- 7. The applicant be required to obtain a letter of no objection from each of the privately owned utility companies and the Texas Department of Transportation;
- 8. The applicant be required to furnish the Department of Public Works and Engineering with a durable, reproducible (Mylar) survey plat and field notes of the affected property;
- 9. The Legal Department be authorized to prepare the necessary transaction documents; and
- 10. Inasmuch as the value of the property interest is expected to exceed \$25,000.00, that City Council appoint the following two independent real estate appraisers to establish the value Tom Bazan and John Chambless.

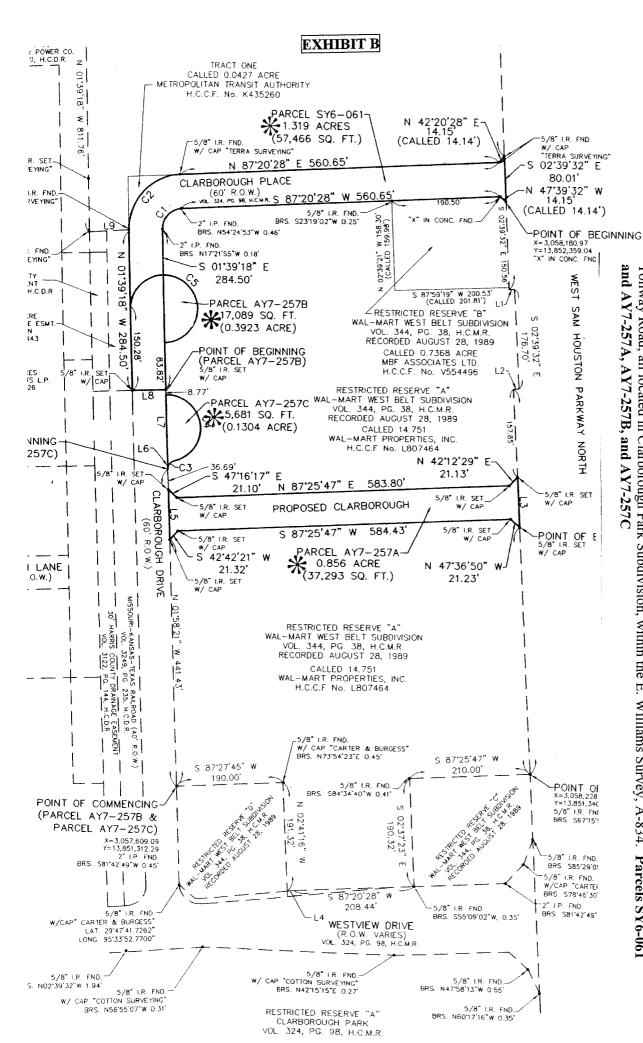

ESTABLISHES TRUCK ROUTES if, upon review of the permit, it is determined that the load's Weight, Width, Length or Height would require specific routing to prevent damage to city streets and property.

Specifies that, once approved, operation of an oversized commercial vehicle on any street not included in the approved route is prohibited and establishes a penalty for a violation of this provision.

ESCORTS REQUIRED based upon the specific routing requirement and review of the permit application.

Escorts shall be engaged at the permittee's own expense and the permittee must verify that the escorting peace officer has received appropriate training to perform the escort services required under the permit.

"NO THROUGH TRUCK" PROVISIONS include commercial vehicles that could cause damage to City streets due to the weight, width, length, or height of the commercial vehicle based on the characteristics of a specific roadway, street, bridge, or other infrastructure.

Adds the authority to seek civil penalties for damage based upon loads exceeding the maximum allowable width, length or height restrictions.

Increases the minimum fine for violation of the article to \$200.00.

On April 23, 2007, the Corporation held a public hearing as required by federal tax law. A final approval resolution authorizing the issuance of tax-exempt bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 was approved by the Corporation's Board on June 27, 2007.

