| Nepal | Expiration Date June 24, 2018 SUMMARY: The Secretary of Homeland Security (Secretary) is extending the designation of Nepal for Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for a period of 18 months, effective December 25, 2016, through June 24, 2018. | Honduras | Expiration Date July 5th 2018 REGARDING HONDURAS, Acting Secretary Duke concluded that despite receiving input from a broad spectrum of sources, additional time is necessary to obtain and assess supplemental information pertaining to country conditions in Honduras in order to make an appropriately deliberative TPS designation determination. Based on the lack of definitive information regarding conditions on the ground compared to pre-Hurricane Mitch, the Acting Secretary has not made a determination at this time, thereby automatically extending the current TPS designation for Honduras for six months – through July 5, 2018. | Haiti | Expiration Date July 22nd 2019 Release Date: Jan. 18, 2018: Employment Authorization for Haitians with TPS Automatically Extended Until July 21, 2018 WASHINGTON—U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) announced that current beneficiaries of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) under Haiti's designation who want to maintain that status through the program's termination date of July 22, 2019, must re-register between Jan. 18, 2018, and March 19, 2018. | Yemen | Expiration Date September 3, 2018 EXTENSION OF DESIGNATION OF YEMEN FOR TPS: The 18-month extension of the TPS designation of Yemen is effective March 4, 2017, and will remain in effect through September 3, 2018. | El Salvador | Expiration Date September 9, 2019 The designation of El Salvador for TPS is terminated effective at 11:59 p.m., local time, on September 9, 2019.
