
SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC) was organized in 1966 by local leaders from Brazoria, Galveston and Harris counties and the cities of Galveston and Houston. H-GAC now covers a 13-county region made up of Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton counties. H-GAC provides opportunities for local elected officials to work together to resolve significant public issues. The City of Houston has nearly 40 appointments held by elected officials and City staff to various committees covering issues such as transportation, criminal justice, homeland security, economic development and the environment.

H-GAC is also an important funding resource for Houston. As a state Metropolitan Planning Organization, H-GAC made a number of important pass-through grants to the City of Houston in 2006-2007, including Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) funding of \$343,956,856 for various construction projects (including freeways and highways); \$1,737,330 for homeland security programs; and \$1,572,414 for Workforce Disaster Recovery Services. The City of Houston also benefits from participating in H-GAC's cooperative purchasing program, saving millions of dollars in the purchase of vehicles, fire trucks, ambulances, radios and construction equipment.

Local government dues, state appropriations, and state and federal grants and contracts finance H-GAC activities to fulfill its mission to: (1) promote efficient and accountable use of local, state, and federal dollars, (2) serve as a problem-solving and information forum for local governments, and (3) help local governments, business, and civic organizations analyze trends and conditions affecting the area. Annual renewal for H-GAC membership in the amount of \$78,145.24 is the same as last year and is calculated using the City of Houston's population from the 2000 Census.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project was part of the Surface Water Transmission Program (SWTP) and it will help the City meet groundwater well withdrawal criteria mandated by the Harris/Galveston Coastal Subsidence District (HGCD) and water quality parameters issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA).

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: The project consisted of rehabilitation of 20 pressure reducing valve (PRV) stations at various locations within the City of Houston's water distribution system. Rehabilitation included new pressure reducing valves and associated piping, equipment, and vault access upgrades. Lockwood, Andrews & Newnam, Inc. designed the project with 360 calendar days allowed for construction. The project was awarded to LEM Construction Co., Inc. with an original Contract Amount of \$1,496,126.00.

LOCATION: The project is located at the following PRV stations: Mykawa at Dixie, Scarsdale at Beamer, Conklin at Old Galveston, Genoa Red Bluff at Allen Genoa, Turtle Creek at Allen Genoa, 4200 Old Galveston, Meridian at Ogden, 2400 Old Galveston, 2400 Broadway, Forest Hill at Satsuma, Wayside at Lawndale, Milby between Polk and Bell, Crawford at Polk, Clinton at McCarty, Mississippi at Clinton, North Carolina at Clinton, Oates at IH-10 East, Currency at 610 N. Loop East, Gellhorn at 610 N. Loop East, Liberty at 610 N. Loop East, Chenevert at Polk. The project is located in the Key Map Grids 455-T, 493-Q, 494-S, 495-C, G, H, P, U, & Y, 534-C, D, & T, 535-F, P, & E. 536-T, 577-N & S and 616-G.

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The Contractor, LEM Construction Co., Inc. has completed the Work under subject Contract. The project was completed within the Contract Time with 90 additional days allowed by Changer Order Nos. 1 and 2. The final cost of the project including, overrun and underrun of estimated bid quantities and previously approved Change Order Nos. 1 through 3 is \$1,282,562.34, a decrease of \$213,563.66 or 14.27% under the original Contract Amount





SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: The Surface Water Transmission Program (SWTP) consists of major improvements to distribution systems to convert from primarily groundwater to surface water in order to comply with the Harris-Galveston Coastal Subsidence District's (HGCSD) regulatory plan. The program includes transmission and distribution of surface water and associated consolidation of groundwater plants in the City.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: This project consisted of construction of 4,784 linear feet of 48-inch water line, 1,383 linear feet of 30-inch water line, and 5,307 linear feet of 12-inch water line with all related appurtenances. Nathelyne A. Kennedy & Associates designed the project with 250 calendar days allowed for construction. The project was awarded to Contractor Technology, Ltd. with an original Contract Amount of \$4,589,253.60

On June 23, 2005, the Contractor's voluntary Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceeding (reorganization) was converted to Chapter 7 (liquidation). 

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act and the provisions of the Investment Policy of the City of Houston, Texas (the "City"), the City Council of the City is required to review the Investment Policy annually; and

WHEREAS, in connection with such review the City Council must approve any amendments to such Investment Policy; and

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of the City's Investment Committee, the City Council desires to adopt certain amendments to the City's Investment Policy; and

WHEREAS, the written Investment Policy, as revised, will further protect City assets by identifying investment objectives, addressing the issues of investment risks versus rewards, and providing the framework for the establishment of controls, limitations and responsibilities of City employees in the performance of their fiduciary responsibilities;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Note: This Investment Policy was approved by City Council by resolution on January 16, 2008. Revisions are noted by the bolded text in sections 4.0, 9.8, and 17.

1.0 PURPOSE:

It is the policy of the City of Houston, Texas (the City) to invest public funds in a manner which will provide the highest investment return with the maximum security while meeting the daily cash flow demands of the City and conforming to all state and local statutes governing the investment of public funds. This policy sets forth the investment program of the City and the guidelines to be followed in achieving its objectives.

2.0 SCOPE:

This policy is applicable to all investment activities and all funds of the City except employee pension funds, trustee funds, or escrow funds - any of which is set up and administered separately and whose investment activities are conducted by third parties in accordance with instructions provided in ordinances, contracts, or escrow agreements.

2.1 Funds covered by this policy:

- 2.1.1 **General Fund** - used to account for all financial resources relating to general government operation except those required to be accounted for in other funds. The General Fund is the City's operating fund.
- 2.1.2 **Special Revenue Funds** - used to account for the proceeds of specific revenue sources which are restricted to expenditures for specific purposes.
- 2.1.3 **General Debt Service Funds** - used to account for the payment of interest and principal on all general long-term debt other than debt issued for and serviced by Enterprise Funds.
- 2.1.4 **Capital Project Funds** - used to account for all resources used for the acquisition and/or construction of capital facilities by the City, except those financed by Enterprise Funds.
- 2.1.5 **Enterprise Funds** - used to account for the acquisition, operation and maintenance of governmental facilities and services that are entirely or predominantly self-supporting through user charges.
- 2.1.6 **Trust and Agency Funds** - used to account for assets held in a trustee capacity or as an agent for individuals, private organizations, other governmental units, and/or other funds.
- 2.1.7 Other funds maintained by the City, unless specifically exempted.

Exhibit A

3.0 OBJECTIVE:

Investment of the funds covered by this policy shall be governed by the following investment objectives, in order of priority:

- 3.1 **Safety:** Safety of principal is the primary objective of the investment program. Investment of the City's funds shall be undertaken in a manner that seeks to ensure the preservation of capital for the overall portfolio. To attain this objective, **diversification** is required in order that exposure to individual sectors of the market will not have an undue impact on the entire portfolio (see Section 17.0 "Diversification and Maximum Maturities").
- 3.2 **Liquidity:** The City's investment portfolio will remain sufficiently liquid to enable the City to meet all operating requirements that might be reasonably anticipated.
- 3.3 **Return on Investments:** The City's investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of attaining the best feasible rate of return, throughout budgetary and economic cycles, commensurate with the City's investment risk constraints and the cash flow characteristics of the portfolio. Return on investment, although important, is subordinate to the safety and liquidity objectives described above.
- 3.4 **Legal Requirements:** The investment yield on certain funds may be restricted from time to time due to state or federal laws regarding arbitrage earnings. The City's investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of meeting all legal requirements including yield restrictions.

4.0 INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

The City Controller is charged by the City Charter with the supervision of the fiscal affairs of the City of Houston, which includes the investment of the City's funds. To assist the City Controller in this function, an Investment Committee has been established. The Committee is chaired by the City Controller with members including the Deputy Controller – Treasury Division, the Investment Manager, up to two other persons appointed by the Controller, up to three persons appointed by the Mayor, and up to three non-City employees recommended by the Investment Committee and appointed by the City Controller. The Committee will be supported, as needed, by the staff of the Internal Audit Division, Finance Division, and the Legal Department. The Committee meets quarterly, upon written notice, or as called for by the City Controller.

The major responsibilities of the Committee are to:

- 1) Monitor investment results and compliance with this policy
- 2) Recommend and monitor investment and accounting controls and procedures in accordance with this policy.
- 3) Recommend investment strategies. The Committee may, in its consideration of investment strategies, impose maturity, diversification or liquidity limits, or other investment guidelines, in addition to those required by this policy. *In setting investment strategy the Committee may impose guidelines that are stricter than is required by this policy, but in no case shall recommend investments or guidelines not allowed by this policy.*
- 4) Review and approve revisions to this policy.
- 5) Review, revise, and adopt, at least annually a list of qualified broker/dealers that are authorized to engage in investment transactions with the City.

5.0 DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

Authority to manage the City's investment program is derived from State statutes and applicable City ordinances and resolutions. Day to day management responsibility for the investment program is delegated by the City Controller, as the City's investment officer, to one or more investment managers, who shall establish written procedures for the operation of the investment program consistent with this investment policy. Procedures should include reference to:

- a) Safekeeping of investments
- b) Collateral/Depository agreements
- c) Wire Transfer agreements
- d) Master Repurchase agreements
- e) Securities Lending agreement

Such procedures shall include explicit delegation of authority to persons responsible for investment transactions. No person may engage in an investment transaction except as provided under the terms of this policy and the procedures established by the Investment Manager. The Investment Manager shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken and shall establish a system of controls to regulate the activities of subordinate officials. The Investment Manager shall possess sufficient working knowledge of investment economics and the technical aspects of securities and markets, as well as the supervisory experience and judgment necessary to carry out the responsibilities outlined in this policy.

6.0 INVESTMENT TRAINING:

The City Controller, as the investment officer, and all employees who have been delegated the authority to engage in investment transactions (investment officials) shall attend at least one training session relating to their responsibilities under this policy within 12 months after taking office or assuming duties; and attend an investment training session not less than once in a two-year period and receive not less than 10 hours of investment instruction from an independent source approved by the Investment Committee. Training must include education in investment controls, security risks, strategy risks, market risks, and compliance with the Public Funds Investment Act.

7.0 ETHICS AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST:

Officers and employees involved in the investment process shall not engage in personal business activity that conflicts with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions. Investment officials and employees who are directly involved with the investment function shall disclose to the City Controller, or the Investment Committee, any financial interests in financial institutions that conduct business within this jurisdiction, and they shall further disclose any personal financial/investment positions that could be related to the performance of the City's portfolio. Employees and officers shall refrain from undertaking personal investment transactions with the same individual with whom business is conducted on behalf of their entity and shall subordinate their personal investment transactions to those of the City's, particularly with regard to the timing of purchases and sales.

Officers and employees involved in the investment process must file a disclosure statement with the Texas Ethics Commission and the City Secretary, acting on behalf of the governing body of the City of Houston, if:

- a) The officer or employee has a personal business relationship with a business organization offering to engage in an investment transaction with the City; or
- b) The officer or employee is related within the second degree, by affinity or consanguinity, to an individual seeking to transact investment business with the City.
- c) The officer or employee owns 10 percent or more of the voting stock or shares of the business or owns \$5,000 or more of the fair market value of the business organization;
- d) Funds received by the investment officer from the business organization exceed 10 percent of the officer's or employee gross income for the previous year; or
- e) The officer or employee has acquired from the business organization during the previous year an investment with a book value of \$2,500 or more for the personal account of the officer or employee.

8.0 PRUDENCE:

Investments shall be made with judgment and care--under investment and economic circumstances then prevailing--which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the probable safety of their capital as well as the probable income to be derived.

- 8.1 The standard of prudence to be used by investment officials shall be the "prudent person" standard and shall be applied in the context of managing an overall portfolio under prevailing economic conditions at the moment of investment commitments. Investment officials, acting in accordance with written procedures and the investment policy and exercising due diligence, shall be relieved of personal responsibility for an individual security's credit risk or market price changes, provided deviations from expectations are reported in a timely fashion and appropriate action is taken to control adverse developments.

- 8.2 In determining whether an investment official has exercised prudence with respect to an investment decision, the determination shall be made taking into consideration the investment of all funds over which the official had responsibility rather than a consideration as to the prudence of a single investment and, whether the investment decision was consistent with the written investment policy of the entity.

9.0 AUTHORIZED AND SUITABLE INVESTMENTS:

Investments described below are authorized by the Public Funds Investment Act and considered suitable by the Investment Committee. Section 12 of this Policy describes those investments that are specifically prohibited by the Act. In addition, the purchase of specific investments may at times be restricted or prohibited by the City Controller, as the investment officer, due to current market conditions. Securities that were authorized investments at the time of purchase are not required to be liquidated. Except as provided above, City funds governed by this Policy may be invested in:

- 9.1 Obligations of the United States of America or its agencies and instrumentalities.
- 9.2 Direct obligations of the State of Texas or its agencies and instrumentalities.
- 9.3 Other obligations, the principal and interest of which are unconditionally guaranteed or insured by, or backed by the full faith and credit of, the State of Texas or the United States or their respective agencies and instrumentalities.
- 9.4 Obligations of states, agencies, counties, cities, and other political subdivisions of any state rated as to investment quality by a nationally recognized investment rating firm not less than A or its equivalent.
- 9.5 Fully-collateralized Certificates of Deposit that are issued by a City Council-approved state, national, or savings bank, domiciled in this state, and are:
 - a) Guaranteed or insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or its successor; or
 - b) Secured by obligations that are described by 9.1 above, which have a market value of not less than the principal amount of the certificates, but excluding those securities prohibited by the Public Funds Investment Act and this policy; or
 - c) Secured in any other manner and amount provided by law for deposits of the City.

Certificates of Deposit may be transacted with approved public depositories provided the City has on file a signed Security Agreement that complies with the Public Funds Collateral Act and details:

- a) Eligible collateral;
- b) Collateralization ratios for the various types of eligible collateral;
- c) Standards for collateral custody and control;
- d) Collateral valuation; and
- e) Conditions for agreement termination.

9.6 Fully collateralized repurchase agreements having a defined termination date, placed through a primary government securities dealer, as defined by the Federal Reserve, or a financial institution doing business in this state, and secured by obligations described by 9.1 above, pledged to the City, held in the City's name, and deposited at the time the investment is made with the entity or with a third party selected and approved by the City, and having a market value at the time the funds are disbursed of no less than the principal amount of the funds disbursed. Repurchase Agreements may be transacted with primary dealers and financial institutions provided the City has on file a signed Master Repurchase Agreement which details:

- a) Acceptable types of collateral;
- b) Standards for collateral custody and control;
- c) Collateral valuation and initial margin, accrued interest, marking to market, and margin calls;
- d) Method for transmitting security income;
- e) Condition for agreement termination;
- f) Acceptable methods for delivery of securities and collateral.

9.6.1 Reverse repurchase agreements are authorized investments if the term of the agreement does not exceed 90 days; and the maturity of the investment acquired with the proceeds of the reverse repurchase agreement does not exceed the expiration date of the reverse repurchase agreement. Reverse repurchase agreements may be transacted with primary dealers and financial institutions provided the City has on file a signed Master Repurchase Agreement.

9.7 Prime Domestic Bankers' Acceptances with stated maturities of 270 days or less from the date of issuance that will be, in accordance with stated terms, liquidated in full at maturity, that are eligible for collateral for borrowing from a Federal Reserve Bank, and that are accepted by a bank organized and existing under the laws of the United States or any state, if the short-term obligations of the bank, or of a bank holding company of which the bank is the largest subsidiary, are rated not less than A-1 or P-1, or an equivalent rating by at least one nationally recognized credit rating agency.

- 9.8 Commercial Paper with a stated maturity of 270 days or less from the date of its issuance that is rated not less than A-1 or P-1 or an equivalent rating by at least:
- a) Two nationally recognized credit rating agencies; or
 - b) One nationally recognized credit rating agency and is fully secured by an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a bank organized and existing under the laws of the United States or any state.

The maximum exposure to any one issuer is limited to the lesser of 3% of the market value of the investment pool at the time of purchase or 10% of the issuer's commercial paper program, provided, however, that at no time will the City hold more than 1.5% of the market value of the investment pool in Commercial Paper from a single issuer with a maturity date beyond 90 days. Prior to investing any funds, the Investment Manager will evaluate programs. Individual issuers will be monitored as to credit quality and events that may have an effect on the credit quality. Adverse developments will cause the issuer to be excluded from consideration and existing positions to be liquidated as practical.

- 9.9 SEC registered and regulated no-load money market mutual funds with a dollar-weighted average stated maturity of 90 days or less, whose investment objectives include the maintenance of a stable net asset value of \$1 for each share, and provides the City with a prospectus and other information required by the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (15 U.S.C. Section 78a et seq.) or the Investment Company Act of 1940 (15 U.S.C. Section 80a-1 et seq.) The City may not invest more than 80% of its monthly average fund balance, excluding bond proceeds, reserves and other funds held for debt service, in money market mutual funds and the City's investment in any one money market mutual fund shall not exceed 10% of the total assets of the money market mutual fund. The City has a sweep relationship with the main depository bank that sweeps the overnight funds into a money market mutual fund. This relationship is subject to the same limits as any other mutual fund relationship, as previously stated.
- 9.10 SEC registered and regulated bonds issued as the direct obligations of the State of Israel.
- 9.11 Collateralized mortgage obligations directly issued by a federal agency or instrumentality of the United States, the underlying security for which is guaranteed by an agency or instrumentality of the United States, subject to the provisions of Section 12.0.

- 9.12 Investment Pools that function as a money market mutual fund. To be eligible to receive and invest funds on behalf of the City of Houston, the investment pool functioning as a money market mutual fund must mark its portfolio to market daily, to the extent reasonably possible stabilize at a \$1 net asset value, have an advisory board, must be continuously rated no lower than AAA or AAA-m or at an equivalent rating by at least one nationally recognized rating service, and have a weighted average maturity of no longer than 90 days. The City may not invest more than 80% of its monthly average fund balance, excluding bond proceeds, reserves and other funds held for debt service, in investment pools that function as money market mutual funds, and the City's investment in any one investment pool that functions as a money market fund shall not exceed 10% of total assets of that investment pool.

10.0 SECURITIES LENDING:

The City may enter into a securities lending program with an authorized broker/dealer or financial institution in order to enhance investment return. The City may administer a securities lending program directly or, if conditions warrant, use an outside agent. Should an agent be used, one will be recommended by the Investment Committee using appropriate criteria. Securities lending will only be transacted with a written agreement, approved by the City Attorney, which details:

- a) Acceptable types of collateral;
- b) Standards for collateral custody and control;
- c) Collateral valuation and initial margin, accrued interest, marking to market, and margin calls;
- d) Method for transmitting security income; and
- e) Acceptable methods for delivery of securities and collateral.

11.0 SECURITIES SWAPS:

The City may take advantage of security swap opportunities to improve portfolio yield. A swap that improves portfolio yield may be selected, even if the transaction results in a current accounting loss, as long as the break-even date occurs within the horizon of the swap.

12.0 PROHIBITED INVESTMENTS:

Under the Public Funds Investment Act, the following are not authorized investments, regardless of any other law to the contrary:

- 12.1 Obligations whose payment represents the coupon payments on the outstanding principal balance of the underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and pay no principal. (Commonly referred to as IOs)
- 12.2 Obligations whose payment represents the principal stream of cash flow from the underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and bears no interest. (Commonly referred to as POs)
- 12.3 Collateralized mortgage obligations that have a stated final maturity date of greater than 10 years.
- 12.4 Collateralized mortgage obligations, the interest rate of which is determined by an index that adjusts opposite to the changes in a market index.

13.0 EFFECT OF LOSS OF REQUIRED RATING:

An investment that requires a minimum rating under this subchapter does not qualify as an authorized investment during the period the investment does not have the minimum rating. The City shall take all prudent measures that are consistent with this investment policy to liquidate an investment that does not have the minimum rating.