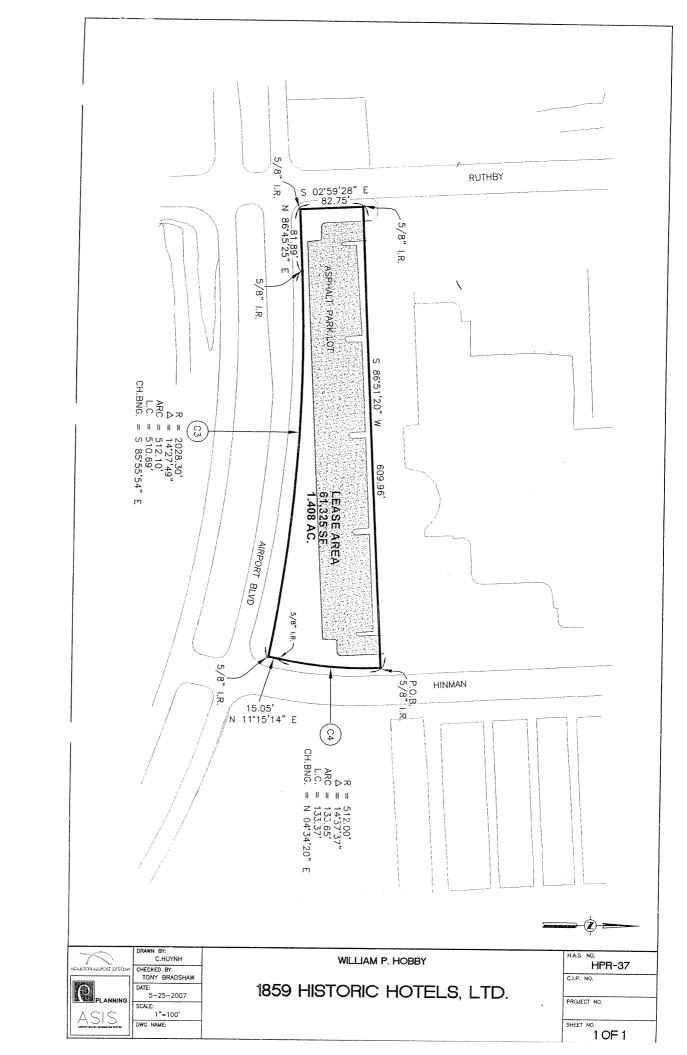

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

Road improvement districts are special districts created by the Texas legislature. Generally, these districts are empowered to promote, develop, encourage and maintain employment, commerce transportation, housing, tourism, recreation, arts, entertainment, economic development, safety and public welfare. Typically, road improvement districts are given the power to finance their operations by issuing bonds or other obligations, payable in whole or in part from ad valorem taxes, assessments, impact fees or other funds of the District to provide improvements and services. Districts may levy a tax only after holding an election within the district.

The Planning and Development Department recommends City Council consent to the creation of the following district.

Harris County Road Improvement District #1: Authorized by the 78th Legislature in 2003, this district is located entirely in District E. This district will be created in an area that was annexed into the city for limited purposes in conjunction with a strategic partnership agreement with the Clearbrook City Municipal Utility District. Following city consent to the creation of the district, the District's Board of Directors will adopt a service plan that is expected to focus on providing road projects and other improvements to underserved areas in the district.

For this district, the City provides its consent under the following conditions:

- 1. Bonds will be issued by the District only for the purposes provided in the legislation creating the District. The District must obtain the approval of the City Council of the City of Houston for the issuance of bonds for any improvement project. In lieu of approval of an individual bond issue by the City Council of the City of Houston, the district may obtain approval from the governing body of the City of Houston of a capital improvements budget for a period not to exceed five years setting forth the projects for which the District proposes to issue its bonds. The District shall submit a description of proposed projects and proposed budget to the Director of the Department of Public Works and Engineering of the City of Houston for coordination with the City's capital improvement program and approval by the Director. In the event the District obtains approval of a capital improvements budget, it may issue bonds to finance any capital improvements specified in the approved budget without further approval from the City of Houston.
- 2. No land will be added or annexed to the district until the City of Houston has given its written consent by Ordinance of the City council to such addition or annexation.
- 3. Before any construction begins within the district, the district must submit to the Director of the Department of Public Works and Engineering of the City of Houston all plans and specifications for the construction of road facilities to serve the District. Further, they must obtain the approval of such plans and specifications from the City of Houston. All roads and facilities constructed by the district must comply with the City of Houston's standard plans and specifications. Finally, prior to construction of such facilities, the District must give written notice to the director of Public Works and Engineering.



4. The City Council of the City of Houston may, by a vote of no less than two-thirds (2/3rds) of the entire membership, adopt an ordinance dissolving the District. Upon the adoption of such an ordinance, the District shall be dissolved, and, in accordance with Sections 375.263 and 43.075, Local Government Code, the City of Houston shall (1) succeed to the property and assets of the District and (2) assume all debts, obligations and liabilities of the district.

