockett's funeral will be tomorrow, May 18, 2023 at God's Grace Community Church. The viewing is from 9:00 am - 11:00 am., followed by the funeral.