14.0 COLLATERALIZATION:

All deposits of City funds, repurchase agreements and securities lending agreements, including any accrued interest will be fully collateralized by securities permitted under this policy. Collateral securities shall have a market value of not less than 102% of the amount of the deposits, secured thereby, adjusted by the insurance coverage provided those deposits by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Collateral will always be held by an independent third party with whom the City has a current custodial agreement. A clearly marked evidence of ownership (safekeeping or trust receipt) must be supplied to the City and retained. Determination of market value on collateral shall be made on a weekly basis. All collateral relationships will comply with the terms of the Public Funds Collateral Act.

15.0 SAFEKEEPING AND CUSTODY:

All security transactions, including collateral for repurchase and securities lending agreements but with the exception of money market transactions, entered into by the City shall be conducted on a **delivery-versus-payment (DVP) basis**. Securities will be held by a third party custodian, designated by the Controller, and held in the City's name as evidenced by safekeeping or trust receipts of the bank with which the securities are deposited. The custodian will provide listings of the securities that are held in the name of the City on a periodic basis.

16.0 INVESTMENT STRATEGY:

The City's investment program uses a "pooled" investment strategy where all monies of all funds covered by this policy are combined and invested in a portfolio that is stratified by various levels of maturities to meet the requirements of all working capital, construction and debt service funds. In some cases, one or more separate pools of funds may be established to meet specific requirements or yield restrictions for certain funds. By combining the net cash flows of all funds, the pooled investment strategy maximizes return on investment without sacrificing safety and liquidity because economies of scale can be taken advantage of to obtain better prices and reduce transaction and administrative costs.

- 16.1 **General Pool Strategy:** The General Pool consists of those working capital, construction and debt service funds which are not subject to yield restriction under IRS arbitrage regulations. The City combines a variation on the traditional **laddered maturity strategy** that matches assets and liabilities, with more active management strategies, such as yield curve analysis, to achieve the best feasible rate of return while fulfilling the investment objectives of this policy.

The core of the General Pool strategy is a ladder in which investment maturities are matched to monthly cash requirements for the next 12-18 months. When investments mature, the proceeds are used to pay bills or re-invested. New cash from bond proceeds, taxes, or other revenues can be invested at the long end of the ladder to take advantage of higher yields or to fill other cash requirements. The ladder may be extended for longer-term funds to take advantage of matching long-term assets against long-term liabilities. At times, some investments might be placed shorter or longer, based on the interest rate outlook.

In order to ensure the ability of the City to meet obligations and to minimize potential liquidation losses, the dollar-weighted average stated maturity of the General Pool shall not exceed 2.5 years.

All investments in this pool must comply with the objectives and restrictions set forth in this policy.

16.2 **Tax-Exempt Pool Strategy:** The Tax-Exempt Pool consists of those funds which are subject to yield restriction and arbitrage regulation under the 1986 Tax Reform Act. This pool was created to:

- a) Demonstrate compliance with IRS regulations regarding arbitrage;
- b) Maximize the amount of interest earned and retained by the City from the investment of funds subject to the regulations;
- c) Minimize the amount of the rebate liability; and
- d) Minimize the cost of administering the arbitrage tracking program.

Due to the nature of municipal bonds (more risk, less liquidity), the strategy for the Tax-Exempt Pool is, generally, to purchase at least AA rated, insured or pre-refunded municipals with short maturities (generally less than 1 year) if the yield is reasonably higher than that of tax-exempt money market mutual funds. Otherwise, funds in this pool will be invested in one or more tax-exempt money market mutual funds that meet the requirements of IRS arbitrage regulations and the liquidity needs of this pool.

In order to ensure the ability of the City to meet obligations and to minimize potential liquidation losses, the average dollar-weighted stated maturity of the Tax-Exempt Pool shall not exceed 1 year.

All investments in this pool must comply with the objectives and restrictions set forth in this policy.

16.3 **Housing Department Pool Strategy:** This pool was created to comply with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) which requires separate custodial accounts for funds received under federal HUD programs. The strategy for this portfolio is to purchase U. S. Treasury Bills with maturities less than 6 months; targeted to meet the cash needs of the City of Houston Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD)'s HUD program cash outflows. A deposit account with an approved depository institution (see section 20.2) will contain all funds pending disbursement as well as a minimal reserve, generally under \$20,000. All securities are available for sale to meet liquidity needs.

All investments in this pool must comply with the objectives and restrictions set forth in this policy.

16.4 **All Other Special Purpose Pools:** As deemed appropriate, the City Controller has created pools for special purposes, including capital projects, special revenue funds and debt service reserves. Each special purpose is limited in duration and has estimatable cash outflows, although the outflows may change over time, especially in the case of capital projects. In all cases, the City uses a traditional **laddered maturity strategy** that matches assets with projected cash outflows. The City may, on occasion, utilize more active management strategies, such as yield curve analysis, to achieve better rates of return while fulfilling the investment objectives of this policy and the purposes for which the pools were created.

The core of the strategy for each special purpose pool is a maturity ladder in which investment maturities are matched to periodic cash requirements for the expected life of the pool. As investments mature, the proceeds are disbursed according to the needs of the project or re-invested. New monies added to the pool will be invested to fill new cash requirements. At times, some investments might be placed shorter or longer, based on the interest rate outlook. As cash flow projections are revised, the portfolio ladder may be adjusted to reflect these changes, either through maturities or sales of securities.

The weighted average stated maturity of each special purpose pool shall not exceed the weighted average cash outflows for the project. This will be considered to have been accomplished by laddering the cash flows to the planned outflows.

All investments in this pool must comply with the objectives and restrictions set forth in this policy.

17.0 DIVERSIFICATION AND MAXIMUM MATURITIES:

In consultation with the Investment Committee, the City Controller will set explicit asset mix and diversification constraints within which the Investment Manager is to manage the City's portfolios. The asset mix is stated in terms of a maximum or minimum commitment to each asset category rather than ranges or targets so as to allow the Investment Manager flexibility in implementing investment decisions within the framework of this policy. The Investment Manager may set the commitments anywhere from zero (or the minimum), to the maximum level, based upon the Manager's outlook for the market. All securities must conform to the rules on Authorized and Suitable Investments in Section 9.0 of this policy.

Notwithstanding the limits in this section, for investment pools initially created for funds with limited investment horizons, especially construction projects and other capital project funds, the maximum commitments to each asset category will not apply when the pool has declined to 10% of the original funds deposited to the pool. At that time, the pool is permitted to invest up to a maximum of 100% of the remaining proceeds in money market mutual funds, US Treasuries, or US Agencies and Instrumentalities; and up to a maximum of 50% of the remaining proceeds in commercial paper with a stated maturity of one month or less, or any combination thereof. All other restrictions within this policy are still applicable, including, but not limited to, maturity, credit ratings, and any other specific concentration limitations as discussed in Section 9.

(a) Investments with maturities greater than the maximum maturity must be specifically approved by the City Controller or the Investment Committee.

(b) The maximum exposure to any one CP issuer is limited to the lesser of 3% of a pool's market value or 10% of the issuer's commercial paper program, of which 1.5% of a pool's market value can have a maturity beyond 90 days.

(c) The maximum exposure to any one Agency issuer is 35% of the investment pool.

(d) The maximum maturity of CMOs is limited to 10 years under this policy. CMOs are further limited to 5% of the total investment portfolio.

18.0 SALE OF SECURITIES:

Securities shall not be sold prior to maturity except under the following circumstances:

- a) A decline in the credit quality of the issuer;
- b) A security swap designed to improve the quality, yield, or target duration in the portfolio under the conditions of section 11.0 of this policy; or
- c) Liquidity needs require that a security be sold; or
- d) Diversification limits in section 17.0 of this policy require the reduced concentration in a particular sector.

19.0 COMPETITIVE BIDDING:

It is the policy of the City to require competitive bidding for all individual security purchases and sales except for those transactions with money market mutual funds (which are deemed to be made at prevailing market rates), government securities purchased at issue through an approved broker/dealer or financial institution, or commercial paper and banker's acceptances purchased either directly from the issuer or on the secondary market (verification of competitive market levels must be documented). At least three broker/dealers must be contacted in all other transactions involving individual securities. Competitive bidding for security swaps is required.

20.0 AUTHORIZED BROKER/DEALERS AND FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS:

- 20.1 Broker/Dealers - The City Controller will maintain a list of approved broker/dealers and financial institutions that have been approved by the Investment Committee and are authorized to provide investment services in the State of Texas. Investments shall only be made with those firms who qualify under **Securities & Exchange Commission Rule 15C3-1 (uniform net capital rule)** and who have:
 - a) Provided audited financial statements;
 - b) Completed the City's Broker/Dealer Questionnaire;
 - c) Acknowledged, in writing, that the policy has been thoroughly reviewed by qualified representatives dealing directly with the City's account and that the organization has implemented reasonable procedures and controls in an effort to preclude investment transactions conducted between the City and the organization that are not authorized by the City's Investment Policy, except to the extent that this authorization depends on an analysis of the makeup of the City's entire portfolio or requires an interpretation of subjective investment standards; and
 - d) Met the qualifications and standards recommended and approved by the Investment Committee.

An annual review of the financial condition and registrations of authorized broker/dealers and financial institutions providing investment services will be conducted by the City Controller. In addition, the quantity of transactions conducted with each approved broker/dealer will be reviewed at least semi-annually for the prior six-month period. Broker/dealers that have less than three transactions shall be sent a letter informing them of their status, and be given thirty days to respond in writing. The results of this review and the related recommendations shall be submitted to the Investment Committee. The Investment Committee shall, at least annually, review, revise, and adopt a list of qualified brokers that are authorized to engage in investment transactions with the entity.

20.2 Depositories - The City Controller will maintain a list of **qualified public depositories** that are authorized to hold City funds. Deposits will only be placed with those institutions that have:

- a) Provided audited financial statements;
- b) Completed the City's Authorized Depository application;
- c) Been designated by City Council as an authorized depository;
- d) Signed the City's Security Agreement; and
- e) Provided collateral as set forth in Sections 9.5 and 14.0 of this policy.

An annual review of the financial condition of each depository holding City funds will be conducted by the City Controller.

A current audited financial statement is required to be on file for each broker/dealer and financial institution that transacts any investment activities with the City.

21.0 INTERNAL CONTROL:

In conjunction with its annual financial audit, the City shall cause to be performed a compliance audit of management controls on investments, adherence to the City's established investment policies and the quarterly reports prepared by the investment manager. The results of the review shall be reported to the Investment Committee.

22.0 REPORTING:

- 22.1 Investment performance is continually monitored and evaluated by the Investment Manager. As requested by the City Controller, but not less than quarterly, the Investment Manager will prepare and submit to the Investment Committee, investment reports which demonstrate conformance to the requirements and objectives of this policy.

In addition, the Investment Manager will prepare and submit to the Mayor and City Council, not less than quarterly, a written report of investment transactions for all funds covered by this policy for the preceding reporting period. The report must:

- a) Describe in detail the investment position of the City on the date of the report;
- b) Be prepared jointly by all investment officers of the entity;
- c) Be signed by each investment officer of the entity;
- d) Contain a summary statement, prepared in compliance with generally accepted accounting principles, of each **pool fund group** that states the beginning market value during the period, additions and changes to the market value during the period, ending market value for the period, and fully accrued interest for the reporting period;
- e) State the book value and market value of each **separately invested asset** at the beginning and end of the reporting period by the type of asset and fund type invested;
- f) State the maturity date of each separately invested asset that has a maturity date;
- g) State the account or fund or pooled group fund for which each individual investment was acquired; and
- h) State the compliance of the investment portfolio as it relates to the Public Funds Investment Act of the State of Texas and the investment strategy expressed in this policy.

- 22.2 The City will utilize the following 3 tier approach for valuing securities:

- a) **Interactive Data Corporation (IDC)** will be the primary source for valuing securities. IDC receives input from multiple dealers when generating a valuation.
- b) As a backup for securities that are not priced using IDC, **Bloomberg, L.P.** will provide a secondary source for values.
- c) Investment Committee approved **primary government security dealers** will offer a final backup for those securities not valued by the previous two sources.

23.0 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS:

Subject to the investment objectives set forth in section 3.0 of this policy, the investment portfolios shall be designed with the objective of attaining the best feasible rate of return, throughout budgetary and economic cycles, commensurate with the investment risk constraints and the cash flow needs of the portfolio. The overriding objectives of portfolio management are to preserve the capital invested and to meet the liquidity and debt service needs of the City. These objectives supercede the importance of achieving any performance Benchmarks set by this policy.

- 23.1 **Market Yield (Benchmark):** The City's selection of portfolio management is active as opposed to passive. Active management uses investment strategies designed to increase portfolio value by exceeding average rates of return normally achieved using passive management. The basis used by the City Controller to determine whether market returns are being achieved shall be a benchmark recommended by the Investment Committee. The Investment Committee may revise this benchmark if liquidity and debt service needs alter the desired composition of the portfolio.

24.0 INVESTMENT POLICY ADOPTION:


The City's investment policy shall be adopted by resolution of City Council. The policy shall be reviewed at least annually by the Investment Committee and the City Council, and any modifications made to such policy must be approved by City Council. The City Council shall evidence by resolution that it has conducted such review. Any modifications made to such policy must be approved by City Council and reflected in such resolution.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Mayor announced in a Press Release on December 14, 2007 that Judy Gray Johnson, the Director of Finance & Administration will resign from the city. The Mayor further announced that the Finance and Administration Department would be reorganized into two separate and distinct departments; (1) the Finance Department, and (2) the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department. He has appointed Assistant Director, Michelle Mitchell as Director of the Finance Department and Deputy Director, Alfred Moran as Director of the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department, subject to City Council approval by separate action.

- To further streamline the management of these two key functions, the projected departmental responsibilities will be allocated as follows:
- Functions of the new Finance Department will be Budget, Tax Assessor and Collector, Long-Range Financial Forecasting, Public Finance, Accounting, Internal Control, Deferred Compensation, Econometrics, CIP and EAF Review, Pension Oversight, Grants Management, Economic Development and Tax Increment Reinvestment Zones.
 - Functions of the Administrative and Regulatory Affairs Department will be Regulatory Affairs (Franchise, Taxicab, and Limousine Regulation, Commercial Permitting), Strategic Purchasing, Central Payroll, Business Services, Intra-Governmental Policy Analysis, City Council Administration, Strategic Alliance Management and Records Management.
 - Jointly, the departments will be responsible for Setting Priorities and Management of the new Intra-Government Policy division to develop policies and procedures. The Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department will manage the day-to-day activity.

The ordinance allocates the full fiscal year FY2008 budget and personnel of the former Finance and Administration Department between the two new departments and approves the transfer of 19 Enterprise Resource Planning staff and the associated budget of \$1.8 million from the Finance and Administration Department to the Information Technology Department. The function of ERP is more appropriately managed by the Information Technology Department.

The ordinance also approves a budget transfer of \$413,254 from the Contingency/Reserve Account in General Government to the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department to address the increased budget and responsibilities of the new department.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, HOUSTON, TEXAS, RELATING TO A REORGANIZATION OF THE FUNCTIONS OF THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT; CREATING A NEW DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND A NEW DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS, ABOLISHING THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION; AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF BUDGETARY AUTHORITY AMONG CERTAIN DEPARTMENTS AND FUNDS; REDISTRIBUTING AUTHORIZED POSITIONS AMONG CERTAIN DEPARTMENTS AND FUNDS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE FOREGOING SUBJECT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article III of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"ARTICLE III. DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE ~~AND ADMINISTRATION~~

Sec. 2-~~4951~~. Created.

There is hereby created a department to be designated the department of finance ~~and administration~~.

Sec. 2-~~5052~~. Director--Position created; appointment.

There is hereby created the position of director of the department of finance ~~and administration~~, who shall be appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the city council. Except as provided or limited by the City Charter, the director of the department of finance shall mean the director or his designee.

Sec. 2-~~5153~~. Same--Powers and duties.

The director of the department of finance ~~and administration~~ shall perform all duties and have all the responsibilities required and imposed by the laws of the United States and the state, the City Charter and ordinances of the city, and such other functions, duties and powers as may be assigned

by the mayor. In addition to the foregoing duties, functions, powers and responsibilities, the director of the department of finance and administration, subject to the direction and supervision of the mayor, shall:

- ~~(1)~~ ~~Be known as the chief administrative officer of the city and shall, as directed by the mayor, coordinate the activities of and exercise administrative oversight over the departments of the city, except the 'mayor and councilmember's office' created by article 1 of this chapter, the office of the city controller, and the legal department.~~
- ~~(2)~~ (1) Be executive head of the department of finance and administration, and as such, shall have control, supervision and authority over all officers and employees therein.
- ~~(3)~~ (2) Be designated as the tax assessor and collector of the city and have all of the powers and duties provided by law for such office or designate in writing a qualified individual who will perform the duties of the tax assessor and collector of the city with the same legal authority as the director of finance and administration as provided in section 2-5557 of this Code.
- ~~(4)~~ (3) Exercise and perform or cause to be exercised or performed all duties and functions assigned to the department of finance and administration.
- ~~(5)~~ (4) Be designated as and perform the duties of the city treasurer and all functions usually and customarily appertaining to such office, including all statutory duties and functions, or designate in writing an individual who will perform the duties of the city treasurer with the same legal authority as the director of finance and administration as provided in section 2-5557 of this Code.
- ~~(6)~~ (5) Be the chief custodian of all city personal property, ~~both real and personal~~, except property that is assigned by law or by directive of the mayor to the custody of another city officer or department. Following the conclusion of each city fiscal year, the director shall provide the mayor with a full annual inventory of all property within his custody.
- ~~(7)~~ (6) Recommend such legislation as may be necessary to more efficiently operate and maintain the department of finance and administration.

Sec. 2-5254. Duties of department.

The department of finance ~~and administration~~ and such employees of the department as are assigned to it shall be charged with the following duties:

- (1) ~~Prepare~~ Preparation of the mayor's annual operating budget as prescribed by the City Charter and ordinances of the city and all related operational plans.

- (9) (8) Supervision, be responsibility for, and performance of all of the applicable duties prescribed and specified by law pertaining to the rendition, assessment and collection of moneys and the giving of a receipt therefor in the collection of ad valorem taxes by the city.

An item that has a market value of \$25.00, or less, may be donated or destroyed only if, in the reasonable opinion of the director the cost of maintaining the item in inventory and the probable cost of attempting to sell the item exceed the market value of the item.~~

The notice may include any of the following: Internet; public posting; municipal channel advertisement; or any other reasonable public notice as determined by the director.~~

Sec. 2-5355. Designation of temporary director.

The director of finance and administration shall designate, with the approval of the mayor, an employee who, during the temporary absence or incapacity of the director, shall have and perform all of the powers and duties of the director of finance and administration. Such appointee will serve in such capacity at the pleasure of the mayor and shall receive no additional compensation by reason of such appointment.

Sec. 2-5456. Authority of director to function in other capacities.

Whenever any provision of this Code or any other city ordinance provides for the taking of any action or the performance of any function by any of the city treasurer, the director of the treasury, the department of treasury, the tax assessor and collector, or the director of the tax department, ~~the director of the public service department, the public service director, the director of the purchasing department, the purchasing agent, the director of general services, or the chief energy conservation officer~~, then the director of the department of finance ~~and administration~~ shall be authorized to take such action or perform such function, or to cause the same to be taken or performed. Provided, however, if the director of the department of finance ~~and administration~~ has elected to designate another person as the city treasurer or tax assessor and collector of the city as authorized in section 2-5557 of this Code, then the person so designated shall perform any duty devolving upon that office.

Sec. 2-5557. Designation of city treasurer or tax assessor and collector of the city.

The director of finance ~~and administration~~ is hereby authorized to delegate the performance of the duties of city treasurer or tax assessor and collector of the city to a qualified individual by filing in the office of the city secretary a memorandum designating the person who shall perform each of such functions. In the event that such a delegation is made the person so delegated shall perform all duties devolving by law upon said office. Any designation shall remain in force and effect until a document shall be filed in the office of the city secretary revoking such designation or appointing another person to perform such function.