The Building Services Department, in collaboration with its legal counsel, has designed and negotiated a "structure" by which the City can transact long-term wind power deals at competitive prices. The structure enables the City to add diversity to its fuel sources from traditional fossil fuels, place long-term hedges and remove volatility from our budgets, and collect significant renewable credits for the City. The City of Houston can bring in up to 50 megawatts or one-third of its load from wind power brokered by J Aron/Goldman Sachs, with the strategy of triggering additional wind in blocks of 10 megawatts. Additionally, the structure allows the City to negotiate Price and Volume with a third party wholesale provider under set pre-approved credit and transaction terms. Once the City and third party wholesaler agree to a fixed price and volume, Reliant Energy will transact the deal on behalf of the City and flow it through the General Land Office for delivery to City facilities. Merrill Lynch will act as a credit sleeve for Reliant Energy and guarantee both the wholesale and retail components of the transaction. Ultimately the City has the ability to bring in up to 80 megawatts or half its load from the wholesale market.

The tutors are certified teachers, university professors, graduate school students, students at accredited four-year colleges and professionals who are experts in their fields. All of the Live Homework Help tutors have received a 7-year criminal background check and reference check from General Information Services (GIS), a third-party background check company (students' credentials are confirmed by their university) and have been certified through the Tutor.com Training Program.					
The Library has used this service for three years, paid for with private funds and other funding sources. Due to the limitations of those funds, our agreements had restrictions, such as 20 minute limits on the length of a single tutoring session. The success of the service has led us to include this in our operating budget, so that we can fund the service fully and on a regular basis.

Many new plans and procedures have been developed to improve evacuation during a hurricane threat to the region since the Hurricane Rita evacuation occurred. There is a need to inform the public on the procedures and resources that are now available to aid in evacuation from the Houston region.

The Houston-Galveston Area Council has identified \$224,275.00 of federal funding to create a media public outreach campaign that will inform the public about the plans that have been set in place for evacuating the region and the actions they should take as a hurricane approaches the south Texas coast.

This federal funding requires a local match of \$44,855.00. This media information campaign will include the following:

- A marketing consultant will be procured by H-GAC to develop the Hurricane Evacuation Outreach Effort (HEOE), a communications plan that can be utilized by local governments to disseminate information to special needs groups including the elderly, disabled, and non-English speaking persons, along with the public at large.
- The consultant will develop a marketing tool kit for local governments that will consist of flexibly-designed, customizable pieces which can be utilized by governmental agencies, community leaders, media, and other civic organization as part of the HEOE. Each printed collateral piece in the tool kit will be provided as a PDF master, which can be customized and produced at the discretion of each partner helping to promote the outreach effort. These PDFs will be provided on master CDs and made available for download through a section/page on the H-GAC web site. Broadcast mediums such as radio or TV Public Service Announcements (PSAs) will be provided on CD and DVD. 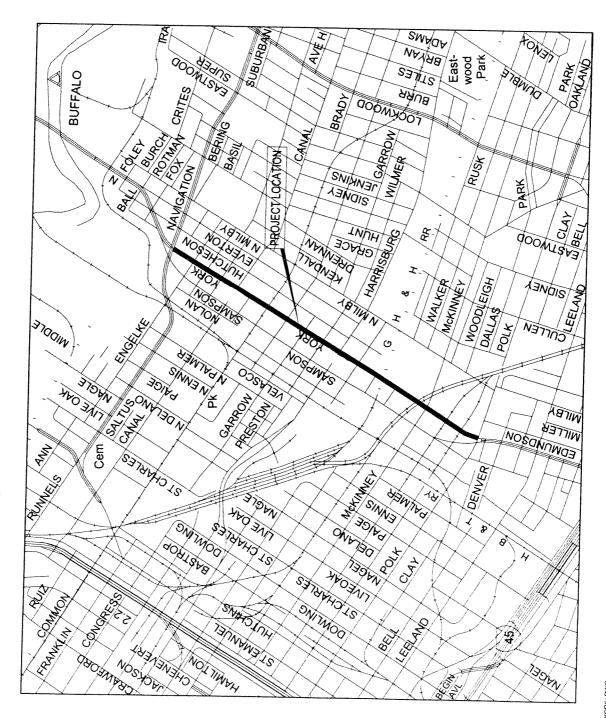

