At 9:00 a.m. Mayor Turner called the meeting to order and Council Member Davis for the Invocation.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Turner stated that he hoped that everyone had a good Labor Day and with some sad news, vesterday the Houston Fire Department announced the death of Houston Fire Captain Tommy Searcy due to COVID-19 complications. He fought long and hard and he wants everyone to continue to lift up his family and the entire Houston Fire Department. Captain Searcy was diagnosed in August and passed away yesterday, he was an 18-year veteran of the Houston Fire Department and Chef Pena will let everyone know when the Funeral arrangements are announced and he asks the entire City to keep the Searcy Family in their thoughts and prayers. The City of Houston has lost 6 Municipal Employees and now 3 Firefighters to COVID-19 and we know the Virus is insidious, so it's important that everyone continue to follow the CDC Guidelines to help save lives and to stop the virus from spreading. Yesterday, the Houston Health Department reported 333 new positive cases of COVID-19, bringing the City's total to 6,2665 and 13 new reported deaths and keep that in mind that was the 2 day report because they didn't report on Labor Day. Mayor Turner stated that he has some good news, the City's positivity rate is down 6.6% and the goal is to be 5% and below and to keep it down. We are moving in the right direction, we just have to be very, very intentional in making that headway. He will say to them that the positivity rate within our hospitals, the TMC Hospitals as of this morning is 4.6% and now, they have to work very hard for the positivity rate in the overall community to reach 5% and below. He wants to remind everyone that the Houston Health Department is collaborating with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Rice University and Baylor College of Medicine to conduct a voluntary antibody testing survey to understand how many people in the City were previously infected with the virus that causes COVID-19 teams consisting of the Houston Health Department staff and Houston Fire Department paramedics will visit randomly selected homes across the Houston area asking household members to answer survey questions and provide a blood sample and he is encouraging them to participate if you are contacted. It's completely voluntary and if they choose to participate will provide virtual information and you can find more information at houstonemergency.org/covid-19.org.

Mayor Turner also stated that the City's and County's Rental Leases Program is still accepting applications through Baker Ripley Program is still accepting application. The City of Houston providing \$20 million and Harris County is providing about \$40 million in funding which will be distributed to participating landlords on behalf of eligible tenants, however they also hope to raise additional funds for renter of landlords that are not participating. Mayor Turner encourage people

who need help to contact Baker Ripley and leave their information even if their landlord isn't part of the program.

Mayor Turner stated that in regard to recycling the City of Houston recycling process partnership with FCC has been named the best U.S. Recycling Facility of the Year 2020 by National Waste and Recycling Association. The Facility is in District B and the Facility open in April 2020. Mayor Turner will be distributing a new release later this morning with more information.

With the Census, September 30, 2020 is a critical date, at least for now to respond to the Census and this is the last month, he wanted to remind everyone to please fill out the Census. He enjoyed the Census car parade which was with Council Member Gallegos on Saturday and it went extremely well and he looks forward to another Census Car Parade with District J this coming Saturday and there are others that are in the Third Ward area as well.