Secs. 2-5658 -- 2-60. Reserved."

Section 2. That Section 2-114 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2-114. Designation of records management officer.

The director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs ~~finance and administration~~ shall be the city's records management officer and shall be responsible for city-wide files management and the direction and control of the city's records disposition program."

Section 3. That Section 2-202 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2-202. Execution of bills of sale for city property.

In any case where the city council has authorized the sale of improvements, chattels or fixtures appertaining to land owned by the city or has authorized the sale of any personal property owned by the city, the director of public works and engineering, or the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, is hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the city a bill of sale embodying the terms and provisions of the sale as authorized by the city council, and the city secretary is hereby authorized to attest such bills of sale and affix the corporate seal of the city thereto."

Section 4. That Section 2-364 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2-364. Assistance by certain city departments.

The directors of the departments of libraries, planning and development, health and human services, ~~and finance, and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, and their staffs shall provide requested assistance to the READ Commission. The city attorney and his staff shall provide legal services and representation to the READ Commission."

Section 5. That Section 2-435 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2-435. Coordination.

The director shall coordinate the work of the department with the directors of the ~~finance and administration~~ department, public works and engineering department and other departments that have concurrent functions, and the various directors shall develop operating guidelines as necessary to ensure coordination of work and delivery of services."

Section 6. That Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by adding Article XVI to read as follows:

"ARTICLE XVI. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS

DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Sec. 2-501. Created.

There is hereby created a department to be designated the department of administration and regulatory affairs.

Sec. 2-502. Director--Position created; appointment.

There is hereby created the position of director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs, who shall be appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the city council. Except as provided or limited by the City Charter, the director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs shall mean the director or his designee.

Sec. 2-503. Same--Powers and duties.

The director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs shall perform all duties and have all the responsibilities required and imposed by the laws of the United States and the state, the City Charter and ordinances of the city, and such other functions, duties and powers as may be assigned by the mayor. In addition to the foregoing duties, functions, powers and responsibilities, the director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs, subject to the direction and supervision of the mayor, shall:

- (3) Administration of ordinances related to regulatory services, including utilities, vehicles for hire, certain permits for alcohol-related businesses, franchise fees, and other licenses and permits.

Items that have an estimated market value of \$25.00, or less, as determined by the director, may be donated to a nonprofit corporation or governmental entity in accordance with a policy developed by the director and approved by the mayor for use in providing services benefitting the residents of the city, or may be destroyed. Items that are not disposed of or donated in accordance with part a. that have an estimated market value of \$5000.00 or less, each as determined by the director, may be sold by informal bid, auction, negotiated sale or any other lawful method that in the opinion of the director will result in the best return to the city, taking into consideration storage and sale costs. The director shall provide at least one week's notice prior to such disposition. The notice may include any of the following: Internet; public posting; municipal channel advertisement; or any other reasonable public notice as determined by the director.~~

~~c. Items that have an estimated market value of more than \$5000.00, as determined by the director, may be sold only at a publicly advertised auction, provided that if any such item does not sell at auction, then it may be disposed of as provided in part b. above.~~

(15) Supervision, administration, and enforcement of the franchises granted by the city.

Sec. 2-505. Designation of temporary director.

The director of administration and regulatory affairs shall designate, with the approval of the mayor, an employee who, during the temporary absence or incapacity of the director, shall have and perform all of the powers and duties of the director of administration and regulatory affairs. Such appointee will serve in such capacity at the pleasure of the mayor and shall receive no additional compensation by reason of such appointment.

Sec. 2-506. Authority of director to function in other capacities.

Whenever any provision of this Code or any other city ordinance provides for the taking of any action or the performance of any function by any of the city treasurer, the director of the treasury, the tax assessor and collector, the director of the tax department, the director of the public service department, the public service director, the director of the purchasing department, or the purchasing agent, the director of general services, or the chief energy conservation officer, then the director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs finance and administration shall be

authorized to take such action or perform such function, or to cause the same to be taken or performed. ~~Provided, however, if the director of the department of finance and administration has elected to designate another person as the city treasurer or tax assessor and collector of the city as authorized in section 2-55 of this Code, then the person so designated shall perform any duty devolving upon that office.~~

Sec. 2-507. Management of surplus city personal property.

(a) The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except when the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Director means the director of administration and regulatory affairs.

Surplus city personal property, means supplies, materials and equipment, excluding vehicles, that are obsolete or in excess of the city's requirements.

(b) Surplus city personal property may be sold, disposed of or destroyed in accordance with the following procedures:

- (1) Items that have an estimated market value of \$25.00, or less, as determined by the director, may be donated to a nonprofit corporation or governmental entity in accordance with a policy developed by the director and approved by the mayor for use in providing services benefitting the residents of the city, or may be destroyed. Such items may be donated or destroyed only if, in the reasonable opinion of the director the cost of maintaining the item in inventory and the probable cost of attempting to sell the item exceed the market value of the item.
- (2) Items that are not disposed of or donated in accordance with item (1) of this subsection that have an estimated market value of \$5000.00 or less, each as determined by the director, may be sold by informal bid, auction, negotiated sale or any other lawful method that in the opinion of the director will result in the best return to the city, taking into consideration storage and sale costs. The director shall provide at least one week's notice prior to such disposition. The notice may include any of the following: Internet; public posting; municipal channel advertisement; or any other reasonable public notice as determined by the director.

- (3) Items that have an estimated market value of more than \$5000.00, as determined by the director, may be sold only at a publicly advertised auction, provided that if any such item does not sell at auction, then it may be disposed of as provided in item (2) of this subsection.

Secs. 2-508 -- 2-520. Reserved.

DIVISION 2. PURCHASING FUNCTIONS

Sec. 2-521. Method of making purchases.

(a) Except for certain categories of high technology procurement as provided by state law, the department of administration and regulatory affairs shall contract for and purchase all supplies, merchandise, and articles of every description needed for the use of the city, subject to the provisions of all applicable laws regulating such purchases, and subject to the direction of the mayor and city council. In making purchases, such department, its agents, and employees shall use their best efforts to purchase the same at the least cost to the city. So far as practicable, and except as otherwise provided in this Code or by state law, all such supplies, merchandise and articles contracted for and purchased by the department shall be let or made upon competitive bids or proposals. Contracts for supplies for current use shall be limited as prescribed by the City Charter or this Code.

(b) It is hereby declared to be the policy of the city that all purchases and expenditures not exceeding the city council approval requirement limitation amount established pursuant to article II, section 19a of the City Charter may be based on informal bids, except where the department determines that the taking of informal bids would be impracticable (e.g., sole source, emergency, etc.); provided, however, all purchases or expenditures greater than the city council approval requirement limitation amount established pursuant to article II, section 19a of the City Charter shall be authorized by resolution, motion or ordinance of the city council.

(c) As used in this division, the taking of 'formal bids' means procurement which complies with the procedural steps prescribed by applicable state laws regarding the taking of competitive bids or proposals. The taking of 'informal bids' means competitive procurement by means of any other process, otherwise compliant with this Code.

Sec. 2-522. Necessity for appropriation before purchase.

Before granting any requisition for or contracting for or accepting any bid or purchasing any supplies, merchandise, or articles, the director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs of finance and administration shall cause an inquiry to be made as to whether or not there is an appropriation therefor out of which payment for same can be made, and if there is not, then the director shall refuse to grant such requisition or to contract for or accept such bids or purchase such supplies, merchandise, or articles.

Sec. 2-523. Rental of office equipment on a month-to-month basis.

(a) The department of administration and regulatory affairs may rent office equipment on a month-to-month basis without taking formal bids when the monthly rental does not exceed the city council approval requirement limitation amount established pursuant to article II, section 19a of the City Charter pursuant to the following policy and standards:

- (1) Office equipment shall be deemed to include, without limitation, the following:
 - a. Copy machines.
 - b. Typewriters.
 - c. Furniture.
 - d. Personal computers.
 - e. Miscellaneous office equipment.
- (2) Each department shall establish its requirements for items of office equipment which it desires to rent on a month-to-month basis. Such requirements shall be furnished in writing to the department of administration and regulatory affairs. Several machines shall be examined or inspected to determine which one best suits the specific requirements of a department. In addition to a machine's functional features, operational costs shall be taken into consideration.

On the basis of which machine best serves the requirements for which it is to be used, and with costs given a weighted value, a selection shall be made. In making a selection under this provision, the department of administration and regulatory affairs shall determine the capability of the lessor to provide maintenance to the item of office equipment on short notice, and the

availability of trained technicians who are fully familiar with the machine so that servicing and repairs will be made in a good and workmanlike manner.

(b) The department of administration and regulatory affairs may rent office equipment on a month-to-month basis without taking formal bids when the monthly rental does not exceed the city council approval requirement limitation amount established pursuant to article II, section 19a of the City Charter.

(c) Contract charges shall be paid monthly by the city upon receipt of an invoice therefor from the contractor.

(d) Rental and maintenance agreements for items of office equipment are hereby authorized when the obligations therefor are governed by the laws of the state and the obligations of the city do not exceed that of a bailee for hire, and all such lease agreements shall provide that the city shall have the option to terminate such lease agreement upon 30 days' written notice.

(e) If any price increase raises the monthly rental to more than the city council approval requirement limitation amount established pursuant to article II, section 19a of the City Charter, the department of administration and regulatory affairs shall immediately submit the rental to competitive bids or proposals as required by state law."

Section 7. That Subsections (a), (e), and (f) of Section 3-4 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) In accordance with section 109.331 of the T.A.B.C., the city, through approval by city council following a recommendation from the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or on its own motion, may create 300-foot alcohol-free zones surrounding day-care centers or child-care facilities. As used in this section, *applicant* means the owner of a day-care center or child-care facility.

An application for the creation of an alcohol-free zone within 300 feet of a day-care center or child-care facility may be submitted to the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs by the owner of such day-care center or child-care facility. As soon as practicable following receipt of such an application, the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs shall submit his recommendation for approval of the application for an alcohol-free zone to the city council. An application for the creation of an alcohol-free zone shall be recommended for approval by the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs only if the day-care center

or child-care facility is located in a residential area as defined in this subsection. Designations of alcohol-free zones pursuant to this section may be made by city council motion. An alcohol-free zone designation shall continue for as long as the child-care center or day-care facility remains under the same ownership and retains its license, certification or registration from the state.

As used in this section, *alcohol-free zone* means the area within 300 feet of a day-care center or child-care facility.

As used in this section, *residential area* means an area in which 75 percent or more of the tracts within a circular area, as described herein, are residential in character; the radius of such circular area shall be 1,500 feet, and the center of such circular area shall correspond to the midpoint of a line joining the two most distant points on the boundary of the tract on which the dealer's premises are located; multifamily tracts shall be counted as multiple residential tracts based upon the tax records acreage of the multifamily tract according to the following formula: each one-eighth acre of land or fraction thereof shall be equivalent to one residential tract; for purposes of this calculation a residential tract or multifamily tract shall be considered to be in the circular area in its entirety if any portion of it lies within the circular area."

"(e) The director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs may require the sign to be both in English and in a language other than English if it is likely that a substantial number of the residents and property owners in the vicinity of the day-care center or child-care center speak a language other than English as their familiar language."

"(f) In the event that the creation of an alcohol-free zone is initiated by action of city council, the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs shall cause mail notice of such action to be mailed to each owner, as shown on the most recently approved tax rolls of the city, of property within 300 feet of the day-care center or child-care facility."

Section 8. That Item (2) of Subsection (d) of Section 3-4 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(2) The applicant has, for a minimum of thirty days, placed signs (at least 24 inches by 36 inches in size) that provide notification and information specifically stating '300-FOOT ALCOHOL-FREE ZONE PENDING,' identifying the address of the day-care center or child-care facility, and containing the notation: 'For further information, contact the Director of the Department of ~~Finance and Administration~~

and Regulatory Affairs of the City of Houston.' All lettering on the signs must be at least one and one-half inches by two inches in size for each letter on the sign. It shall be the duty of each applicant as to each particular application to erect at least one such sign along each of the property's public road or highway frontages so as to be clearly visible from the public road or highway. If a property does not have a public road or highway frontage, then signs shall be placed upon the property at a point visible from the nearest public right-of-way. Said signs shall be checked daily by the applicant and reposted as required to ensure that they remain posted until the application has been approved or denied; and"

Section 9. That Section 4-7 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 4-7. Vehicle inspections.

The health officer shall cause all emergency ambulances, including those operated by the fire department, to be inspected before being placed in service and thereafter annually, as well as on a spot inspection basis. In the event an emergency ambulance fails to pass inspection, the health officer shall notify the emergency ambulance operator or the chief of the fire department to correct the defects noted in the inspection and, after such notification, the health officer shall cause such ambulance to be reinspected for compliance. If, upon such reinspection, the defects noted in the original inspection have not been corrected, the vehicle decals shall be removed from the ambulance by the health officer and shall only be replaced upon such ambulance after the defects have been corrected. Inspections provided for herein may also be made by any police officer of the city ~~and by or~~ any authorized employee of the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs of the city."

Section 10. That Section 4-16 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 4-16. Fees for operator's permit, decals; term of decals.

The fee for the ambulance operator's permit required pursuant to section 4-15 of this Code shall be \$500.00, and all permits issued under this chapter shall be valid for one year from the date of issuance. Such permits may be renewed after the termination date of the initial permit and during that same year by paying a permit fee of \$200.00. The charge for decals

required pursuant to section 4-8 of this Code shall be \$160.00 per pair of decals for each pair issued, renewed or replaced. Decals expire concurrently with the ambulance operator's permit under which they are issued. Such fees and charges shall be collected by the department of health and human services and transferred to the ~~finance and administration~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs, together with an accounting of the permits and pairs of decals for which same were collected."

Section 11. That Section 5-27 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-27. Application.

To obtain a permit for the operation of a carnival, the applicant shall file an application therefor with the ~~tax assessor and collector~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs on a form furnished by the city department for that purpose. The application information shall include:

- (1) The name and address of the person or persons under whose control the carnival will be operated.
- (2) The street address of the site on which the carnival is to be operated.
- (3) The number and types of amusement rides which will be operated at that location.
- (4) Whether there will be any temporary electrical, gas, water or sewer connections to any equipment or fixtures associated with the carnival and a description of the connections that will be made.
- (5) Whether there will be any food offered for sale as part of or in association with the carnival.
- (6) Whether there will be any tents and the dimensions thereof.
- (7) The date on which the carnival will be placed on the property and the date it will be removed therefrom.
- (8) The date on which the carnival will be first operated on the property and the last date the carnival will be operated at that location.

- (9) The name of the owner of the real property upon which the carnival will be operated; if the applicant is not the owner thereof he shall attach a lease or other written evidence of his authority to use the property to the application."

Section 12. That Section 5-28 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-28. Issuance.

Upon the filing of an application pursuant to this division and the payment of the permit fee, the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his designee shall issue a permit for the operation of the carnival at the location and for the dates specified in the application. Upon issuance of a permit for a carnival, the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his designee shall notify the fire marshal, the building official, the planning official, and the health officer thereof."

Section 13. That the introductory paragraph and Item (9) of Subsection (a) of Section 5-72 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas are hereby amended, respectively, to read as follows:

"(a) Any person desiring a license to operate a dance hall shall file with the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs a written, sworn application for such license on a form prescribed and furnished by the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs for such purpose. Such application shall state:"

- "(9) Such other and additional information as may be reasonably requested by the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs for the review and processing of the application."

Section 14. That Section 5-78 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-78. Issuance.

A license applied for under this division shall be issued by the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his designee when the conditions of this article have been complied with and the application has been approved in accord with this division."

Section 15. That Section 5-79 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-79. Contents.

A license issued under this division shall state on its face to whom it is issued, the date it will expire, the address and location of such dance hall, and whether the licensee is authorized to operate and conduct a Class A, B, C, D or E dance hall. It shall be signed ~~and sealed~~ by the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector."

Section 16. That Section 5-84 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-84. Appeal from denial.

In the event the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall refuse to grant a license to any applicant under this division notice of such denial shall immediately be provided to the applicant in writing and, his such action ~~in so refusing~~ shall become final; unless the applicant shall, within ten days after the refusal to grant such license, file with the city secretary a written appeal addressed to the city council requesting a hearing by the council upon the question as to whether or not his application shall be granted. In the event such appeal is filed, the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector shall provide the council with a record of all proceedings ~~theretofore~~ had with reference to the application in question, including the written application; together with the action of the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector and the reason for such action. The city council shall, within 30 days, grant a hearing thereon to determine the correctness of the action of the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs and such action as the city council may take thereon shall be final and conclusive."

Section 17. That Subsections (b) and (c) of Section 5-85 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) Prior to revocation, the police chief shall give written notice to the licensee setting forth:

- (1) The grounds upon which the city will seek revocation of the license.
- (2) The specific violations of this article and/or any federal or state law or laws upon which the city will rely in seeking revocation of the license or the specific convictions of the licensee or any person required to be listed on the application for the license.
- (3) That a hearing will be held before the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his designee ~~designated agents~~.
- (4) The date, time and place of such hearing.
- (5) A statement that the licensee ~~shall~~ may appear in person, ~~and/or~~ be represented by counsel, ~~may~~ present testimony, and ~~may~~ cross-examine all witnesses.

Such notice shall be served by personal delivery or by certified mail, return receipt requested."

"(c) All hearings shall be ~~held~~ conducted by the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his designee ~~designated representative~~. Such official shall be referred to as the hearing officer. The ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall not designate any person or persons to perform the duties of hearing officer under this section who has ~~had~~ any prior knowledge of the allegations or circumstances upon which revocation is sought, except ~~such person designated as~~ hearing officer ~~may~~ shall, prior to the hearing, receive ~~be provided~~ a copy of the notice given to the licensee.

A representative of the legal department shall be present at each ~~such~~ hearing to advise the hearing officer as to procedural matters; ~~such attorney~~ but shall not ~~partake~~ take part in any determination of the facts.

All hearings shall be conducted under rules consistent with the nature of the proceedings; provided, however, the following rules shall apply to such hearings:

- (1) All parties shall have the right to representation by a licensed attorney though an attorney is not required.

- (2) Each party may present witnesses on his own behalf.
- (3) Each party has the right to cross-examine all witnesses.
- (4) Only evidence presented before the hearing officer at such hearing may be considered in rendering the order hearing officer's final decision."

Section 18. That Section 5-173 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-173. Grounds for denial, revocation or suspension.

(a) The ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall forward each application received under this division to the chief of police for an investigation as to whether the applicant has been convicted of an applicable offense as specified in section 1-10 of this Code. If it appears that the applicant has been convicted of such an offense, the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall follow the procedures set forth in section 1-9 of this Code.

(b) A license issued under this division shall be subject to revocation by the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs pursuant to the applicable provisions of sections 1-9 and 1-10 of this Code."

Section 19. That Section 5-174 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-174. Same--Payment; receipt constitutes license; approval of chief of police prior to issuance of receipt.

The license fee provided for in section 5-172 shall be paid to the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax-assessor-collector~~, who, upon receipt of such fee and subject to the following terms hereof, shall give a receipt therefor to the taxpayer in the name of the city, signed by the director collector, which receipt shall be a license for the operation of the game rooms set out in this division until the thirty-first day of December of the year in which the license was issued."

Section 20. That Subsections (c), (e), (f), and (j) of Section 7-1 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) *Application for license.* To obtain a license under this section, the applicant shall file an application therefor in writing to the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs on a form provided for that purpose. On the application, the applicant shall provide the following information:

- (1) The full name and mailing address of each owner and operator of the business;
- (2) Whether any owner or operator is an individual, partnership, corporation, or other legal entity;
- (3) If any owner or operator is a corporation, all officers of the corporation; and if there are fewer than five shareholders, the names of all shareholders;
- (4) If any owner or operator is a partnership, the type of partnership and names and addresses of all general partners;
- (5) If any owner or operator is an unincorporated association, the names and addresses of all officers of such association;
- (6) The location where the business will be conducted;
- (7) The time period or periods during which the business will be conducted.