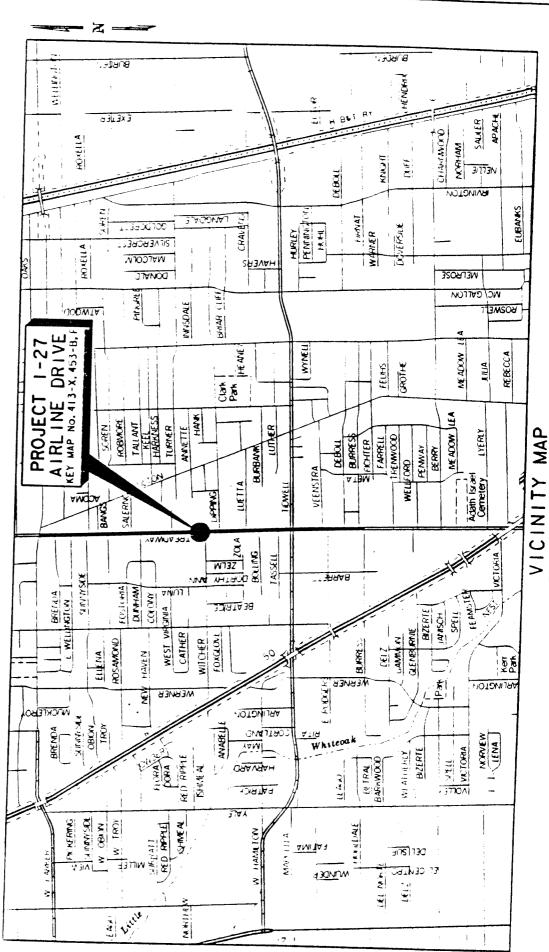


VICINITY MAP

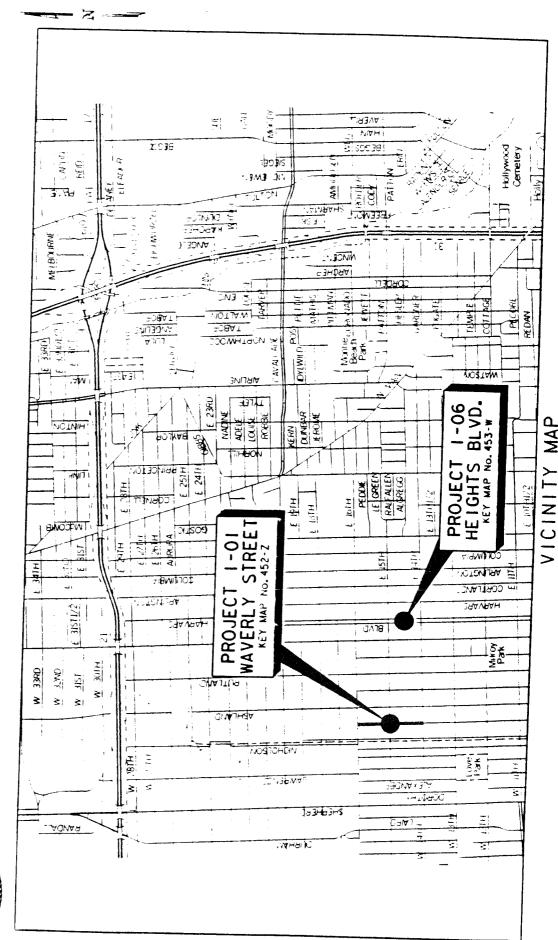

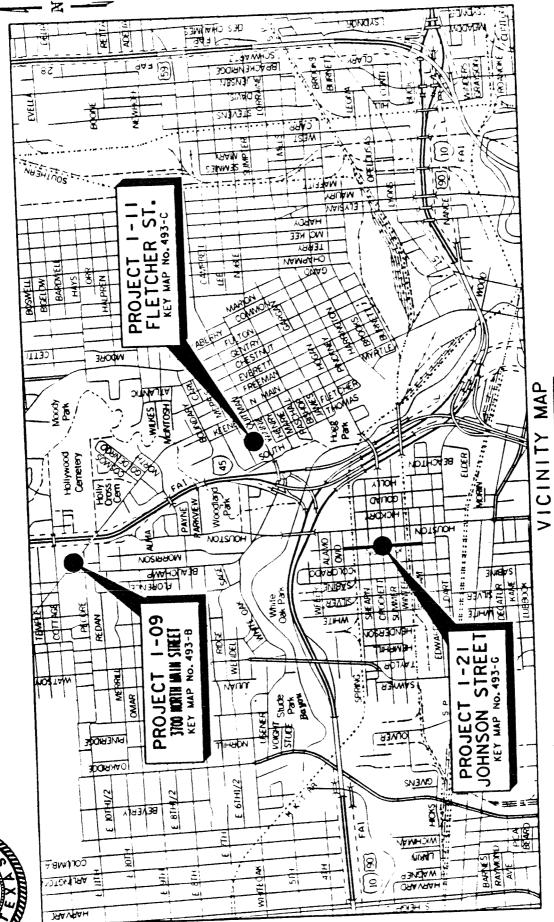

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The City Purchasing Agent recommends that City Council approve an ordinance authorizing the appropriation of \$10,388,670.00 out of the Equipment Acquisition Consolidated Fund (Fund 1800). It is further recommended that City Council amend Council Motion No. 2007-0218, passed February 28, 2007, to purchase 304 additional rear-wheel drive full-size, 4-door sedan, patrol vehicles (Item No. 2) for a total increase of \$7,807,632.00 for the Police Department, and that authorization be given to issue purchase orders to the awarded supplier, Philpott Motors, Ltd., d/b/a Philpott Ford. These vehicles will be used citywide by the Department for patrol activities and to respond to emergency incidents.

The requested appropriation out of the Equipment Acquisition Consolidated Fund is the sum of \$7,448,070.00 for 290 patrol vehicles and \$2,940,600.00 for vehicle consoles, mobile data terminals, police radios, antennas, and sirens that will be purchased in separate procurements, some from existing contracts with sufficient spending authority. The Houston Police Department has also identified Police Special Services Funds in the amount of \$359,562.00 to purchase an additional 14 vehicles for a total of 304. The adopted FY08 Equipment Acquisition Plan included 190 patrol vehicles and ancillary equipment. HPD intends to reimburse the Equipment Acquisition Fund for the cost of 100 of the additional vehicles using grant, asset forfeiture or special revenue funds.

In January 2007, as a result of advertising this bid in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas bid laws, bids were received from three vehicle suppliers. The bid document includes a provision that allows the City to purchase additional patrol vehicles through March 7, 2008, provided the contractor agrees to honor the original bid prices. Philpott Motors, Ltd. has agreed, in writing, to honor its original unit bid price of \$25,683.00 for the 304 patrol vehicles requested in this award.

Deloitte and Touche's findings related to CDBG and HOME were forwarded to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The auditors report resulted in the City of Houston receiving seven findings from HUD in a letter dated July 31, 2006. Three findings remain outstanding only one of which requires monetary corrective action. Finding 2005-6 identified that interdepartmental costs charged