




CULTURAL AFFAIRS FY17 Civic Art Activity Report

September 27, 2017



Introduction

The Mayor's Office of Cultural Affairs (MOCA) advances the Mayor's cultural priorities through the City's programs, partnerships and communications. It is the point of contact for many of the City's cultural strategies and implements the City's Arts and Cultural Plan, which was developed in coordination with the City's first General Plan. It highlights the local artist workforce through exhibitions in historic City Hall, oversees contracts for grants and cultural services and manages the City's Civic Art Program. MOCA also facilitates temporary art, art donations to the City Collection, community murals and special projects.



MOCA's new logo embodies our values and echos the vision of the cultural plan to foster an environment in which art and culture flourish for the sharing and benefit of all residents and visitors. The basket weave represents the inclusivity of Houston and MOCA's programming while referencing the kinetic energy of steam billowing from a train in motion. The earth tones in the palette of the weave represent Houston's diversity, which are woven together with jewel tones to illustrate Houston's vibrant and inclusive arts sector. The combination of the train and the weave hints at the integral relationship of Houston's industrial and arts sectors.

This annual report sets out the prior year's Civic Art Program activities and financial report. Budgets referenced in the project summaries are for the entire term of the project and likely encompass more than one year.

Civic Art Program - Fiscal Year 2017 Activity Report

The Civic Art Program is part of the City's capital asset investments and produces permanent visual artworks.

The City's Civic Art Ordinance appropriates 1.75 percent of design and construction costs on qualifying City Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) projects. The CIP is an annually updated five-year plan addressing the infrastructure needs of the City of Houston. Civic Art projects are generated through the CIP by nearly every City department, typically as part of the construction of new facilities and major expansion. The Civic Art appropriation is an amount equal to 1.75 percent of the amount appropriated by City Council for an eligible project and only applies to capital projects where funds are appropriated by City Council.

Civic Art Projects include paintings, murals, prints, drawings, photographs, videos, films, decorations, stained glass, statues, sculptures, monuments, fountains, arches or other structures of permanent character located on City property. Civic Art funds may also be used to restore existing art, but cannot be used for routine cleaning and maintenance.

In September 2016, MOCA completed an <u>evaluation</u> of the Civic Art Program which can be found on the MOCA section of the City website.

Fiscal Year 2017 yielded a total of 51 projects which include commissioned artworks, donated artworks and conservation projects. Project management was carried out under contract by Houston Arts Alliance (HAA). The summary of activity is as follows:

Commission of ten artist-designed wraps for parking meters between Taft and Downtown by Houston-based artist, Celan Bouilett. Inspired by travel, textiles and the location of the meters the designs for the parking meters incorporate natural elements from the Buffalo Bayou Park plants, animals, and rocks—into patterns resembling contemporary tapestries.

Candyland Landing & Celestial Candyland Artist: Jay Shinn HAS Intercontinental Airport District B Completed Budget: \$600,000

Two site-specific works combine twodimensional geometric patterns on the wall superimposed with a slow tempo of choreographed, color-changing pattern projections. The resulting "moiré effect" is a visual perception that occurs from the offset patterns, producing interesting and beautiful illusions from the shifting layers.

Howl Artist: Luis Jimenez HAS Hobby Airport District I Completed Budget: \$73,622

Acquisition of 1987 sculpture edition by the late New Mexico-based artist, Luis Jimenez, and fabrication of custom pedestal. After seeing an injured coyote on the side of the road the artist began to think of the animal as a symbol of determination and a progression of works combined the image of the coyote with that of the endangered Mexican wolf. Soaring in the Clouds Artist: Ed Wilson HFC GRB Convention Center District I Completed Budget: \$830,000

Soaring In The Clouds is the central artwork that hangs in the GRB atrium. The atrium is 90' high, while the artwork is 67' high and includes programmable theater lighting. The lighting of the piece at night provides a dramatic view from Discovery Green Park. Installation and dedication were in fall 2016.

Books of a Feather Artist: Dixie Friend Gay HPL Young Neighborhood Library District D In Progress Budget: \$200,000

Commission of outdoor sculpture consisting of three large scale birds made of steel and concrete ranging in size from 12 to 15 feet, covered with multi-colored tiles that shimmer and sparkle when caught by the light, as well as hand-made tiles stamped with

book titles that include words associated with birds and flight. The sculpture draws parallels between the physical flight of birds and the flights of imagination found in books.



Houston Oracle in Two Parts Artist: Stephen Korns PWE Bagby Underpass District I Completed Budget: 400,000

The Houston Oracle in Two Parts by sculptor Stephen Korns honors the

City's history while also improving the pedestrian experience in the downtown Theater District. Korns used photographs, video, sound, reclaimed materials and special lighting to turn the underpass into a multimedia work of art. Like the artist's signature Lunar Lighting project along Buffalo Bayou, the lighting for this new artwork changes nightly with the lunar cycle.