Such application form shall be accompanied by an affidavit of the applicant that neither he nor any business partner, nor, in the case of a corporation, any corporate officer, has had a license under this chapter or any preceding city ordinance governing the businesses described herein revoked.

Upon receipt of such application, the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~the tax assessor-collector or his designated agents or his designee~~ shall investigate the items sworn to by affidavit. If neither the applicant, his business partners, nor any corporate officers have had a license revoked as described above, the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ shall issue a license to the applicant upon payment of the license fee.

If the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ rejects the application he shall give written notice by certified mail to the applicant at the address stated in the application. The written notice shall specifically set forth the reasons for the rejection. A rejection shall be

subject to appeal in the same manner provided in section 7-18 of this Code for an antique dealer's license."

"(e) *License valid for one location; change of address charge.* A license issued pursuant to this section shall be valid only for the location set out in the application. However, a license issued pursuant to this section is valid for the purchase, trade or other receipt of any of the items regulated by this section.

Should any person licensed under this section move his place of business from the place designated in such license to a new address, he shall give prior written notice of such relocation to the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ and have the change noted on his license. A fee of \$2.00 payable to the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ is hereby levied for such a change."

"(f) *Records to be kept.* Every person engaged in the business of buying, trading or otherwise receiving used jewelry, used tableware, or other used items made of precious stones or precious metals shall keep at his place of business within this city a consecutively numbered ticket or record book in a form approved by the chief of police in which he enters each such item received on the day the item was received. The ticket or record book shall contain the following information:

- (1) An accurate description of the property;
- (2) The name, address and driver's license or Texas personal identification certificate number of the person from whom such items were acquired;
- (3) The date and hour of acquisition;
- (4) The motor vehicle license number of the vehicle in which such items were delivered, if delivered by motor vehicle.

The licensee, his agents or employees shall obtain a receipt from the seller or transferor of the property. Such receipt shall be dated on the actual date of the transaction and such receipts shall list the items sold or otherwise transferred.

All entries in the record book or on the tickets shall be written in ink and made legibly. Each person required to keep records under this section shall, upon request, submit and exhibit all tickets, record books, and

business records connected with the receipt of goods regulated by this section for inspection and copying to any police officer of the city or authorized inspector of the department of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector's office at any time during regular business hours. Such records shall be retained for a period of not less than one year after the last transaction entered therein.

Any licensee ~~which that~~ ceases to maintain a place of business within this city shall deliver the records kept pursuant to this section to the chief of police within 24 hours of the time he ceases to maintain a place of business within the city."

"(j) *Revocation of license.* A license issued pursuant to this section may be revoked if the licensee, his agent or employees, have, since the license was granted, violated the provisions of this chapter, or any state or federal statute involving the criminal offense of theft, or the provisions of sections 37.09 or 37.10 of the Texas Penal Code, or that the licensee falsified his original application for a license.

Prior to revocation, written notice shall be given to the licensee or person in charge. Such notice shall set forth:

- (1) The grounds upon which the city will seek revocation of the license;
- (2) The specific acts upon which the city will rely in seeking revocation of the license;
- (3) That a hearing will be held before the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his designee ~~designated agent~~;
- (4) The date, time and place of such hearing;
- (5) That the licensee may appear in person, ~~and/or~~ be represented by counsel, ~~may~~ present testimony and ~~may~~ cross-examine all witnesses.

All hearings shall be held by the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector or his designee, who designated representative ~~Such official~~ shall be referred to as the hearing officer. However, the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector shall not designate any person to perform the duties of hearing officer who has participated in or supervised any investigation of the

licensee's place of business or investigation of the charges under which the city is seeking revocation of the license. ~~Nevertheless, however,~~ the person designated as hearing officer may, prior to the hearing, receive a copy of the notice given to the licensee or person in charge.

All hearings shall be conducted under rules consistent with the nature of the proceedings and only evidence presented before the hearing officer at such hearing may be considered in rendering the order.

If the licensee fails to appear at the hearing at the time, place and date specified, the city shall present sufficient evidence to establish a prima facie case showing that there are grounds for revocation of the license.

After completion of the hearing, the hearing officer shall make written findings as to whether or not grounds exist for revocation of the license. If the hearing officer finds that grounds do exist for revocation of the license, he shall revoke it. The decision of the hearing officer shall be final.

A copy of the written findings shall be served on the licensee. If the address of the licensee is unknown or if such findings have been sent certified mail, return receipt requested, and return undelivered, such findings shall be served on the person in charge of the business or on an agent or employee of the licensee.

Any notice provided for in this section may be served by personal delivery or by certified mail, return receipt requested.

In the event a license is revoked, the city shall not be liable to the licensee for any refund of any part of the license fee."

Section 21. That Section 7-18 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 7-18. Application for and issuance or refusal of license.

(a) Any person desiring a license required by this article shall make application therefor in writing to the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ on an application form provided for that purpose, stating where the business is to be located and the residence address of the owner or manager. Such application form shall be accompanied by an affidavit, sworn to by the applicant, that neither he nor any business partner, nor, in the case of a corporation, any corporate officer,

has had a license revoked under this chapter or any preceding city ordinance governing the business described herein ~~revoked~~.

(b) Upon receipt of such application, the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector or his ~~designated deputy designee~~ shall investigate the items sworn to by affidavit. If neither the applicant, his business partners, nor any corporate officers have had a license revoked as described above, the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector shall issue a license to the applicant upon payment of the license fee.

(c) If the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector rejects the application, he shall give written notice by personal delivery or certified mail, return receipt requested to the applicant at the address stated in the application. The written notice shall specifically set forth the reasons for the rejection."

Section 22. That Subsection (c) of Section 7-20 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) The licensee, his agents or employees shall ~~obtain~~ provide a receipt ~~from~~ to the seller or transferor of the property. ~~Such~~ Each receipt shall be consecutively numbered and shall be dated on the actual date of the transaction and shall list the items sold or otherwise transferred. An accurate copy or record of receipts obtained shall be retained for a period of not less than three years, and shall be available for inspection upon request during business hours by any peace officer or authorized inspector of the department of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector's office."

Section 23. That Section 7-21 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 7-21. Stock to be open for examination.

The stock or inventory of any antique dealer that is openly displayed and available to the public shall at any time during ordinary business hours be accessible for examination by any peace officer or authorized inspector of the department of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector's office. Failure to permit an examination when requested shall be a misdemeanor."

Section 24. That Section 7-24 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 7-24. Change in business address.

Should any person licensed under this article move his permanent place of business from the place designated in such license to a new address, he shall immediately give written notice to the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ and have the change noted on his license. A fee of \$2.00 payable to the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ is hereby levied for such a change."

Section 25. That Subsections (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of Section 7-25 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) Upon written verified complaint filed by any person with the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ setting out facts alleging that any licensee under this article has, since the license was granted, violated the provisions of this chapter, or any state or federal statute involving the criminal offense of theft, or the provisions of section 37.09 or 37.10 of the Texas Penal Code or that the licensee falsified his original application for a license, the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ shall cause the allegations to be investigated."

"(b) If just cause exists for a hearing on revocation of a license herein, the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ shall notify the licensee in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested, that a revocation hearing will be conducted at a specified time and place with reference to such complaint. A copy of the verified complaint shall be included, notifying the licensee of the allegations against him."

"(c) At the hearing conducted by the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ or his authorized agent designee, all parties may present evidence, and may be represented by licensed an attorneys, ~~and. All parties may~~ question opposing witnesses."

"(d) Based on a preponderance of the evidence, the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ or his authorized agent designee shall determine, whether the license should be revoked. A written copy of the decision shall be sent to all parties by certified mail, return

receipt requested, as soon after the conclusion of the hearing as practicable but in no event more than 30 days thereafter."

"(e) In the event that the licensee's license is revoked, such licensee may appeal the revocation to the city council by notifying the city secretary in writing within 14 days after the revocation. A hearing before the city council shall be set as soon as practicable. Failure to appeal within 14 days shall render the ~~tax assessor-collector's~~ decision of the director of administration and regulatory affairs final."

Section 26. That Section 7-51 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of the ~~finance and administration~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs or his designee."

Section 27. That Subsection (a) of Section 7-66 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) It shall be unlawful for any metal recycling entity or secondhand metal dealer, his agents or employees to purchase or receive an item of property, including but not limited to street signs, traffic signals, manhole covers, road and bridge guard rails, street light poles and fixtures, on which are written or affixed the words 'Property of the City of Houston' or other words or markings demonstrating ownership by the city except in the following circumstances:

- (1) Where the person offering such property for sale is an employee of the city authorized by the director to make such a sale and provides the metal recycling entity or secondhand metal dealer, his agents or employees, his agents or employees with a written authorization from the ~~city treasurer~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs for the sale of such property; or
- (2) Where the person offering such property for sale presents at the time of such offer a valid receipt from the director evidencing the purchase of such property by the person offering such property."

Section 28. That Subsection (a) of Section 7-75 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) *Grounds for rejection, refusal to renew or revocation.* The director may reject an original application, or an application for a renewal of any existing license, if, as a result of inspections by the police department, the ~~finance and administration~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs, or other city department, it appears that the applicants' place of business is not in compliance with or violates any provision of this article. Failure to comply with any provisions of this Code shall be grounds for the rejection of an original application, renewal or revocation of any license required of a metal recycling entity, secondhand metal dealer or secondhand dealer under this article. Any person violating any provision of this article shall be punished as provided by section 1-6 of this Code."

Section 29. That Section 7-102 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 7-102. License required; display of licenses.

No person shall own or operate a common market unless he has a valid license issued by the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector. Any person who owns or operates a common market at more than one location must obtain a license for each separate location. In the event the person who operates a common market is not the owner thereof, both the owner and the operator shall be co-licensees. Each license required under this article shall be conspicuously posted upon the licensed premises."

Section 30. That Subsection (a) of Section 7-103 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) To obtain a license to own or operate a common market, the applicant shall submit an application therefor in writing to the director of administration and regulatory affairs tax assessor-collector on a form furnished by the city department for that purpose. The applicant shall set forth:

- (1) The name and address of the common market.

- (2) The name and address of the persons who will operate the common market.
- (3) If the owner or operator is a corporation, all officers of the corporation; and if there are fewer than five shareholders, the names of all shareholders.
- (4) If the owner or operator is a partnership, the names and addresses of all partners.
- (5) If the owner or operator is an association, the names and addresses of all officers of such association.
- (6) The street address where the common market is located.
- (7) The legal description of the property on which the common market is located.
- (8) Whether or not any person required to be listed on the application has had a license revoked under this article at any time."

Section 31. That Section 7-104 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 7-104. License issuance; notification upon rejection.

The director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ shall issue a license upon submission of an application in accordance with this article and payment of the license fee, unless he finds the applicant cannot be granted a license under section 7-105 of this Code.

If the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ rejects the application, he shall give written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the applicant stating the reasons for such rejection. If an application is rejected on a finding that the applicant cannot be granted a license under section 7-105 of this Code, no portion of the license fee shall be refunded."

Section 32. That Subsection (b) of Section 7-109 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) The licensee shall maintain the records so described in a record book which has a carbon copy, the original being the city police department's copy and the carbon being for the licensee's records. The licensee's copies shall be available for inspection by any peace officer or authorized inspector of the department of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector's office~~ during regular business hours. The licensee shall maintain his copies of such records for six months after the dates the persons listed were permitted to use such space, booth or room and shall maintain the originals for the same period unless the police department has taken custody of the originals prior to the expiration of that time. It will be the responsibility of the police department to pick up the original copies of the records."

Section 33. That Sections 7-112 and 7-113 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 7-112. Investigation of facts prior to revocation of license; notice to licensee of possible revocation.

Whenever the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax collector-assessor~~ receives reliable information that grounds for revocation of a license exists, he shall investigate the facts. If he finds that there are probable grounds for revocation of a license, he shall give written notice to the licensee by personal service or by certified mail, return receipt requested. Such notice shall set forth:

- (a1) The specific grounds upon which the license in question may be revoked.
- (b2) That there will be a hearing before the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his ~~designated representative~~ designee in which the city will seek the revocation of the license.
- (c3) The date, time and place of such hearing.
- (d4) That the licensee may appear in person and/or be represented by an attorney and may present testimony and may examine all witnesses.

In the event the address of the licensee is unknown or notice which has been mailed is returned undelivered, service upon any agent of the licensee at the common market shall be deemed service upon the licensee.

Sec. 7-113. Hearing on license revocation.

(a) All hearings shall be held by the director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~tax assessor-collector~~ or his ~~designated representative designee~~. Such officer shall be referred to as the hearing officer. However, the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall not designate any person ~~or persons~~ to perform the duties of hearing officer under this section who has participated in the investigation or has prior knowledge of the allegations or circumstances discovered in the course of said investigation except those set forth in the notice given pursuant to section 7-112 of this Code.

(b) All hearings shall be conducted under rules consistent with the nature of the proceedings, and only evidence presented ~~before the tax assessor-collector~~ at such hearing may be considered in rendering the final order."

Section 34. That Item (1) of Subsection (d) of Section 8-123 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) A rate review for auto wreckers, including heavy-duty wreckers, shall be initiated by the director of ~~finance and~~ administration and regulatory affairs during calendar years ending with the digits three or eight. The rate review shall be conducted in accordance with procedures established for that purpose by the director. Without limitation, the director may select a representative group of auto wrecker owners and request that they provide verified financial data and vehicle-operating data regarding their operating costs and return on investment for use as a basis in conducting the review. Following receipt and review of the required data, the director shall make a recommendation to city council whether any rate change is justified, and, if so, the amount of the recommended increase or decrease. If a rate change is recommended to the city council, then the city council or a committee of city council shall conduct a hearing before adopting any increase or decrease. The increase or decrease may be adopted by motion and shall be effective on the first day of the next calendar year."

Section 35. That the second paragraph of Subsection (a) of Section 8-143 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"In the event of a proposed suspension or termination for cause, the storage facility operator shall be afforded an opportunity for a hearing before the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or his designee ('the hearing officer') prior to suspension or termination of the agreement. The hearing officer shall render his decision at the conclusion of the hearing, which decision shall not be effective until the time for filing an appeal has expired. Each hearing before the hearing officer shall be video recorded by the police department. In the event that the hearing officer finds that the agreement should be suspended or terminated for cause, the storage facility operator may file a written appeal of that decision with the hearing officer within three days following rendition of the hearing officer's decision. The appeal shall be decided by the automotive board within 30 days of the filing of a written request therefor with the hearing officer or as soon thereafter as the board is able to convene a meeting. The timely filing of an appeal shall stay the action of the hearing officer for a period of ten days from the date of filing of the appeal. Unless additional information is requested in the manner provided below, the appeal shall be decided on the basis of the video record and any documents filed at the hearing before the hearing officer, a copy of which shall be made available to each member of the automotive board as soon as practicable after the filing of the appeal. The board may take additional evidence if five or more members of the board request that additional information be furnished. Any such request shall specifically state the person(s) or document(s) to be presented and the names of the five or more board members who requested that the information be provided. The notice shall be delivered in writing by the chairman of the board to the police chief and to the appellant at least 72 hours prior to the commencement of the board meeting at which the appeal will be considered. The police chief and the appellant shall make every reasonable effort to present the person(s) or document(s) requested to the extent that the person(s) are within their ability to control or the document(s) are within their possession or control. If the board fails to decide the matter within the 30-day stay period, then on the 31st day, the hearing officer's decision shall be reinstated and shall be effective until the board decides the matter."

Section 36. That Subsection (a) of Section 8-203 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) It shall be the duty of each person who holds an authorization to operate a private storage lot under this article to furnish to the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, on forms provided by the director, a quarterly report summary for each private storage lot disclosing full information on operations for each calendar year quarter. The data

furnished shall include data on reasonably incurred expenditures, including salaries, administrative costs, accounting and legal fees, insurance, licenses, taxes, utilities, maintenance, depreciation and any other information reasonably required and requested by the director in order to accurately determine private storage lot operating costs. Such reports shall be delivered on or before the twentieth day of May, August, November and February of each year, and shall cover operations for the preceding calendar quarter. Such report shall be sworn to before a notary public."

Section 37. That Section 9-51 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by deleting the definition of the term *finance director* set forth therein.

Section 38. That the caption and Subsections (a), (d), (e), (g), and (h) of Section 9-58 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 9-58. Scheduled ground transportation licenses issued by the ~~finance and administration~~ department of administration and regulatory affairs."

"(a) *In general.* SGT licenses issued by the ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs pursuant to this section shall be sufficient authorization for SGT vehicles to operate on the streets, roads, and highways of the city while en route to or from an airport. An SGT license is not required for vehicles operated in compliance with another chapter of this Code, or state or federal laws, governing vehicles for hire and use of streets, roads, and highways. An SGT license, or another regulatory approval, is required in addition to an airport use permit in the circumstances described in section 9-52 of this Code."

"(d) *Applications.* Applications for SGT licenses shall be submitted on forms furnished by the ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs and shall provide the following information:

- (1) Name and form of business under which the service will be operated.
- (2) The mailing address and telephone number of the applicant.
- (3) A list showing the model, type, and make of each vehicle applicant desires to place into operation.

- (4) A description of the service proposed to be provided. If the service is contract service authorized by section 9-54 of this Code, a copy of the contract is a sufficient description.
- (5) Written proof that the applicant has an airport use permit for each vehicle in question or has applied for such a permit."

"(e) *Issuance.* Upon verification of the material submitted by the applicant pursuant to subsection (d) of this section and payment of the required license fee (which shall be prorated in cases where a supplemental application is filed to add a vehicle for only part of the term of an existing license), the ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall issue an SGT license to the applicant covering each vehicle specified in the application."

"(g) *Substitute vehicles.* Licensees may substitute a vehicle for a vehicle covered by an SGT license, provided the ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs is notified in advance."

"(h) *Revocation or suspension; appeals.* The ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs may revoke or suspend any SGT license, in whole or in part, for failure to comply with this section, provided that:

- (1) The licensee is given notice and an opportunity to be heard prior to the action; and
- (2) No such action is effective until the licensee is notified in writing, which notice must include a statement of the reason for the action.

Within 15 days following receipt of such a notice, and if the license is wholly or partially suspended for 16 days or more or revoked, the licensee may appeal the action to the city council by delivering a written notice of appeal to the city secretary. Upon timely receipt of such appeal, a date will be set by the city council for a hearing thereon, subject to the councils general rules. The city council may affirm, modify, or reverse the action of the ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs."

Section 39. That Subsection (b) of Section 14-4 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) No paymaster, treasurer, director of administration and regulatory affairs, or other officer or agent of the city shall willfully pay, or be in any manner concerned in paying any person any salary or wages for services as an officer or employee of the city, unless such person is occupying an office or place of employment according to the provisions of the Charter and ordinances of the city and is entitled to payment therefor."

Section 40. That Exhibit A to Rule 11, Division 11, entitled "Layoffs," of the Civil Service Rules for municipal employees, which appears following Section 14-145 in the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 41. That Section 14-210 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 14-210. Automated payroll system.

(a) The ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs department, central payroll division, has authority for maintaining the automated payroll system and for maintaining the integrity of data therein. However, no payroll transaction that is made necessary by the hiring, terminating, or change in the rate of pay for an employee, when such transaction is used to generate payroll warrants for employees of the city shall be entered into the payroll data base unless and until the transaction has been audited by the controller and delivered to the ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs department, central payroll division, signifying that such audit has been conducted.

(b) The ~~finance and administration and regulatory affairs~~ department, central payroll division, has authority for preparing all necessary payroll system reports, including payroll warrants. However, the city controller and the director of ~~finance and administration and regulatory affairs~~ shall not issue any warrant or order in payment of any salary or compensation to any person for filing or holding a classified position unless either the payroll, warrant, or check for that work bears the certification of the commission, that the persons named thereon are correctly named and titled, at the legal rate of pay, and were appointed or employed in accordance with the provisions of these rules and regulations. Subsequent to such certification and upon receipt of the payroll warrants, the city controller has exclusive authority for verifying, signing, and distributing the warrants to department directors and their designees."