to street overlays done by the Right of Way Fleet Maintenance Division of Public Works and Engineering Department (PWED) were based on budgeted expenditures and did not represent actual costs incurred, resulting in questioned costs. The review identified that a 30% overhead charge was applied in addition to the costs. The overhead charge was not sufficiently supported. The corrective action requires the City to reimburse its CDBG Treasury Account for the questioned costs or provide an analysis of the actual costs. PWED conducted an analysis and determined that the overcharges to the CDBG program were \$659,482.85. The results were reviewed and verified. PWED charged \$659,482.85 in overcharges against Fund 1000 and reversed \$659,482.85 in CDBG expenditures against Fund 5000 (City's grant fund) for the City's Consolidated Plan Year 2003 and 2005, respectively. HUD mandates the City reimburse its CDBG Treasury Account. HUD must receive wired funds totaling \$659,482.85 to clear and close Independent Year Ended Audit 2005 finding 2005-6. Once completed HUD will credit the impacted grant years, 2003 and 2005, allowing the City to reprogram and reinvest these monies into CDBG eligible activities.

The department recommends approval to reimburse the account by approving and authorizing the expenditure of \$659,482.85 out of the CDBG Grant Funds to fulfill the obligation. On June 29, 2007 HCDD presented this item before the Housing and Community Development Committee and it received a favorable recommendation.

The net effect of increasing the contract authority and exercising the renewal option is a positive economic impact to the City along with operational synergies:

- 1. No operational disruptions to the department
- 2. Continuity of existing projects
- 3. Risk management and disaster planning consideration
- 4. A better socio-economic situation when factors such as employee and agency retention are taken into consideration
- 5. Budget neutral as departments must have budget adequacy to utilize contract authority

Recommendation: To ensure services now being provided by temporary employee and information technology staffing agencies continue to meet on-going departmental needs, we are requesting the maximum contract authority for the temporary employee services program be increased by 5,000,000 for the contract period ending October 31, 2007, and \$12,500,000 to fund the first year renewal option for a total of \$17,500,000. This proposal is scheduled for presentation to the Budget and Fiscal Affairs Committee on July 9, 2007.

