**Mayor's Disability Advocate of the Year Award (MDAYA)**

The Mayor's Disability Advocate of the Year Award seeks to recognize and honor the contributions of advocates who, through their volunteerism in the community, have provided a notable effort towards one or more of the following:

- Increasing the awareness of disability issues in the nondisabled Houston community.
- Working towards the resolution of a barrier to people with disabilities.
- One whose voice has effectively represented those who cannot represent themselves.

Each year, three disability advocates from the City of Houston will be selected; one with a disability, one without a disability and one junior advocate. In addition to the two adult awards and one junior award, the MDAYA Selection Committee may, at its discretion, recognize a deceased individual with a posthumous award. The awards are based on the virtue and impact of their work using the following:

**Community Advocate (Disabled, Nondisabled and Posthumous)-** recognizes the outstanding volunteer efforts of an individual dedicated toward improving conditions and opportunities in the disability community. He/She should be a positive role model whose actions encourage others to follow in their footsteps. In addition to an application, nominations for this award must include a biography highlighting the services rendered by the nominee for which this award is to be presented.

**Youth Advocate** - recognizes a young person no older than 18 years of age for outstanding work in the community. This work should include selfless volunteer work exhibiting leadership qualities that will inspire our youth to become future leaders and advocates for the disability community. In addition to an application, nominations for this award must include a biography highlighting the services rendered by the nominee for which this award is to be presented.

**NOMINATION CRITERIA**

- An individual currently engaged in volunteer service that improves the quality of life of people with disabilities in Houston.
- Contribution and/or activity must have been performed in the greater Houston area for a minimum of one calendar year.
- Incomplete nominations will not be considered.
- Award recipients will be asked to attend a recognition event during Disability Awareness month at Houston's City Hall.
- Award recipients may be asked to do media interviews.
- Nominees are not eligible if they:
  - Are currently serving on the Houston Commission on Disabilities.
  - Are currently working in the Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities (MOPD).
  - Received the award within the last four years.