Section 42. That Subsection (a) of Section 15-3 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) Bids shall be opened and read at a public meeting conducted by the city secretary, or an assistant city secretary, with the assistance of representatives of the department of ~~finance and administration and regulatory affairs~~, the department of general services and the department of public works and engineering."

Section 43. That Subsection (d) of Section 15-83 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(d) The bidding documents and the contract documents for goal-oriented contracts for which an MBE/WBE participation level has been established shall contain a provision detailing the purposes and objectives of the city's MBE/WBE ordinance and shall incorporate by reference this article and the then-current motion establishing MBE and WBE annual goals. Regulated contracts which are determined to have significant subcontracting potential for which an MBE/WBE participation level has been established shall contain contractual provisions (and proposal provisions if submitted for proposals or for bids) requiring the contractor to meet or exceed the determined MBE/WBE participation level for that contract, or to establish that it has made good-faith efforts to do so, and that notwithstanding such efforts, was unable to meet or exceed the determined participation levels. The directors of the ~~finance and administration and regulatory affairs~~, general services and public works and engineering departments will establish procedures defining good-faith efforts. These procedures will be reviewed

and approved by the affirmative action division, the mayor and the city attorney."

Section 44. That Subsection (b) of Section 15-123 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) No entity named in subsection (a) of this section shall be deemed a qualifying entity until the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs has certified that such entity has implemented a policy or administrative procedure consistent with the purpose of this article."

Section 45. That Subsection (b) of Section 15-125 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) A hearing under subsection (a) shall be conducted by a three-member panel consisting of the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, the city secretary and the initiating director, or their designees, within five business days following the initiating director's receipt of a written request for such hearing. Notice of the three-member panel's decision in an appeal shall be given to the initiating director and affected contracting entity in writing by deposit in the U. S. mail within five business days after such decision."

Section 46. That Items (2) and (3) of Subsection (c) and Subsection (d), all off Section 16-8 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended, respectively, to read as follows:

"(2) The ~~director of finance and administration~~ chief of police or his designee shall annually designate a period during which applications will be received from public, parochial or private elementary or secondary schools for funding of school crossing guard services contracts during the next school year. Notice shall be provided by mailing a copy to the superintendent's office of each public school district having one or more schools in the city, by mailing a copy to each private and parochial school in the city that has its name and address available through a listing provided to the public by the Texas Education Agency and by publishing notice one time in a newspaper of general circulation. In the notice, the ~~director of finance and administration~~ chief of police or his designee shall specify a date for the receipt of applications and specify the place where information

may be obtained regarding the form in which they shall be provided. The ~~director of finance and administration~~ chief of police may issue rules and regulations for the submission of applications and the determination of allowable service costs for personnel and equipment reimbursements hereunder."

"(3) It is the policy of the city council to rely upon the traffic safety recommendations of school districts for public schools and school administrators for other schools in determining the need for school crossing guard services. Each application shall include justification for funding of each crossing location that is requested therein, including a description of street conditions, traffic levels, street use, expected student crossing use and related safety data, which shall be provided by the chief traffic safety official of school districts and by the principal of schools not operated by school districts. Subject to the priorities of funding set forth in item (4), below, the ~~director of finance and administration~~ chief of police or his designee shall recommend each application that is timely filed in proper form for the issuance of a funding contract by the city council. In the event that the city council questions the appropriateness of a recommendation, then the matter may be referred by city council to the traffic engineer."

"(d) All funding for school crossing guards for public schools under this section shall be made available through the school district that operates the school. Private and parochial schools funding shall be provided to the school. Funding shall be made available in quarterly reimbursements upon contracts and a schedule to be established by the ~~director of finance and administration~~ chief of police, who may require proof that the services were or are being actually provided. All expenditures of the city under this section for contracts issued or other obligations assumed shall be expressly limited to the monies available in the fund."

Section 47. That Subsection (d) of Section 18-16 of the Code of Ordinances,

Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(d) Upon the sworn complaint of any person the committee shall, and upon its own initiative or an unsworn or anonymous complaint, the committee may, review alleged acts of impropriety on the part of city officials and candidates for city office. At least once each calendar year the ~~director of finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs shall cause to be distributed to each city employee in his or her regular pay envelope a notice setting forth the functions and duties of the committee and the procedures for filing complaints, and periodically such notices shall be posted in

prominent places in city-owned facilities. The notices shall set forth a city office and telephone number that may be contacted for further assistance or information."

Section 48. That Section 18-89 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 18-89. Notice.

At least once each calendar year in conjunction with the notice to city employees required by section 18-16(d) of this Code, the director of ~~finance and administration and regulatory affairs~~ shall cause to be distributed to each city official a notice regarding the provisions of section 18-88 of this Code. Each new city official shall be furnished the notice at the time of hiring, appointment or election. However, the failure of any city official to receive a notice shall not excuse compliance with section 18-88 of this Code."

Section 49. That Section 27-3 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 27-3. License application and issuance.

(a) Any person desiring a license required by this chapter shall make application therefor in writing to the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs on a form provided by the ~~city director~~ for that purpose stating where the business is to be located and the residential addresses of the owner and the operator. Such application shall be subscribed and sworn to before an officer authorized to administer oaths. Such application shall state that neither the applicant nor any business partner, nor, in the case of a corporation, any corporate officer, have had a license revoked under any city ordinance governing the business described herein.

(b) Upon the receipt of such application, the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall investigate the items in the application. If neither the applicant, his business partners, nor any corporate officers have had a license revoked as described above, the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall notify the applicant that it has been approved and shall issue a license to the applicant upon payment of the license fee.

(c) If the ~~city tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs rejects the application, ~~he shall give~~ written notice, by certified mail, return receipt requested, shall be given to the applicant at the address stated in the application. The applicant shall have 30 days from the date of mailing thereof to appeal the rejection of his application to the city council by filing written notice of such appeal with the city secretary. Upon receipt of such notice, the city council shall hear evidence regarding the rejection of the application and shall, based upon the preponderance of the evidence, sustain or overrule such rejection. The city council shall give written notice of its action within ten days of its decision and such decision shall be final."

Section 50. That Section 27-5 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 27-5. Records required.

Every person licensed as a mini-warehouse operator shall cause to be kept at his place of business a record of each rental or lease transaction, listing the date, the number of the unit rented, the name and address of the lessee, and the lessee's driver's license number. The record shall be written legibly in ink and shall be kept neat and clean. All records provided for in this section shall be retained for three years and shall be available and open for inspection during regular business hours by any police officer of the city or by any authorized representative of the ~~city tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs. It shall be unlawful for any person coming within the terms of this section to fail to keep or display the records as provided."

Section 51. That Subsections (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f) of Section 27-6 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended, respectively, to read as follows:

"(a) Upon written verified complaint filed by any person with the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs setting out facts alleging that any licensee under this chapter has, since the license was granted, violated the provisions of this chapter, or any state or federal statute involving the criminal offense of theft, or violated the provisions of section 37.09 or 37.10 of the Texas Penal Code, or that the licensee falsified his original application for a license, the ~~tax assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall investigate the allegations."

"(b) Based on his investigation, the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall determine whether just cause exists for a hearing on revocation.

"(c) If just cause exists for a hearing on revocation of a license herein, the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall notify the licensee in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested, that a revocation hearing will be conducted at a specified time and place with reference to such complaint. A copy of the verified complaint shall be included, notifying the licensee of the allegations against him."

"(d) At the hearing conducted by the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his ~~authorized agent~~ designee, all parties may present evidence and may be represented by licensed attorneys. All parties may question opposing witnesses."

"(e) Based on a preponderance of the evidence, the ~~tax-assessor-collector~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs or his ~~authorized agent~~ designee shall determine, whether the license should be revoked. A written copy of the decision shall be sent to all parties by certified mail, return receipt requested, as soon after the conclusion of the hearing as practicable but in no event more than 30 days."

"(f) In the event that the licensee's license is revoked, such licensee may appeal the revocation to city council by notifying the city secretary in writing within 14 days after the revocation. A hearing before the city council shall be set as soon as practicable. Failure to appeal within 14 days shall render the ~~tax-assessor-collector's~~ decision of the director of administration and regulatory affairs final."

Section 52. That Item (2) of Subsection (c) of Section 28-34 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(2) Subject to compliance with other applicable laws, including chapters 7 and 8 of this Code as applicable, a special permit may be transferred to another owner. Application shall be made to the department responsible for issuing the permit, whether the police department or the ~~finance and~~ administration and regulatory affairs department, and shall be executed by both the transferor and the transferee. In the event that the use of the premises is ~~ceased~~ suspended at any time for a period of 90 or more consecutive days, then the special permit shall expire, and this provision shall not be construed to allow the transfer of a special permit that has so expired.

A special permit may be revoked for failure to comply with any applicable law, regulation, or statute relating to the licensing or other regulation of the business."

Section 53. That Subsection (d) of Section 29-119 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(d) The licensee shall maintain or ensure that an agent maintains a register showing:

- (1) The names of all persons staying in or residing in the park showing the manufactured home lot on which they are staying or residing.
- (2) The serial number of each manufactured home which is located in the park; whether the vehicle is a manufactured home as defined in Article 5221f of Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes, a HUD-Code manufactured home, a recreational vehicle connected to the park's utilities, a self-contained recreational vehicle not connected to the park's utilities, or a dependent recreational vehicle; the make, manufacturer, length and width of the vehicle, the license number of the vehicle if it is a recreational vehicle, and the lot on which each such vehicle is located.
- (3) The date each manufactured home is placed in the park and the date it is moved from the park.
- (4) The date each recreational vehicle is placed in the park and the date it is moved from the park.

The register shall be available for inspection by the building official, any person designated by the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, and any person designated by the director of public health to inspect such records in the course of their official duties."

Section 54. That Section 32-203 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 32-203. Assistance by certain city departments.

The directors of the departments of planning and development, finance, ~~and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, public works and engineering, general services and parks and recreation and their staffs shall provide requested assistance to the parks board. The city attorney and his staff shall provide legal services and representation to the parks board."

Section 55. That Section 34-40 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 34-40. Use of police training services by outside agencies.

Priority shall be given in all training courses conducted by the police department to peace officers and peace officer candidates of the city. To the extent that any excess capacity may exist in any class or training course after city needs have been accommodated the police department may allow persons who are employed as peace officers or peace officer candidates by other jurisdictions to attend the class or training course. The chief of police may adopt administrative regulations regarding the offering of training to persons from other jurisdictions. The police chief or such member of the police department as the chief may designate shall establish training fees, registration fees, lab fees, printing fees, and other related fees for any training furnished to persons from other jurisdictions. The fees shall be payable for each person other than a city peace officer or candidate attending each class. The fees shall be based upon the city's cost of providing the services and shall be remitted to the city treasury. All fees shall be subject to the approval of the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs."

Section 56. That Subsection (a) of Section 34-172 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) The chief of police shall promulgate procedures to investigate ownership of property, to provide notice to potential claimants of, and to request disposition of property of undetermined ownership in a manner consistent with this article, to transfer property determined to be abandoned property under section 34-175 of this Code to the director of the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs for notice and disposition procedures consistent with Article 18.17 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, to request that any abandoned property originally seized by the police department be converted to the use of the city, and to dispose of property or goods in the manner authorized by subsection (b) of this section."

Section 57. That Subsection (b) of Section 34-175(b) of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) The director of the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs is authorized to act as the person designated by a municipality under Article 18.17 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, to take the actions authorized under that article with respect to the disposition of abandoned property."

Section 58. That Section 36-71 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs of the city or any individual employed by such department that he shall designate to perform any of his functions specified in this article."

Section 59. That Item (2) of Subsection (a) of Section 37-1 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or his designee(s)."

Section 60. That Item (1) of Section 37-24 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) Routine inquiries initiated by the ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs department or other city agencies and departments."

Section 61. That Subsection (b) of Section 37-201 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or the director's designee."

Section 62. That Subsection (b) of Section 38-3 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) When a railroad company applies to renew a franchise to cover existing track or tracks, including tracks which cross a street or streets, the city engineer, with the concurrence of the director of the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, may waive the requirement for filing a profile of the grades along or across the streets named in the application by filing a written recommendation with the city council to be attached to said application, provided that the railroad company shall furnish said profile upon the request of the city engineer."

Section 63. That Subsection (g) of Section 38-4 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(g) Any railroad company that disagrees with any decision made by the traffic engineer under this section shall have ten days from the date it was notified of that decision by the traffic engineer to appeal such decision to a three-member board to be known as the grade crossing review board. Such board shall be composed of the directors of the departments of public works and engineering, ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, and planning and development or their designees. The director of the department of public works and engineering or designee shall serve as chairman of the grade crossing review board and notify the appealing railroad company in writing of the time and place for hearing such appeal."

Section 64. That Subsection (h) of Section 38-6 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(h) The company shall not, wholly or in part, transfer, assign or otherwise dispose of the franchise, or its rights thereunder, without the express written consent of the city having been first obtained. To obtain the city's consent, the company must file its request therefor, together with a true copy of the proposed instrument of transfer, with the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs, who shall make a recommendation thereon to the city council. Upon consent by the city to the transfer or assignment, each provision of the franchise shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the transferee or assignee of the company."

Section 65. That Section 39-111 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director or the director's designee of the city's department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs ~~or its successor department.~~"

Section 66. That Subsection (h) of Section 40-27 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(h) *Disposition of fees.* All costs recovered in relation to the provision of city security control and traffic control services shall be allocated to the city's general fund administered by the department of finance and administration ~~department.~~"

Section 67. That Item (1) of Subsection (b) of Section 40-200 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) No permit shall issue for the use or occupancy of the city right-of-way until the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs shall certify to the public necessity of such use, occupancy and maintenance for a public transportation structure."

Section 68. That Subsection (n) of Section 40-234 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(n) *Enforcement.* The city attorney or his/~~her~~ designee shall have the right to enforce all legal rights and obligations under the permit ordinance without further authorization. Permittee shall provide to the director, ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~and/or~~ city attorney documents and records that the director, ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs ~~and/or~~ city attorney deems reasonably necessary to determine permittee's compliance with the permit, with the exception of those documents made privileged and/or confidential by federal or state law or regulation or any documents that would be privileged under the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure."

Section 69. That Subsections (p) and (q) of Section 40-234 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(p) *Insurance*. Permittee shall provide and maintain in full force and effect during the term of its permit ordinance at least the following insurance:

- (1) Worker's compensation at statutory limits;
- (2) Employer's liability, including bodily injury by accident and by disease, for \$500,000.00 combined single limit per occurrence and a 12-month aggregate policy limit of \$1,000,000.00;
- (3) Commercial general liability coverage, including blanket contractual liability, products and completed operations, personal injury, bodily injury, broad form property damage, operations hazard, pollution, explosion, collapse and underground hazards for \$5,000,000.00 per occurrence and a 12-month aggregate policy limit of \$10,000,000.00; and
- (4) Automobile liability insurance (for automobiles used by the permittee in the course of its performance under the permit, including employer's non-ownership and hired auto coverage) for \$2,000,000.00 combined single limit per occurrence.

The ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall adjust the above minimum liability limits every five years during the term to compensate for the effects of inflation and with the objective to reestablish the value of coverage required as of the effective date.

Each policy or an endorsement thereto, except those for worker's compensation and employer's liability, shall name the city and its officers, employees and agents as additional insured parties, but limited to risks indemnified pursuant to subsection (o) of this section. If any such policy is written as 'claims made' coverage and the city is required to be carried as an additional insured, then permittee shall purchase policy period extensions so as to provide coverage to the city for a period of at least two years after the last date that the permit ordinance is in effect. No deductible shall exceed ten percent of the minimum limits of liability or one percent of the consolidated net worth of permittee and its permitted affiliates, whichever is greater.

Permittee shall assume and bear any claims or losses to the extent of deductible amounts and waives any claim it may ever have for the same against the city and its officers, agents or employees in respect of any covered event.

All such policies and certificates shall contain an agreement that the insurer shall notify the ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs

in writing not less than 30 days before any material change, reduction in coverage or cancellation of any policy. Permittee shall give written notice to the finance director of administration and regulatory affairs within five days of the date upon which total claims by any party against permittee reduce the aggregate amount of coverage below the amounts required by the permit.

Each policy must contain an endorsement to the effect that the issuer waives any claim or right in the nature of subrogation to recover against the city, its officers, agents or employees.

Each policy must contain an endorsement that such policy is primary insurance to any other insurance available to the city as an additional insured with respect to claims arising thereunder.

Permittee shall be entitled to purchase and maintain the insurance required under this subsection under so-called 'blanket policies, provided the coverage thereunder is at least at the levels contained herein and is otherwise adequate in keeping with prudent underwriting standards.

At the time of application, and at the finance director of administration and regulatory affairs' request, permittee shall provide certificates of insurance reflecting that the terms of this subsection have been met. Notwithstanding the proof of insurance requirements set forth in this subsection, permittee, throughout the term of its permit, continuously and without interruption, shall maintain in force the required insurance coverages set forth in this subsection.

In lieu of maintaining policies of insurance described in this subsection, permittee may elect to self-insure against the risks described in this subsection, provided that permittee submits to the director documents showing either (i) self-insurance reserves or other assets sufficient to pay judgments equal to the minimum limits of liability set forth in this subsection, or (ii) a net worth that exceeds ten times the aggregate minimum limits of liability set forth in this subsection. If, during the term of a permit ordinance, any such self-insurance program ceases or the self-insured's assets, reserves or net worth are no longer adequate to provide the above coverages, permittee shall immediately notify the city of such lapse of coverage and obtain or cause to be obtained commercial insurance in accordance with the requirements of this subsection within 30 days. If permittee self-insures, permittee has a duty to defend the city in the same manner as a permittee with insurance in any suit seeking damages against the city in connection with permittee's pipeline, and permittee will pay all costs and expenses of such defense or reimburse the city for all costs and expenses incurred by the city for such defense."

"(q) *Events of termination.* A permit ordinance issued under this article shall, at the option of the city council, terminate (as to the affected pipeline or portion thereof only in the event of an occurrence under ~~subsections items~~ (1), (5) or (6) ~~below of this subsection~~) upon the occurrence of any one or more of the events described below (collectively referred to herein as 'events of termination'). Each event of termination is a separate and independent basis for termination of the permit (or application thereof to the affected pipeline or portion thereof, as applicable). The events of termination are as follows:

- (1) The city council, in its legislative discretion, determines that the existence or operation of a pipeline, or any part thereof, constitutes a hazard, nuisance or other threat to the public health, safety or welfare or that the existence or continued operation of the pipeline, or any part thereof, interferes with the current or prospective use of a street. Termination under this subsection shall be by ordinance and become effective after permittee has been given 180 days' notice of such termination, unless circumstances comprising a bona fide emergency and an imperative public necessity warrant more immediate termination.
- (2) Expiration of the term of the permit ordinance.
- (3) Permittee fails to timely pay any of the fees herein provided for or is delinquent in the payment of any charges due under the permit ordinance.
- (4) Permittee fails to maintain at any time the insurance as required in this article.
- (5) Permittee fails to commence or thereafter to diligently prosecute to completion any required maintenance, repair or other work required by this article to be done by permittee within 30 days after being notified of such required action by the director. In the event of an emergency, notice shall be deemed given and received after telephone contact with an authorized officer or director of permittee, and permittee shall commence the requested repairs within 24 hours.
- (6) Permittee abandons the pipeline.

- (7) Permittee fails to file a written acceptance of the permit ordinance within the time and in the manner prescribed in this article.
- (8) Permittee fails to comply with any of the terms, conditions or provisions of the permit ordinance or this article.
- (9) Permittee commences dissolution or some other similar proceeding that would impair, modify, alter, extinguish or significantly change permittee's ability to perform permittee's obligations under the permit ordinance.