City engineer shall mean the director of public works and engineering or the director or engineer designated by the director of the building general services department and their designees, as applicable. The term primarily relates to employees of the public works and engineering and building general services departments who are engaged in acquisition, design and construction of public works and related projects.

Excerpt from Sec. 2-52

(22) Be responsible for materials management:

- (6) Provide on-site building maintenance and operations services for buildings assigned to the department for that purpose, including janitorial, cleaning, building systems maintenance, minor repairs, carpentry and construction work and security operation and maintenance;
- (7) Manage and oversee fleet planning and operational standards;
- (8) Manage and oversee the procurement, delivery, and distribution of fuel;
- (9) Manage and oversee the capital improvement plan; and
- (7 10) Render assistance to other city departments upon request for buildings that may not be under the direct management of the department on issues relating to building management.

The foregoing duties and functions shall not extend to aviation department properties, unless so requested by the aviation department.

Sec. 2-437. Transfer of duties.

To the extent that any other reference in this Code or in any other ordinance of the city or any reference in any city contract or other document devolves duties upon the finance and administration department or the public works and engineering department or the directors or employees of those departments that have been reassigned to the building general services department or director thereof under this article, then the reference shall be construed to mean the building general services department or the director and employees thereof, as applicable.

- (3) The department director or purchasing agent determines that the city's design or specifications for the project or bid should be revised and new bids should be taken.

The delegation created in this subsection is nonexclusive, and nothing herein shall be construed to preclude the city council from rejecting any or all bids received for any project or purchase.

Sec. 15-83. Program elements.

- (a) Based upon a review of data submitted annually by affected city departments, the mayor's affirmative action division shall each year submit a progress report to the city council. The report shall include three percentage figures that are intended to as closely as possible represent the ratio of the prior year's measured utilization and capacities of local MBEs and WBEs to do business in:
 - (1) The supply of goods and nonpersonal or nonprofessional services;
 - (2) The performance of personal or professional services; and
 - (3) Construction;

to the prior year's total local business community utilization and capacity to do business in each of the three-named fields of city contracting.

(b) Based upon the measured utilization and capacities identified in subsection (a) above, city council shall from time to time set annual city-wide percentage goals for city contracting with MBEs and WBEs in each of the three named categories described in subsection (a) above. The adjustment, if any, in the percentage goals shall be made during the first quarter of the fiscal year.

- (c) It is the responsibility of each city department to determine which contracts initiated by it are goal-oriented contracts and which are regulated contracts. If the determination is made that a contract is a goal-oriented contract or a regulated contract, the initiating department shall review the contract and shall determine, by reference to the MBE/WBE register, the number of certified MBEs and WBEs which have represented to the city that they are in the business of performing all or some of the required contract services. The initiating department director or his or her designee shall determine whether the contract is one to which MBE/WBE provisions should be applied.
 - (1) These provisions are not required to be applied in the following circumstances:
 - a. A public or administrative emergency exists which requires the goods or services to be provided with unusual immediacy;
 - b. The service or goods requested are of such a specialized, technical or unique nature as to require the city department to be able to select its contractor without application of MBE/WBE provisions (such as contracts for expert witnesses, certain financial advisors or technical consultants); or
 - c. If application of MBE/WBE provisions would impose an unwarranted economic burden or risk on the city or unduly delay acquisition of the goods or services, or would otherwise not be in the best interest of the city; or
 - d. If the possible MBE/WBE participation level based on MBE and WBE availability would produce negligible MBE or WBE participation.

If one of the above-listed conditions is determined to exist, the department director shall certify that determination to the director of the affirmative action division and specify the conditions which lead to the determination. This certification is to be made prior to award of the contract.

- (2) If the contract does not fall within one of the above-listed exceptions, based upon its overall review, the initiating department:
 - a. Shall shall assign an appropriate MBE/WBE participation level, if any, for the contract (whether goal-oriented or regulated) considering the local availability of certified MBEs and WBEs in the contract field.

The intention of this article is to provide administrative flexibility in the application of MBE/WBE provisions and in the percentage participation level on a contract-by-contract

basis so as not to limit access to city contracting by nonminority and nonwomen owned businesses to a greater degree than necessary to meet the city-wide annual goal and the policies and objectives of this article.

