





Care Team® members provide over 100,000 hours of service annually at no cost to clients and care partners.



Interfaith programs in most states have adopted the Care Team® model based upon educational presentations and publications describing the program. Interfaith CarePartners' program has received the Governor's and County Judge's Award for Volunteerism and a 1998 President's Service Award described as "the most prestigious award ever given for volunteer community service."