Upon the occurrence of an event of termination described in subsections item (1) or (2) of this subsection, such an event of termination may not be cured by permittee and the permit ordinance shall terminate (only as to the affected pipeline in the event of termination pursuant to item (1), (5), or (6) above of this subsection) in the manner and in accordance with the applicable provisions of said subsections and the permit ordinance. Upon the occurrence of one or more of the events of termination other than in subsections item (1) or (2) of this subsection, the director or ~~finance~~ director of administration and regulatory affairs shall so notify permittee in the manner provided in the permit ordinance. After such notice, permittee shall have 30 days in which to cure the event of termination. Should permittee fail or refuse to cure the event of termination within the 30-day time period prescribed, city council may terminate the permit ordinance (only as to the affected pipeline or portion thereof in the event of termination pursuant to item (5) or (6) of this subsection; provided that if permittee commences efforts to cure such event of termination within 30 days after receipt of such written notice and thereafter prosecutes such efforts with reasonable diligence in the sole determination of city council until such event of termination is cured, then such event of termination shall cease to exist and no action to terminate the permit ordinance or an application thereof will be taken. Failure of the city to enforce its rights and remedies under this section with respect to one event of termination shall not operate as a waiver of the city's right to thereafter enforce its rights and remedies with respect to any such continuing event of termination or another event of termination. Termination of the permit ordinance or an application thereof shall not waive, release or satisfy any duty, covenant or obligation of permittee under this article or the permit ordinance which permittee has not fully performed as of the time of termination."

Section 70. That Section 40-252 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 40-252. Reduction of excess assessment--Amount.

The personal obligation of the owner of an eligible unrestricted residence homestead property for payment of the excess assessment levied against such property may be reduced and cancelled by one-tenth of the amount of such excess assessment for each year of occupancy in which the owner has received an exemption from the H. C. A. D. and furnishes proof thereof to the ~~finance and administration~~ department of finance ~~the city.~~"

Section 71. That Section 40-253 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 40-253. Same--Procedure.

An owner desiring to reduce and cancel the amount of the excess assessment on eligible unrestricted residence homestead property shall:

- (1) Apply to the ~~finance and administration~~ department of the city for the reduction and cancellation of the excess assessment;
- (2) Furnish with such application proof satisfactory to the ~~finance and administration~~ department that the eligible unrestricted residence homestead property was occupied by the owner at the time the initiation ordinance for the paving improvement was passed;
- (3) Furnish proof the owner had received an exemption from the H. C. A. D. for the year in which the initiation ordinance was adopted; and
- (4) Annually furnish proof to the ~~finance and administration~~ department of the city that the H. C. A. D. has continued to grant an exemption for such eligible residence homestead property so long as the owner remains qualified to claim a reduction or cancellation of the excess assessment as herein provided."

Section 72. That Subsection (c) of Section 40-265 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) In the event that the director determines that an application should be denied, the applicant shall be given notice in writing of the reasons

for the denial. An applicant may appeal the decision of the director regarding such denial by filing a written request for a hearing with the director within ten days after he is given notice of such denial. The director's decision on the application shall be final unless an appeal is timely filed. An appeal shall not stay the director's decision on the issuance of a permit. The applicant's written request for a hearing shall set forth the grounds on which the denial is challenged. The hearing shall be conducted by the city's director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or his designee who shall act as the hearing official under this article. The hearing official shall not have participated in any investigation or decision relating to the denial of the permit. At the hearing, the hearing official shall receive oral and written evidence regarding the application. Hearings shall be conducted under rules issued by the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs which shall be consistent with the nature of the proceedings and shall ensure that each party may present evidence, cross-examine witnesses, and be represented by legal counsel."

Section 73. That Subsection (b) of Section 40-266 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) Prior to revocation of a permit, the director shall investigate the grounds alleged to determine whether probable cause for revocation may exist and, if so, shall notify the permittee in writing of reasons for the proposed revocation and grant such permittee the opportunity to appear before a hearing official to be designated by the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs at a time and place specified within such notice. The hearing official designated shall not have participated in any investigation of the alleged grounds for the revocation. Such hearing shall be held not less than ten days after the notice is given. Hearings shall be conducted under rules issued by the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs. Such rules shall be consistent with the nature of the proceedings and shall ensure that each party may present evidence, cross-examine witnesses, and be represented by legal counsel. If, after the hearing, the hearing official finds that the permit should be revoked, he shall issue a written order revoking such permit which shall be effective on the third day after notice thereof is given to the permittee. The written decision of the hearing official shall be final."

Section 74. That Section 40-331 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of the city's department of ~~finance and administration and regulatory affairs~~, or another person such director may designate."

Section 75. That Subsection (c) of Section 40-336 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) *Permit fees included in line fee.* In addition to the portion of line fees intended to compensate the city for a grantee's use of the public ways, a portion of the line fee payments due hereunder constitutes compensation to the city for the cost of permits and inspections, or other similar approvals or submissions required by a grantee for its work in the public ways authorized by an appropriate right-of-way ordinance. As a result, no additional fees shall be charged to the grantee therefor. On at least an annual basis, the directors of the departments of ~~finance and administration and regulatory affairs~~ and public works and engineering shall determine the amount of the customary fees that would have been charged to other persons for such activities and transfer the amount from the fund receiving the line fees into the proper fund from which such activities were provided. This subsection shall not be construed to waive any requirement relating to permitting, inspections or similar approvals or submissions other than the payment of separate fees therefor."

Section 76. That Subsections (a) through (g) of Section 44-5 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Houston, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) The city council may, by ordinance, grant tax relief in the form of an exemption from ad valorem taxation to any 'historic site,' which for purposes of this section means a structure that has been designated as a landmark or as a contributing structure or a potentially contributing structure in a historic district pursuant to article VII of chapter 33 of this Code. The historic site must meet the first of the following qualifications, and, in the case of any historic site that is designated as a potentially contributing structure, the second qualification:

- (1) At any time following the designation of the historic site by the city council pursuant to article VII of chapter 33 of this Code, the owner must perform restoration or preservation of the historic site to encourage its preservation. The work performed must be at a cost of at least 50 percent of the assessed value of the historic structure or improvements, not including the value of any land associated with the historic site. The required

expenditure shall be determined by the director of finance ~~and administration~~, based upon the assessed value of the historic structure or improvements not including the value of any land associated with the historic site prior to the work ('the base value'). Only expenditures made for work performed either following or within five years of the designation of the property by the city council pursuant to article VII of chapter 33 of this Code may be applied.

- (2) For a potentially contributing structure, the restoration or preservation made or proposed to be made must have the effect of reversing incompatible alterations or deteriorating conditions of the structure, as evidenced by a certificate of appropriateness issued by the Houston Archaeological and Historical Commission.

The denial of any application for a certificate of appropriateness under article VII of chapter 33 of this Code shall be grounds for denial or revocation of any tax exemption authorized by this ordinance.

(b) Each historic site for which a tax exemption is sought must meet the applicable qualifications set out in subsection (a) hereof. The historic site must not be or have been the subject of a certificate of appropriateness, as defined in section 33-201 of this Code, issued pursuant to sections 33-247 or 33-250 of this Code, which shall be grounds for denial or revocation of the exemption. Each owner desiring the tax exemption must make sworn application to the director of finance ~~and administration~~ of the city. The application shall be in a form approved by the director of finance ~~and administration~~ and shall set forth facts sufficient to show that the historic site is eligible for tax relief hereunder.

(c) An exemption granted hereunder by the city council shall exempt the historic structure or improvements not including the value of any land associated with this historic site from ad valorem taxation on the basis of qualifying expenditures made for bona fide restoration or preservation, as determined by the director of finance ~~and administration~~ upon demonstration by the owner. The exemption shall be computed on the following basis:

- (1) If the said qualifying expenditures are at least 50 percent but less than 100 percent of the base value, then the exemption for each tax year on the assessed value of the structure shall be equal to the amount of the qualifying expenditures; or

- (2) If the said qualifying expenditures are 100 percent or more of the base value of the improvements, then the exemption for each tax year shall be one hundred percent of the assessed value of the historic structure or improvements not including the value of any land associated with this historic site.

In any event, however, the exemption granted to any historic site pursuant to this section shall be subject to a limitation in the form of a maximum dollar amount. The maximum dollar amount shall be the assessed value of the historic structure in the year following demonstration of completion of the restoration or preservation work and demonstration of the qualifying expenditures to the director of finance and administration. The amount of the exemption allowed on a historic structure shall not exceed the aforesaid maximum dollar amount in any tax year for the duration of the exemption period.

The duration of the aforesaid exemption shall be for a period of 15 years if the restoration project receives no financial incentive from the city funded by municipal hotel occupancy taxes, or ten years if the restoration project receives a financial incentive from the city funded by municipal hotel occupancy taxes. The exemption shall begin on January 1 of the year following the date that the director of finance and administration makes the determination that the owner of the historic site has met all of the requirements of this section for an exemption.

The director of finance and administration, in consultation with the planning official, shall establish and promulgate written procedures for the implementation of the exemption provided herein and the review of applications, and the said officials shall jointly make a recommendation to the city council regarding each application that is duly submitted for consideration.

(d) An exemption granted under this section shall be effective as of January 1 of the year following demonstration of completion of the restoration or preservation work and demonstration of the making of the qualifying expenditures to the director of finance and administration. If sufficient restoration work on a designated historic site has not been completed to satisfy either subdivision one or two of subsection (c) above within five years of the passage of a historic site tax exemption ordinance, then said ordinance shall expire. After the expiration of any such ordinance under the terms of this provision, upon a showing of good cause for the delay, the owner of the historic site may apply for a new tax exemption ordinance.

(e) The exemption shall be automatically continued as of January 1 of each year succeeding the year the exemption was first granted for the duration of the ten or 15 year period. The exemption shall be continued in the event of a transfer of an ownership interest or a portion of an ownership interest in the historic structure during such ten or 15 year period. However, the exemption shall be terminated in the event of a second transfer of an ownership interest or a portion of an ownership interest in a historic structure, other than a single-family property containing no more than four residential units, during such ten or 15 year period. In the case of a condominium or other multi-family residential building, the second transfer of an ownership interest or a portion of an ownership interest in an individual unit shall cause the termination of the exemption pertaining to that particular unit. As used in this section, a 'transfer' of an ownership interest or portion of an ownership interest shall not include such transfers as a lease, a mortgage, a transfer by inheritance, a creation of a trust for the benefit of the owner, or other transaction not ordinarily regarded as a 'sale' of property.

A person who has an ownership interest in property that has been granted a historic site exemption from ad valorem taxation shall record a copy of the ordinance providing for such exemption in the real property records of the county in which the property is located. Failure on the part of the applicant to deliver a copy of such recorded ordinance, showing the date of recordation in the appropriate real property records, to the director of finance and administration within 90 days of the date of passage of the ordinance providing for a tax exemption shall cause the expiration of the exemption at the end of such 90-day period.

(f) The director of finance and administration shall conduct an annual review of each property granted an exemption hereunder, and, if he finds that any city taxes assessed on the subject property are delinquent, the historic site has deteriorated, has been demolished or destroyed, or has been the subject of a certificate of appropriateness issued pursuant to sections 33-247 or 33-250 of this Code, then the changed condition shall constitute grounds for revocation of the exemption.

(g) Tax receipts and tax certificates issued for any historic site receiving tax relief pursuant to this section shall be clearly marked: 'Historic site--Subject to recapture of additional taxes under Code of Ordinances.' Each year during which the property is granted tax relief, the director of finance and administration shall note on his records the valuation which would have been made and the taxes that would have been due had the historic site not qualified for tax relief under this section. If the historic site is subsequently damaged, demolished, or destroyed, or if a certificate of appropriateness is issued for the historic site pursuant to sections 33-247 or

33-250 of this Code, then the property shall be subject to a recapture of taxes and subject to penalties and interest calculated under pertinent provisions of the Texas Tax Code. The additional tax shall be equal to the difference between taxes paid or payable hereunder and the amount of the tax payable for the preceding fifteen years had the property not been granted tax relief. Such additional taxes shall be deposited in a segregated account, the use of which shall be established by city council by a subsequent ordinance. Until paid, there shall be a lien for additional taxes, penalty, and interest on the property granted tax relief under the provisions of this section. An obligation to pay recaptured taxes is extinguished by operation of force majeure. Force Majeure means: fires, floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, ice storms and other natural disasters, explosions, war, terrorist acts, riots, and the acts of superior governmental or military authority, and which the affected party is unable to prevent by the exercise of reasonable diligence. The term does not include any changes in general economic conditions such as inflation, interest rates, economic downturn or other factors of general application, bankruptcy or an event that merely makes performance more difficult, expensive or impractical."

Section 77. That Subsection (b) of Section 44-20 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) In any instance in which it is made to appear to the finance ~~and administration~~ director of the city or to the mayor that any paving assessment owned or held by the city has been paid in full, they and either of them are hereby also authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver such a release, being also entitled to rely for their assurance that the assessment has been paid in full, upon a written request therefor by the city controller, the city engineer, the city attorney or a responsible assistant to him, or a responsible assistant to the tax assessor-collector."

Section 78. That Subsections (b), (c), (e) and (f) of Section 44-29 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) For purposes of this section, any property that meets the criteria in subsection (a) is a significant historic structure. Each significant historic structure must obtain a 75% approval of the members of the Houston Archeological and Historical Commission present at a regularly scheduled meeting. The Houston Archeological and Historical Commission shall review the applications for tax relief for significant historic structures on an annual basis to determine whether the eligibility standards of subsection (a) are met. Each owner desiring the tax exemption must make sworn application to the

director of finance ~~and administration~~ of the city. The application shall be in a form approved by the director of finance ~~and administration~~ and shall set forth facts sufficient to show that the significant historic structure is eligible for tax relief as described in this section."

"(c) An exemption granted by city council upon recommendation of the Houston Archeological and Historical Commission shall exempt from ad valorem taxation the significant historic structure, improvements and land associated with this significant historic structure from ad valorem taxation. The exemption shall be computed on the following basis:

100 percent of the appraised value of the structure, improvements and the land necessary for access to and use of the significant historic structure per year may be exempt from ad valorem taxation. If the significant historic structure is owned by more than one owner, then the total tax reduction shall be pro-rated among the various multiple owners, in proportion to the appraised value of each owner's respective ownership interest in the structure to the total appraised value of all the owners' ownership interests in the structure. Under no circumstances may the exemption for any one structure result in a tax reduction of greater than \$30,000.00 for any tax year.

City council from time to time may, by ordinance, exempt properties from the maximum limit established above so long as the properties meet the criteria required for this exemption. The duration of the aforesaid exemption shall be for the duration of compliance with subsection (a) of this section. The exemption shall begin on January 1 of the year following the date that the exemption is granted by city council.

The director of finance ~~and administration~~, in consultation with the planning official, shall establish and promulgate written procedures for the implementation of the exemption and the annual review of applications, and these officials shall jointly make a recommendation and submit the recommendation of the Houston Archeological and Historical Commission to the city council regarding each application that is duly submitted for consideration."

"(e) The director of finance ~~and administration~~ shall conduct an annual review of each property granted an exemption as a significant historic structure, and, if he finds that:

- (1) Any city taxes assessed on the subject property are delinquent;

- (2) The owner or, in the case of multiple owners, any of the multiple owners is delinquent on city taxes on any other property;
- (3) The significant historic structure has deteriorated, has been relocated, demolished or destroyed; or
- (4) The site no longer meets the requirements of section (a) of this ordinance;

then the changed condition shall constitute grounds for revocation of the exemption.

The director of finance ~~and administration~~ shall give a 90-day notice to the owner of a significant historic structure prior to any revocation of the exemption granted pursuant to this section. The purpose of such notice shall be to allow the owner an opportunity to correct the changed condition."

"(f) Tax certificates issued for any significant historic structure receiving tax relief pursuant to this section shall be clearly marked: Significant Historic Structure --Subject to recapture of taxes under Code of Ordinances.(Each year during which the property is granted tax relief, the director of finance ~~and administration~~ shall note on his or her records the valuation that would have been made and the taxes that would have been due had the significant historic structure not qualified for tax relief under this section. If the property has a changed condition described under subsection (e) of this section or no longer meets the requirements of subsection (a) of this section, then the property shall be subject to a recapture of taxes and subject to penalties and interest calculated under pertinent provisions of the Texas Tax Code. The additional tax shall be equal to the amount of the tax payable for the preceding fifteen years had the property not been granted tax relief. Such additional taxes shall be deposited in a segregated account, the use of which shall be established by city council by a subsequent ordinance. Until paid, there shall be a lien for additional taxes, penalty, and interest on the property granted tax relief under the provisions of this section. An obligation to pay recaptured taxes is extinguished by operation of force majeure. Force Majeure means: fires, floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, ice storms and other natural disasters, explosions, war, terrorist acts, riots, and the acts of superior governmental or military authority, and which the affected party is unable to prevent by the exercise of reasonable diligence. The term does not include any changes in general economic conditions such as inflation, interest rates, economic downturn or other factors of general application, bankruptcy or an event that merely makes performance more difficult, expensive or impractical."

Section 79. That Section 44-101 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of the finance ~~and administration~~ department."

Section 80. That Subsection (h) of Section 45-232 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(h) All costs recovered in relation to the provision of city security control and traffic control services shall be allocated to the city's general fund administered by the finance ~~and administration~~ department."

Section 81. That Subsection (b) of Section 45-453 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) The initial fee for the issuance of a traffic control permit shall be \$100.00. The fee shall be reviewed and approved by the director of finance ~~and administration~~ and regulatory affairs on an annual basis and adjusted to fully recover the city's costs, taking into account permit issuance and renewal costs, inspection and oversight services that may be required, and equipment and resource utilization, provided that no fee increase in excess of 15 percent shall be implemented without prior approval of the city council."

Section 82. That Section 46-16 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of the department of finance ~~and administration~~ and regulatory affairs and his duly authorized representatives."

Section 83. That Subsection (a) of Section 46-65 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) Applications for permits may be filed on or before December 1 of each permit year in which permits are determined to be available pursuant to section 46-63 of this Code. Each applicant shall utilize forms promulgated by the director and shall submit any information requested in accordance with instructions that shall be promulgated by the director. Without limitation

of other information that the director may require in order to determine compliance with this Code and other applicable laws, the applicant shall set forth and provide under oath:

- (1) The applicant's name, mailing address (and street address if different), and telephone number.
- (2) Evidence of the type of business enterprise that the applicant utilizes, e.g. proprietorship, partnership, or corporation, together with the identity and address of each principal.
- (3) Criminal history information for every principal as required by the director to determine compliance with section 1-10 of this Code.
- (4) Evidence that the applicant has a place of business within the metropolitan area from which the applicant's taxicab business is or will be operated and that use of the proposed location is in compliance with any applicable deed restrictions.
- (5) A statement indicating the number of permits requested by a new entrant applicant or an other applicant.
- (6) A statement indicating whether the applicant is a new entrant applicant or an other applicant.
- (7) For new entrant applicants, evidence that the applicant's operator has within the preceding period of ten years had at least five years active and practical taxicab business experience, with at least two of those years in the city.
- (8) For other applicants, the identity of the permittee as defined in section 46-16 of this Code on whose behalf the application is filed.
- (9) Evidence that the operator is either a United States citizen or an alien legally residing in the United States with the legal right to engage in employment in the United States.

Each application shall be accompanied by a filing fee. The filing fee shall be an amount established by city council by motion upon recommendation of the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs. In addition to the filing fee, the applicant shall provide funding to the director in a form and manner specified by the director for criminal history

checks to be performed by state and federal agencies, as applicable under subsection (b) below."

Section 84. That Subsection (a) of Section 46-68 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) The annual fee for a permit under this division shall be \$400.00 for each taxicab. In the event a permit is issued for a period of time less than eight months, the fee shall be \$50.00 per month or fraction of a month. A replacement fee of \$15.00 shall be charged for reissuance of each medallion that is lost, mutilated or otherwise rendered unusable.