(d) The bidding documents and the contract documents for goal-oriented contracts for which an MBE/WBE participation level has been established shall contain a provision detailing the purposes and objectives of the city's MBE/WBE ordinance and shall incorporate by reference this article and the then-current motion establishing MBE and WBE annual goals. Regulated contracts which are determined to have significant subcontracting potential for which an MBE/WBE participation level has been established shall contain contractual provisions (and proposal provisions if submitted for proposals or for bids) requiring the contractor to meet or exceed the determined MBE/WBE participation level for that contract, or to establish that it has made good-faith efforts to do so, and that notwithstanding such efforts, was unable to meet or exceed the determined participation levels. The directors of the finance and administration, building general services and public works and engineering departments will establish procedures defining good-faith efforts. These procedures will be reviewed and approved by the affirmative action division, the mayor and the city attorney.

Sec. 15-101. Definitions.

The hearing official may be a city employee, unless the contractor requests and makes security for the services of a private hearing official as provided in this article. The mayor shall, based upon recommendations from the administrative official and contractor organizations, develop and maintain a list of private hearing officials who will be designated by the director to conduct hearings under this article. Subject to their timely availability, the director shall assign private hearing officials in rotation from the list of persons appointed by the mayor.

Public works contract means any city contract or subcontract for the construction of public works, whether issued under the administrative oversight of the public works and engineering department, the aviation department, or the building general services department. The term includes contracts on competitive bids pursuant to chapter 252 of the Texas Local Government Code, but not contracts for professional services that are exempt from bidding under the Texas Professional Services Procurement Act.

Wrongful conduct means any of the types of conduct or offenses listed in section 15-103(1)--(4) of this Code.

Sec. 32-203. Assistance by certain city departments.

 - The service or goods requested are of such a specialized, technical or unique nature as to require the city department to be able to select its contractor without application of MBE/WBE provisions (such as contracts for expert witnesses, certain financial advisors or technical consultants); or
 - c. If application of MBE/WBE provisions would impose an unwarranted economic burden or risk on the city or unduly delay acquisition of the goods or services, or would otherwise not be in the best interest of the city; or
 - d. If the possible MBE/WBE participation level based on MBE and WBE availability would produce negligible MBE or WBE participation.

If one of the above-listed conditions is determined to exist, the department director shall certify that determination to the director of the affirmative action division and specify the conditions which lead to the determination. This certification is to be made prior to award of the contract.

(2) If the contract does not fall within one of the above-listed exceptions, based upon its overall review, the initiating department shall assign an appropriate MBE/WBE participation level, if any, for the contract (whether goal-

oriented or regulated) considering the local availability of certified MBEs and WBEs in the contract field.

The intention of this article is to provide administrative flexibility in the application of MBE/WBE provisions and in the percentage participation level on a contract-by-contract basis so as not to limit access to city contracting by nonminority and nonwomen owned businesses to a greater degree than necessary to meet the city-wide annual goal and the policies and objectives of this article.

(d) The bidding documents and the contract documents for goaloriented contracts for which an MBE/WBE participation level has been established shall contain a provision detailing the purposes and objectives of the city's MBE/WBE ordinance and shall incorporate by reference this article and the then-current motion establishing MBE and WBE annual goals. Regulated contracts which are determined to have significant subcontracting potential for which an MBE/WBE participation level has been established shall contain contractual provisions (and proposal provisions if submitted for proposals or for bids) requiring the contractor to meet or exceed the determined MBE/WBE participation level for that contract, or to establish that it has made good-faith efforts to do so, and that notwithstanding such efforts, was unable to meet or exceed the determined participation levels. The directors of the finance and administration, general services and public works and engineering departments will establish procedures defining good-faith efforts. These procedures will be reviewed and approved by the affirmative action division, the mayor and the city attorney."

Section 14. That Section 15-101 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 15-101. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, unless the context of their usage clearly indicates another meaning:

Administrative official means the official designated by the director of general services to oversee the administrative process of debarment.

Contractor means any person who contracts with or otherwise provides goods or services to the city for public works contracts, and includes subcontractors who by agreement provide any goods,

materials, or services used in the performance of city public works contracts.

Day means a calendar day.

Debarment means action taken by the city council to exclude a person from acting as a city public works contractor for a specified period.