The annual permit fee shall be paid in advance in three installments at the offices of the city's department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs as follows: \$150.00 paid on or before April 1 of each calendar year, \$125.00 paid on or before May 1 of each calendar year, and \$125.00 paid on or before June 15 of each calendar year. Failure to pay permit fees when due shall be grounds for taxicab permit revocation."

Section 85. That Subsection (e) of Section 46-72 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(e) Except as provided in this subsection, a new permit may not be transferred in any manner or by any means, whether at law, by contract or otherwise, and may only be held by the person with the same principals named as the applicant in the application filed under section 46-65 of this Code. Any alienation of a new permit or use of any taxicab operated thereunder other than in the business owned and operated by the lawful holder of the new permit shall render the permit void.

A new permit shall constitute a privilege to which no property interests or rights of any kind or character shall appertain. However, in the case of the death, disability, or unavailability of any new permittee or principal thereof or for other good cause, the city council may, by motion, upon request duly filed with the city secretary, authorize the reassignment of the new permit to a spouse, child, or other close relative of the new permittee who will carry on the business. The proposed transfer shall be first referred by the city secretary to the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs for a determination that the proposed transferee is qualified to receive the transfer of the new permit under the applicable provisions of this Code. A new permit shall be subject to revocation and shall be unlawful to possess to the extent that it is used in contravention of this subsection. The new

permittee shall be entitled to notice and a hearing in the same manner as provided in this article for revocation of permits for other grounds."

Section 86. That Item (1) of Section 46-136 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) *Director* shall mean the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or his designee(s)."

Section 87. That Section 46-191 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* shall mean the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or his designee(s)."

Section 88. That Subsection (a) of Section 46-211 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) *Fees.* The annual fee for a license under this division shall be \$400.00 for each sightseeing or charter vehicle, payable to the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs in two installments as follows: \$200.00 paid on or before January 1st of each year, and \$200.00 paid on or before June 1st of each year. In the event the license is issued for a period of time less than one year, the fee shall be \$50.00 per month or fraction thereof remaining in the calendar year, not to exceed \$400.00. A replacement fee of \$15.00. shall be charged for reissuance of each medallion that is lost, mutilated, or otherwise rendered unusable. Failure to pay the license fees when due shall result in termination of the license as provided in section 46-215 of this Code."

Section 89. That Subsection (a) of Section 46-232 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) *Required.* The annual fee for a license under this division shall be \$400.00 for each limousine, payable to the department of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs in two installments as follows: \$200.00 paid on or before January 1st of each year and \$200.00 paid on or before June 1st of each year. In the event the license is issued for a period of time less than one year, the fee shall be \$50.00 per month or fraction thereof remaining in the calendar year, not to exceed \$400.00. A replacement fee

of \$15.00 shall be charged for reissuance of each medallion that is lost, mutilated, or otherwise rendered unusable. Failure to pay the license fees when due shall result in license revocation, as provided in section 46-244(d) of this Code."

Section 90. That Subsection (c) of Section 46-243 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) No limousine driver shall operate a limousine upon the property of any city airport except for the purpose of discharging passengers whose trips originated elsewhere or for the purpose of rendering service to deplaning passengers who wish to be transported from the airports. No limousine driver shall park or stand his limousine upon airport property except for the purpose of actually loading or unloading passengers in accordance with an instrument executed under subsection (a), nor shall any limousine driver enter or remain upon airport property unless his limousine has permanently affixed on the windshield an automatic vehicle identification tag in accordance with policies and procedures promulgated by the director of aviation. It shall be the duty of each driver to present a copy of the instrument required under subsection (a) to any aviation department employee, ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs department employee, or peace officer upon request to evidence compliance with this section. If the driver fails to produce the instrument evidencing compliance, it shall be presumed in any prosecution under this subsection that the driver's presence upon the airport property was unlawful."

Section 91. That Section 46-276 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or his designee."

Section 92. That Section 46-321 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended by amending the definition of the term *director* therein to read as follows:

"*Director* means the director of ~~finance and administration~~ and regulatory affairs or his designee."

Section 93. That Item (2) of Subsection (d) of Section 47-352 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(2) Issued by a financial institution which meets the qualifications prescribed by the director of the department of finance and administration; and"

Section 94. That the City Council hereby approves and authorizes the transfer within the General Fund from the FY 2008 adopted Finance and Administration Department budget the annual revenues and budget authority set out in Exhibit A hereto to the newly created Finance Department budget, and the annual revenues and budget authority set out in Exhibit B hereto to the newly created Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department budget, which departments are successors to the duties and responsibilities of the former Finance and Administration Department. The 5% limitation on the Mayor's authority to transfer funds between department budgets within a Fund as set out in Ordinance No. 2007-732 shall not apply to transfers between the newly created Finance Department budget and the newly created Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department budget during the remainder of FY 2008. All other applicable provisions of Ordinance No. 2007-732 shall apply to the transferred funds and positions as though the newly created department budgets were included in the FY 2008 General Fund Budget *ab initio*. The Director of the Finance Department, the Director of the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department, the City Controller and others as appropriate shall consult and coordinate to facilitate the implementation of the reorganization of the former Finance and Administration Department as set out in this ordinance including, without limitation, addressing the most efficient and appropriate means of implementation in the financial management system, contract management issues and other operational and systems

issues in order to ensure the continued efficient performance of the responsibilities of the former Finance and Administration Department.

Section 95. That the City Council hereby approves and authorizes for FY 2008 the transfer of positions as set out on Exhibit C hereto to the newly created Finance Department, and the transfer of positions as set out on Exhibit D hereto to the newly created Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department.

Section 96. That the City Council hereby approves and authorizes the transfer within the General Fund budget from the FY 2008 adopted Finance and Administration Department budget \$1,852,658 to the Information Technology Department budget, and approves and authorizes the transfer of the positions set out Exhibit E hereto from the Finance and Administration Department budget to the Information Technology budget.

Section 97. That any reference to the Director of the Finance and Administration Department found in a City contract shall be treated by the City as a reference to either the Director of the Finance Department or the Director of the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department as appropriate depending upon the responsibilities assigned to each by this ordinance.

Section 98. That the City Council hereby approves and authorizes the transfer of \$413,254 from the General Fund-General Government Contingency account to the newly created Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department expenditure budget.

Section 99. That, if any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions

of this Ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting this Ordinance that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness or invalidity of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 100. That there exists a public emergency requiring that this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on January 26, 2008.



SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: The outcome of recent litigation challenging the constitutionality of various provisions of the City of Houston parade ordinance has demonstrated that the city has in place a parade permit application process that best serves the interest of the citizenry and the interests of individuals and organizations who wish to engage in such activities. Nevertheless, the court suggests that further amendments to the City's parade ordinance would be prudent in advancing the City's efforts to balance the interests of the general citizenry while preserving the interests of individuals and organizations who wish to conduct a parade upon a city street, road, highway, or any combination thereof. Additionally, the Mayor's Office of Special Events ("MOSE") has proposed amendments which provide greater flexibility regarding the acceptance and processing of parade permit applications. TRAFFIC

* * *

ARTICLE IX. PARADES AND PROCESSIONS

DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Sec. 45-231. Definitions.

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this division, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Civilian traffic controllers has the meaning ascribed in section 40-27 of this Code.

Conditional permit means a permit subject to the satisfaction of conditions that if not satisfied within the time allotted shall result in the automatic revocation of such permit.

Director means the director of the public works and engineering department or the director's designee.

Disbanding area means the area where parade participants, floats, vehicles, and animals disband following a parade.

Downtown area has the meaning ascribed to the term *central business district* in section 42-1 of this Code.

Final permit means a permit issued upon the satisfaction of all requirements of this division.

Holiday means any day officially recognized by the city as a holiday for its employees observed by the general closure of city offices.

Mayor's office of special events (MOSE) has the meaning ascribed in section 40-27 of this Code.

Non-revenue-generating parade means any parade for which no participation fee is charged or for which no cash is accepted or collected ~~or in-kind donations, gifts, or as sponsorship or in support of the proposed parade, are or will be accepted or collected.~~

Parade means a procession of pedestrians, vehicles, or animals, or any combination thereof, traveling in unison along or upon a street, road, or highway, organized and conducted for the purposes of attracting the attention of the general public and/or expressing or celebrating views or ideas by use of verbal, visual, literary, or auditory means of communication. A parade shall not mean a procession of vehicles operated in compliance with ordinary traffic laws or a procession of pedestrians along or upon public sidewalks or private property.

Police chief has the meaning ascribed in section 40-27 of this Code.

Revenue-generating parade means any parade for which a participation fee is charged or for which any cash is accepted or collected as ~~or in-kind donations, gifts, or sponsorship~~ or in support of the proposed parade, ~~are or will be accepted or collected.~~

Security control plan has the meaning ascribed in section 40-27 of this Code.

Security control services means the use of the appropriate number of law enforcement officers certified under the laws of this State or civilian traffic controllers necessary to monitor and maintain public security and crowd control during a parade.

Special event holiday means any holiday proclaimed by the mayor as a special community celebration.

Special events manager ("SEM") has the meaning ascribed in section 40-27 of this Code.

Staging area means the area where parade participants, floats, vehicles, and animals assemble prior to a parade.

Traffic control plan has the meaning ascribed in section 40-27 of this Code.

Traffic control services has the meaning ascribed in section 40-27 of this Code.

Sec. 45-232. Permit required; security and traffic control.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any number of persons, delegations, or associations of persons, or for any company, circus, or group to conduct a parade along or upon the streets of the city without first obtaining a permit to do so.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any number of persons, delegations, or associations of persons, or for any company, circus, or group to conduct a parade upon any esplanade,

median, median strip, or traffic island designed for the purpose of separating or directing vehicular traffic. No permit shall be required for the use of the sidewalks of the city for any procession or parade.

(c) Upon receipt of a permit, any number of persons, delegations, or associations of persons or any company, circus, or group may conduct a parade along or upon the streets of the city subject to the provisions of this division and other applicable laws.

(d) In no event shall the city provide security control services or traffic control services for more than two parades on the same calendar day.

(e) The use of city security and traffic control services shall be provided on a first-come, first-served basis based upon the parade permit applicant's declaration as required by item (12) of section 45-236 of this Code.

(f) If a parade permit applicant requests the use of city security and traffic control services along a parade route, and the city has the necessary resources available to provide the requisite security and traffic control services, such services shall be provided as follows:

- (1) At no cost for the first 15 intersections along the proposed parade route.
- (2) For each intersection thereafter along the proposed parade route, a fee of \$1,000.00 per intersection.

(g) In the event that the city is unable to provide traffic control services for the proposed parade or the applicant elects to provide its own traffic control services, the use of non-city personnel to perform traffic control services shall require the submission of a traffic control plan prepared in conformance with the Texas Manual on Traffic Control Devices. The submitted traffic control plan shall be subject to the review and written approval of the director. The use of non-city personnel to provide public security control during a parade shall require the submission of a security control plan subject to the review and written approval of the police chief.

(h) All costs recovered in relation to the provision of city security control and traffic control services shall be allocated to the city's general fund administered by the finance and administration department.

Sec. 45-233. Parade route restrictions in downtown area.

(a) For purposes of this division, "intersection" means the junction of any two streets within the parade route, but shall not include any staging or disbanding area.

(b) Applicants for permits for parades to be held in the downtown area may design

their own parade routes, subject to the approval of the SEM and the director, with the following restrictions:

- (1) A parade held on a Saturday, Sunday, holiday, or special event holiday may include no more than 25 street intersections and must be completed in no more than three hours.
- (2) A parade held on a day other than a Saturday, Sunday, holiday, or special event holiday may include no more than 10 street intersections, must be completed in no more than one hour, and must begin at either 10:00 a.m. or 2:00 p.m.
- (3) The parade must be conducted in such a manner that to the extent that the route includes any entrances to or exits from off-street vehicle parking, loading, or customer service facilities, whether public or private, the width of the parade procession shall be controlled at those facilities so that at least one lane of the street may safely be left open for vehicular access to each vehicle facility from the nearest cross street.
- (4) A parade route may not include any streets or portions of streets that are located west of Bagby Street, south of Jefferson Street, east of Chartres Street, or north of Congress Street.
- (5) A parade route must in its entirety be located either:
 - a. On Fannin Street or other streets or portions of streets located to the east of Fannin Street; or
 - b. On Travis Street or other streets or portions of streets located to the west of Travis Street.

Sec. 45-234. Parades outside of downtown area.

(a) Permits for parades outside of the downtown area shall be issued in conformance with all the provisions of this division. No permit shall be issued for a parade that includes streets located both inside and outside the downtown area.

(b) Applicants for parade permits for parades to be held outside the downtown area may design their own parade routes with the following restrictions:

- (1) The route may not exceed one and one-half miles in length and may not include more than twenty-five intersections, whichever is less.
- (2) The maximum time necessary for completion of the parade may not exceed

three hours.

- (3) ~~A~~ If the parade is to be held on a day other than a Saturday, Sunday, holiday, or special event holiday, must be completed in no more than one hour, and must begin at 10:00 a.m., 2:00 p.m., or 7:00 p.m. ~~it shall not be held between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., or between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m., or between the hours of 3:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.~~
- (4) If more than one parade is to be held on the same calendar day and time, the parade routes and staging and disbanding areas of each parade may not be within five miles of one another.
- (5) No parade route shall contain any portion of the following streets, roads, or highways:
 - a. Interstate Highway 610 Loop, including its service roads.
 - b. U.S. Highway 59, including its service roads.
 - c. Interstate Highway 45, including its service roads.
 - d. U.S. Highway 290, including its service roads.
 - e. Interstate Highway 10, including its service roads.
 - f. State Highway 288, including its service roads.
 - g. Controlled access portions of U.S. Highways 90 and 90-A, including their service roads.
 - h. The Hardy Toll Road, including its service roads.
 - i. Beltway 8, including those portions known as the Sam Houston Toll Road, and its service roads.
 - j. State Highway 225, including its service roads.
 - k. Controlled access portions of State Highway 249, including its service roads.
 - l. State Highway Spur 5, including its service roads.
 - m. Westpark Toll Road.

This provision shall not be construed to prohibit a parade route from crossing one of the listed streets, roads, or highways while traveling along or upon a non-listed street, road, or highway.

Sec. 45-235. Permit application generally; issuance, etc.

(a) An application for a parade permit shall be submitted on a form supplied by the SEM, signed by the applicant or, if the applicant is other than an individual, a person authorized for that purpose by the applicant, ~~sworn to before an officer authorized to administer oaths~~, and filed with MOSE.

(b) An application for a parade permit shall be submitted not less than 10 business days prior to the proposed parade date. An application for a parade permit that requires the closure of a freeway entrance or exit ramp or any portion of a state-owned controlled access highway shall be filed not less than 90 days prior to the proposed parade date.

(c) The SEM shall review each application to ensure that the time, place, and manner of the proposed parade complies with the provisions of this division. Not later than the tenth business day after receipt of the application, the SEM shall:

- (1) Notify the applicant of the denial of the application if it is found to conflict with another parade already permitted for the same time, location, and date, or to be incomplete or to violate any provision of this Code, which notice shall set forth the reasons for the denial;
- (2) Issue a final permit as provided in section 45-243 of this Code if the applicant has satisfied all requirements of this division for the proposed parade; or
- (3) Issue a conditional permit, if additional requirements are to be satisfied in the future but within the time allotted by this division.

(d) The issuance of a conditional permit shall not authorize a parade applicant to conduct a parade at the requested time, place, or date and shall serve only to reserve the time, place, and date of the proposed parade route pending the applicant's timely satisfaction of all other requirements of this division applicable to the parade requested, including but not limited to the provision of required insurance, the payment of security and traffic control costs, or any other requirement.

(e) Each application for a parade permit must be accompanied by a non-refundable fee of \$250. All tendered fees must be in the form of a cashier's check or money order payable to the city.

(f) If at the time of submitting the parade application, a non-revenue-generating parade applicant is unable to pay the full amount of the permit application fee pursuant to

subsection (e), the fee shall be reduced to that amount the applicant is able to pay, provided the applicant submits a sworn affidavit, on a form provided by the city attorney, containing the following information:

- (1) A statement that the applicant and the group or organization on whose behalf the application is made are unable to pay the full amount of the permit fee for the parade; and
- (2) ~~A statement that the applicant and the group or organization on whose behalf the application is made have made diligent efforts to raise money to pay the permit fee; and~~
- (3) A statement of the exact amount the applicant and the group or organization on whose behalf the application is made are able to pay for the permit fee at the time the application is delivered to MOSE.

(g) Applications for parade permits shall be delivered to MOSE and may be delivered between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. except on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

(h) Applications for parade permits may be filed no earlier than the 365th day prior to the date of the requested parade, provided that if the 365th day falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, then the application may be filed no earlier than the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday. Prematurely filed applications, or applications that do not meet all requirements of this section, shall be of no force and effect and shall be returned to the applicant.

(i) The numbers of parade permits that may be issued shall be subject to the following limitations:

- (1) Only one permit shall be issued for a parade to be conducted in the downtown area on the same day;
- (2) Only four permits may be issued for parades to be conducted on the same calendar day in the city limits; and
- (3) Permits may not be issued for conflicting times. For purposes of this provision, parades are considered to be conflicting if their starting times are less than four hours apart; provided, however, the director, in conjunction with the police chief, may exercise professional judgment by waiving the aforementioned four-hour provision provided:
 - a. The proposed parades will not substantially disrupt the use of any street in and around the parade route's respective locations; and

b. The director and police chief:

- [1] Determine that their respective departments have the appropriate amount of city personnel and resources available to monitor the parades based upon the estimated number of parade participants; or
- [2] Approve a parade permit applicant's submitted security control and traffic control plans to hire and pay all personnel necessary to deploy security control and traffic control devices and services along the proposed parade routes.

(j) Parade permits shall be issued in the order in which completed applications that comply with all applicable requirements of this division are received by MOSE.

Sec. 45-236. Application information.

The application for a parade permit shall contain the following information:

- (1) The name, address, and telephone number of the applicant, as well as the name, address, and telephone number of the individual who will be on-site and in charge of conducting the parade for the applicant and will be responsible to city officials for ensuring that the parade is conducted in compliance with this division and other applicable laws.
- (2) The date requested for the parade and the time of day requested.
- (3) The estimated duration of the parade and proposed route thereof.
- (4) The estimated number of animals that will be used in the parade.
- (5) The estimated number of individual persons who will participate in the parade.
- (6) The estimated number, if any, of animals and riders, animal-drawn vehicles, floats, motor vehicles, motorized displays, and marching units or organizations, such as bands, color guards, and drill teams that will participate in the parade.
- (7) A statement that the individual submitting the application is fully authorized to act and contract for the applicant, together with documents satisfactory to the SEM showing the authority of such individual.
- (8) A provision, in a form approved by the city attorney, whereby the applicant

contracts and agrees to indemnify and hold the city harmless against liability for any and all claims, judgments, and associated expenses, for damage to property or injury to or death of persons arising out of or resulting from conduct of the parade proximately caused by or resulting from the acts or omissions of the applicant, association, organization, firm or corporation on whose behalf the application is made, or any person under their control, insofar as permitted by law.

- (9) If required by section 45-242 of this Code, either proof of the required insurance or a declaration that proof of insurance will be provided within the time set forth in that section.
- (10) A provision whereby the applicant and any other persons, associations, organizations, firms, or corporations on whose behalf the application is made agree to comply with any special or unusual requirements that may be imposed or created by virtue of the proposed nature or size of the parade.
- (11) A declaration as to the status of the parade as a revenue-generating or non-revenue-generating parade.
- (12) A declaration that the person conducting a parade prefers to either:
 - a. Provide all necessary security and traffic control services with non-city personnel; or
 - b. Reimburse the city for the provision of security and traffic control services as provided in section 45-232 of this Code.

Such declaration by the parade organizer shall be final.