Hearing official means the person designated by the director of the department of general services to conduct a debarment or reinstatement hearing and to make findings and recommendations to city council. The hearing official must not be a person who participated in the administration of the contract giving rise to the debarment proceeding and shall not be the same person as the administrative official who investigated the referral. The hearing official may be a city employee, unless the contractor requests and makes security for the services of a private hearing official as provided in this article. The mayor shall, recommendations from the administrative official and contractor organizations, develop and maintain a list of private hearing officials who will be designated by the director to conduct hearings under this article. Subject to their timely availability, the director shall assign private hearing officials in rotation from the list of persons appointed by the mayor.

Public works contract means any city contract or subcontract for the construction of public works, whether issued under the administrative oversight of the public works and engineering department, the aviation department, or the general services department. The term includes contracts on competitive bids pursuant to chapter 252 of the Texas Local Government Code, but not contracts for professional services that are exempt from bidding under the Texas Professional Services Procurement Act.

Wrongful conduct means any of the types of conduct or offenses listed in section 15-103(1)--(4) of this Code."

Section 15. That Section 32-203 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 32-203. Assistance by certain city departments.

The directors of the departments of planning and development, finance and administration, public works and engineering, general services and parks and recreation and their staffs shall provide requested assistance to the parks board. The city attorney and his staff shall provide legal services and representation to the parks board."

Section 16. That Subsection (a) of Section 33-211 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) The creation of the Houston archaeological and historical commission is hereby reaffirmed. The HAHC shall consist of 11 members. Each member shall be a person who has knowledge and experience in the archaeological, architectural, cultural, social, economic, ethnic or political history of the city. The mayor shall assign a staff member to serve as a liaison between the HAHC and the mayor's office. The planning official shall serve as executive secretary to the HAHC. The archivist of the Houston public library system and the directors of general services and public works and engineering shall serve as ex officio members of the HAHC, but shall not have a vote. When HAHC business requires the involvement of other departments, representatives of those departments shall attend meetings of the HAHC upon notice by the executive secretary. The HAHC shall elect its own chair and vice-chair."

Section 17. That Subsection (a) of Section 34-62 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) The Adopt-A-Fire Station program is hereby created. The program shall be used to assist the city in its effort to maintain, refurbish, and renovate fire stations. The director of the general services department and the fire chief shall jointly administer the program and shall promulgate rules and procedures for administering the program."

Section 18. That, if any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not

be affected thereby, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting this Ordinance that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness or invalidity of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 19. That there exists a public emergency requiring that this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; however, in the event that the Mayor fails to sign this Ordinance within five days after its passage and adoption, it shall take effect in accordance with Article VI, Section 6, Houston City Charter.

The certification will be accomplished in a four day Train the Trainer Program. In addition the city acquires a royalty-free, nonexclusive and irrevocable license to use, modify, reproduce, and derive all the training materials provided. Mr. Grote will also conduct a policies and procedure review class that will provide updates on the state of practice of this program in other organizations and will provide lessons learned and guidance on developing a policy of Discipline Without Punishment. The contract also provides for future additional services by Mr. Grote as requested by the Human Resources Director to be paid under the hourly rate.

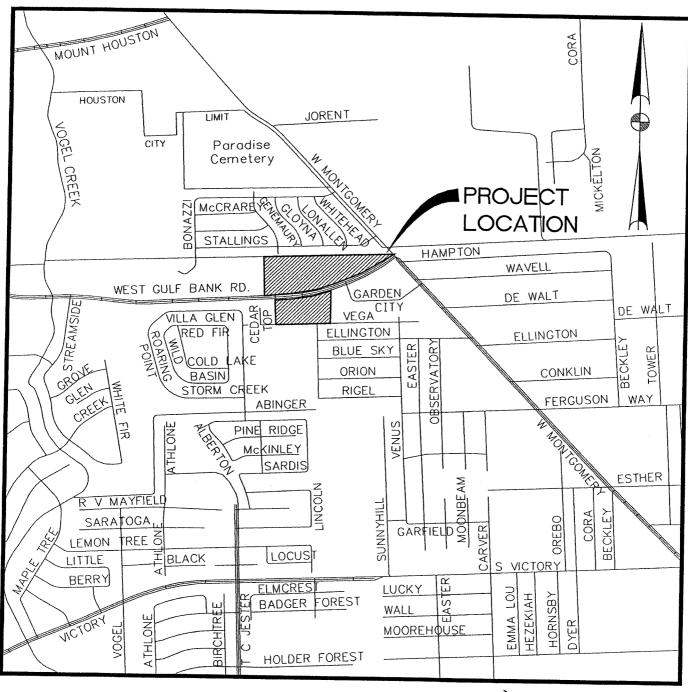