- (13) A provision whereby the applicant agrees to modify the proposed parade route, subject to the review and written approval of the director and police chief, if:
 - a. The director and police chief determine that the time, route, or size of the proposed parade will substantially disrupt the use of any street that is ordinarily subject to significant traffic congestion;
 - b. The SEM is unable to secure the requisite approval of the use of any freeway entrance and/or exit ramps or any portion of a state-owned highway or road included in the proposed parade route; and/or
 - c. The director and police chief determine that the proposed parade will substantially affect the city's ability to deliver police, fire, and medical

emergency services to the proposed parade location and in the vicinity of the proposed parade location.

The applicant shall provide the requisite modified parade route not more than two calendar days after receipt of notice from the SEM.

- (14) A statement that the applicant agrees to provide any other information required by the SEM.

Sec. 45-237. When application for parade permit is deemed complete.

An application for a parade permit is deemed completed when the applicant has provided all of the information required in section 45-236 of this Code including proof of insurance and any additional information required by the SEM pursuant to items (9) and (14) of section 45-236 of this Code and paid any fees or reimbursements due to the city pursuant to this or any previous permit from the city.

Sec. 45-238. Reasons for denial of a parade permit.

(a) The SEM may deny a parade permit if the applicant has failed to meet all of the requirements for submitting an application for a parade permit.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), the SEM may deny a parade permit if, after reviewing the applicants' application:

- (1) The applicant demonstrates an inability or unwillingness to conduct a parade pursuant to the terms and conditions of this division;
- (2) The applicant demonstrates an inability or unwillingness to conduct a parade pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the parade permit application;
- (3) The applicant has failed to submit a timely parade permit application in accordance with section 45-235(b) of this Code;
- (4) The parade will significantly affect the ability of the city to render necessary services to its residents, based upon its equipment and personnel resources and other ongoing functions and responsibilities of its affected departments, including the police, fire, and public works and engineering departments; or
- (5) The applicant has been informed that the proposed parade route must be modified in accordance with item (13) of section 45-236 of this Code and the applicant fails to or refuses to modify the proposed parade route.

Sec. 45-239. Procedure upon permit denial.

The SEM shall notify the applicant of any permit denial, and the reasons therefore, by placing such notice in the United States mail, certified, return receipt requested within 10 working days of the date of the receipt of the application.

Such letter shall be addressed to the applicant at the address stated on the application. Any failure to give such notice of denial within the time limits prescribed in this section shall be deemed a granting of the permit as requested.

Sec. 45-240. Revocation of permit.

(a) A permit may be revoked if the SEM determines that:

- (1) A violation of any condition of the permit exists, including failure to obtain written approval for any security or other plans required under this Code or to implement any such plans;
- (2) The event poses an immediate threat to health or safety;
- (3) The event organizer or any person associated with the event has failed to obtain any other permit required pursuant to this Code or other applicable law;
- (4) The permit was issued in error or contrary to law;
- (5) The parade has changed from a parade that does not require insurance non-insurance to a parade one that requires insurance ~~or a non-revenue generating to a revenue-generating parade~~; or
- (6) The applicant demonstrates an inability or unwillingness to conduct a parade pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the parade permit application.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, notice of revocation shall be in writing and set forth specifically the reasons for the revocation.

(c) Any threat to health or safety requiring immediate revocation of a permit shall authorize the SEM or any other person authorized by the city to notify the event organizer verbally of such revocation.

(d) The appeal of a revocation shall be handled in the same manner and under the same time requirements as denials of permits.

Sec. 45-241. Appeal from permit denial.

(a) The decision of the SEM is final unless appealed under this section. An applicant may appeal the denial or revocation of a permit by filing a written request for a hearing with the SEM within 10 working days of the date of such denial. A hearing shall be conducted within 10 working days of the receipt of such request before a hearing committee, consisting of the director, the police chief, and the fire chief or the fire chief's designee. The city attorney or the city attorney's designee shall be present, in a non-voting capacity, to advise on any legal issue. It shall be the duty of the SEM to defend the decision during the hearing. Evidence on the matter shall be received in accordance with Rule 12 of section 2-2 of this Code. The hearing committee shall render a written decision on the matter within five working days of the date of the hearing and immediately provide a copy of such decision to the applicant.

(b) Upon receipt of the hearing committee's decision, the applicant may appeal such decision by giving written notice to the city secretary within five working days of the date of such decision. The city secretary and city agenda director shall arrange a date for the matter to be reviewed by the city council, at the next regularly-scheduled council meeting at which it is possible to give lawful prior notice of the matter after the receipt of the hearing committee's decision and the record required by Rule 12 of section 2-2 of this Code. The city secretary shall give written notice thereof to the applicant. The city council shall consider the appeal under the provisions of Rule 12. At the conclusion of the city council's review of the matter, the city council shall render a decision to grant or deny the requested permit, and such decision shall be final and exhaust the applicant's administrative remedies. If the foregoing time requirements appear inadequate to resolve the appeal prior to the date scheduled for the event, the burden shall be upon the applicant to expedite any filings required and to request a special city council meeting, which shall be granted if reasonable under the circumstances.

Sec. 45-242. Insurance.

(a) No final parade permit shall be issued by the SEM for a parade to include any number of animals, floats, or motorized vehicles unless the applicants shall have delivered to the SEM proof that the insurance required by this section has been obtained by the applicant. Proof of insurance required for a parade to include any number of animals, floats, or motorized vehicles shall be delivered to the SEM not less than 10 business days before the proposed parade date.

(b) Any applicant for a parade permit who fails to provide the requisite proof of insurance not less than 10 business days before the proposed parade date shall not be granted a final parade permit. Any conditional parade permit which may have been previously issued shall be revoked by operation of law.

(c) The proof of insurance required by this section for a parade to include any

number of animals, floats or motorized vehicles not subject to state safety responsibility laws shall consist of a current policy of commercial general liability insurance to include designated premises of the parade route, staging area, and disbanding area. The policy shall bear an endorsement for the contractually assumed liability as set forth in item (8) of section 45-236 of this Code. The required policy shall name the city as an additional insured and be issued by a carrier authorized or eligible to transact business in Texas. Each policy shall contain an endorsement that the issuer waives any claim or right of subrogation to recover against the city, its officers, agents, or employees.

The insurance shall contain policy limits of not less than the following:

- (1) Commercial general liability insurance with a minimum limit of:
 - a. For property damage, \$1,000,000.00 for each occurrence; and
 - b. For bodily injury or death, \$1,000,000.00 for each occurrence.
- (2) Automobile liability insurance, covering all owned, hired and non-owned vehicles with a minimum limit of bodily injury and property damage of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit.

(d) The proof of insurance required by this section for a parade to include motorized vehicles subject to state safety responsibility laws may be in the form provided in subsection (c) or alternatively consist of proof of compliance with state safety responsibility laws for each vehicle.

Sec. 45-243. Final permit.

A final permit shall be issued only when the applicant has provided all information, including proof of insurance and any additional information, required pursuant to section 45-236 of this Code.

Sec. 45-244. Parades exempt from permits.

(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of this division, no permit shall be required for a parade that meets all of the following restrictions:

- (1) The parade shall not contain more than 250 individuals nor more than 12 vehicles or animals.
- (2) The parade shall not contain any number of animals or vehicles that are not licensed to travel on public streets.
- (3) The parade route shall not exceed one mile in length, shall contain no

portion of a major thoroughfare or major collector street and may contain no streets located within the downtown area.

- (4) The parade shall comply with the time restrictions contained in subsection (b)(3) of section 45-234 of this Code, and shall take no longer than one hour to complete.
- (5) The parade sponsors shall provide necessary traffic control.

(b) The individual or group of individuals who intend to conduct a parade under this section shall provide written notice of the time, day, and place of the parade to the SEM by hand delivering the notice or by mailing the notice by certified mail to be received by MOSE not less than 10 ~~three~~ business days before the parade.

(c) The city shall not be responsible for providing police officers or other city employees to perform traffic control functions during a parade held under authority of this section.

Sec. 45-245. Staging and disbanding areas; other uses of public streets and sidewalks.

Consistent with traffic mobility and access considerations, the director and the SEM, in consultation with the chief of police, or the police chief's designee, may allow public streets to be used by parade permit holders as staging and disbanding areas for parades. The use of public streets and sidewalks for purposes other than staging or disbanding are subject to the regulations set forth in section 40-27 and sections 40-361 through 40-378 of this Code. The closure of freeway ramps associated with a parade requires the submission to the director of a signed and sealed traffic control plan and proof of compliance with all insurance requirements at least 90 days prior to the scheduled parade date.

Sec. 45-246. Regulations.

Consistent with the provisions of this division and other applicable laws, the SEM may issue regulations governing the issuance of parade permits and the conduct of parades. The regulations shall be subject to the approval of the city attorney. A copy of any regulations so promulgated shall be made available upon request in the SEM's office for inspection and for purchase at the copy fee provided by law.

City of Houston, Texas, Ordinance No. 2008-_____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE IX OF CHAPTER 45 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, HOUSTON, TEXAS, RELATING TO PARADES; CONTAINING FINDINGS AND OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE FOREGOING SUBJECT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2007, City Council took action by amending the City's parade regulations to better serve the interests of the citizenry while preserving the interests of individuals and organizations who wish to engage in such activities; and

WHEREAS, recent litigation has demonstrated that many of the City's Code of Ordinance provisions concerning the receipt and processing of parade permit applications are content-neutral, time, place, and manner regulations that are narrowly tailored to serve a significant government interest yet leave open ample alternative channels of communication; and

WHEREAS, the outcome of recent litigation suggests that the City's parade regulations should be further amended to better afford those citizens and organizations who wish to engage in such activities the opportunity to do so while ensuring that all provisions necessary for the successful administration of parade permit applications are narrowly tailored to serve a significant governmental interest containing reasonably specific and objective standards equally applicable to all those who wish to apply for a parade permit; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the findings contained in the preamble of this Ordinance are determined to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as a part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That the definitions of the terms *non-revenue-generating parade* and *revenue generating parade* in Section 45-231 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Non-revenue-generating parade means any parade for which no participation fee is charged or for which no cash is accepted or collected as sponsorship or in support of the proposed parade."

"Revenue-generating parade means any parade for which a participation fee is charged or for which any cash is accepted or collected as sponsorship or in support of the proposed parade."

Section 3. That Item (3) of Subsection (b) of Section 45-234 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(3) A parade held on a day other than a Saturday, Sunday, holiday, or special event holiday, must be completed in no more than one hour, and must begin at 10:00 a.m., 2:00 p.m., or 7:00 p.m."

Section 4. That Subsection (a) of Section 45-235 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) An application for a parade permit shall be submitted on a form supplied by the SEM, signed by the applicant or, if the applicant is other than an individual, a person authorized for that purpose by the applicant, and filed with MOSE."

Section 5. That Subsection (f) of Section 45-235 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(f) If at the time of submitting the parade application, a non-revenue-generating parade applicant is unable to pay the full amount of the permit application fee pursuant to subsection (e), the fee shall be reduced to that amount the applicant is able to pay, provided the applicant submits a sworn affidavit, on a form provided by the city attorney, containing the following information:

- (1) A statement that the applicant and the group or organization on whose behalf the application is made are unable to pay the full amount of the permit fee for the parade; and
- (2) A statement of the exact amount the applicant and the group or organization on whose behalf the application is made are able to pay for the permit fee at the time the application is delivered to MOSE."

Section 6. That Item (5) of Subsection (a) of Section 45-240 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(5) The parade has changed from a parade that does not require insurance to a parade that requires insurance; or"

Section 7. That Subsection (b) of Section 45-244 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) The individual or group of individuals who intend to conduct a parade under this section shall provide written notice of the time, day, and place of the parade to the SEM by hand delivering the notice or by mailing the notice by certified mail to be received by MOSE not less than 10 business days before the parade."

Section 8. That, if any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting this Ordinance that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness or invalidity of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 9. That there exists a public emergency requiring that this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.



MOTION by Council Member Khan that the recommendation of the Director of the Department of Public Works and Engineering, reviewed and approved by the Joint Referral Committee, on request from Dan Bankhead, Rey De La Reza Architects, Inc, on behalf of Houston Community College, for the abandonment and sale of Redwood Street from Palmetto Street to Rustic Lane, located in the Pecan Park Replat and Extension, out of the Jacob Thomas Survey, A-74, Parcels SY7-019 and VY7-031, be adopted as follows:

1. The City abandon and sell Redwood Street from Palmetto Street to Rustic Lane, in exchange for the conveyance to the City of a full-width utility easement, both located in the Pecan Park Replat and Extension, out of the Jacob Thomas Survey, A-74,
2. The applicant be required to a) eliminate the public street of Redwood Street by designing and constructing changes approved by the Traffic and Transportation Division, b) notify the City in writing of the completion of the abandonment and sale so the City can request CenterPoint Energy to remove power from the public street lights, and c) agree to privately fund one to three speed bumps on Palmetto Street, between Redwood Street and Garland Street, if residents on Palmetto Street petition the City, at any time up to three years after the effective date of the ordinance abandoning and actual closure of the street, for the placement of speed bumps, and the Traffic and Transportation Division deems the placement of speed bumps is prudent. All of the above mentioned matters must be accomplished at no cost to the City and under the proper permits;

3. The applicant be required to obtain a letter of no objection from each of the privately owned utility companies for the street right-of-way being abandoned and sold;
4. The applicant be required to furnish the Department of Public Works and Engineering with a durable, reproducible (Mylar) survey plat and field notes of the affected property;
5. The Legal Department be authorized to prepare the necessary transaction documents; and

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The applicant of the City's CDBG Fund and General Fund is SEARCH, INC (SEARCH), a private, nonprofit organization dedicated to helping homeless men, women and children get off the streets and into jobs and affordable housing.

SEARCH, Inc. has received funding through prior contracts with the City for its Mobile Outreach Program, which provided emergency assistance to individuals among Houston's homeless population living on the streets. Services provided have included the provision of bus tokens, lunches, clothing, blankets, Gold Cards for medical and dental assistance. Other services rendered have consisted of substance abuse counseling, HIV education and testing, job training, and transportation to appointments.

The agency now desires to continue its collaboration with the City through a new contract providing up to \$310,000 for one year of funding. This agreement will provide both CDBG and General Funds for SEARCH's program, which provides:

- (1) Mobile Outreach unit, the Resource Center and other services to persons with homelessness and their families using a flexible work schedule of seven hours a day and five days/week;
- (2) Psychiatric services and physical and mental health care for persons with homelessness through collaborative agencies;

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SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: The General Services Department (GSD) recommends that City Council approve a Professional Services Contract for Pre-Design Services with Gilbane Building Company to provide pre-design and programming services for the consolidation of three Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) facilities.

In February 2007, GSD produced a preliminary program report for the consolidation of three DHHS facilities: The Health and Human Services Administration Building located at 8000 North Stadium Drive, Braeswood Laboratory located at 1115 S. Braeswood, and the Pollution Control Offices and Laboratory located at 7411 Park Place. Co-location of these services on one campus will better serve the community and reduce operational costs.

DHHS has outgrown the space at 8000 North Stadium Drive and the Braeswood Laboratory facility is in very poor condition and requires major renovation to meet new code and other building requirements. Building energy operational costs are excessive due to outdated mechanical systems. Both the Administration Building and the Braeswood Laboratory are located within the Texas Medical Center area. Institutions within the Texas Medical Center have expressed an interest in acquiring the Braeswood facility. The Administration Building houses Vital Statistics on the first floor which has outgrown its space. The other floors house Health administration programs. This building is well located and should be easily sold. The Park Place facility will either be sold or retained for other City use.

On March 23 and March 30, 2007, GSD advertised a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Design/Build of a new facility to replace the three DHHS facilities for the FY07 Health Program. The RFQ contained selection criteria that ranked respondents on experience, technical approach, and quality assurance program. The Statements of Qualifications were due on April 23, 2007, and five firms responded. GSD formed a selection committee comprised of representatives from the DHHS, Convention and Entertainment and GSD to evaluate the respondents. The selection committee interviewed all five firms. Gilbane Building Company received the most points and offers the best value for the City based on the advertised criteria.







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SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: In 1996, the City of Houston approved and authorized the acceptance of an initial \$200,000.00 grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) for a Brownfields Assessment Demonstration Pilot Program. Under the terms of the City's cooperative agreement with the USEPA, the Brownfields Redevelopment Program (BRP) was established. The USEPA supplemented the existing grant with subsequent awards of \$200,000.00 in 1998 and \$200,000.00 in 2001. In 2005 an additional award was made by the USEPA to the City of Houston for \$400,000.00 for site assessments for the period of 2005 through September 30, 2007. The City of Houston Brownfields Program applied for an extension for a period of one year and the USEPA approved the extension and the new expiration date will be September 30, 2008.

Through the grant funding awarded to the BRP, free environmental assessments are made available to encourage the beneficial redevelopment of abandoned or underused contaminated properties. Since formation of the BRP, over 40 sites have enrolled in the Program through 2007. To date, sixteen sites have been redeveloped and more than 20 are currently in the process of assessment or redevelopment. The BRP program has worked with other internal and external departments and agencies that are purchasing land on behalf of the City of Houston for additional parks space for the growing Houston population. Both contractors, Terracon Consultants, Inc and Weston Solutions, Inc. have provided those assessments under contracts with the City of Houston for the Brownfield Redevelopment Program. The Brownfields Redevelopment Program is requesting to have both consultants continue the work through the life of the current grant which expires on September 30, 2008. We request the contract to reflect the terms of the grant expiration of September 30, 2008 and the work to continue with the current contractors if the City of Houston, Brownfields Program.

Two USEPA environmental assessment grants totaling \$400,000.00 were awarded to the City of Houston in late 2005. The life of the grants is from 2005 - 2008 with the extension period, and will expire on September 30, 2008. The first grant (No. BF-97699501-0) is in the amount of \$200,000.00 is for site assessments at petroleum-contaminated properties. The second grant (No. BF-97699601-0) is in the amount of \$200,000.00 is for site assessments at properties contaminated with hazardous substances.

These grant funds were the subject of an RFP process that resulted in the five-person contractor selection committee's recommendation that the City enter into a new contract with Terracon to continue work for up to \$100,000.00 in relation with petroleum site assessments and up to \$100,000.00 of work for hazardous substance site assessments, total contract not to exceed \$200,000.00. Similarly, the committee recommends that the City enter into a contract to continue work with Weston for up to \$100,000.00 in connection with petroleum site assessments and up to \$100,000.00 of work for hazardous substancesite assessments, total contract not to exceed \$200,000.00 Under the terms of the contracts, the consultants will continue to complete environmental site assessments on a task order basis.

Article IV of Chapter 47 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas (Houston Code) included provisions for City participation in the cost of the construction of water and sewer mains by a developer. In January, 2001, City Council amended Chapter 47 by approving Section 47-164 of the Code, providing for the City and a developer to enter into a cost-sharing agreement under which a developer of single family residences designs and constructs the mains necessary to serve the development (water and wastewater) and dedicates them to the City in exchange for 70% reimbursement of the construction cost and 100% of the design cost. The Ordinance also provides for the City to reimburse the developer 100% of the cost to design and construct storm water mains and appurtenances, up to a maximum of \$3,000.00 per lot, if the homes qualify as affordable housing (sell for less than the median price of a house in Houston). The Ordinance further allows the City to pay interest costs incurred by the developer. The developer will be reimbursed after 25% of the residences have been built. The developer has eighteen (18) months from the date of the contract to begin construction and three (3) years from the beginning of construction to complete the number of houses necessary for reimbursement. As of February, 2005, all 70% Developer Participation Contracts contain specific provisions to ensure that the projects will facilitate development of single-family, owner-occupied residences.

On October 13, 2004 Council approved a Developer Participation Contract between the City and 4468 W. Airport I, Ltd. to construct water lines, sanitary sewer lines and storm sewer lines in a 92-lot subdivision, Brentwood Village Section 1. The current Contract is now due to expire on July 21, 2008. However, because of financial market changes and the consequent inability of potential home buyers to secure home loans, the developer is requesting a 12-month extension to construct homes in the subdivision. This will extend the contract expiration date to July 21, 2009.
