Robinson, Michael Kubosh and Sallie Alcorn; Randy Zamora, Legal Department and Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director, present. Council Members Abbie Kamin and Letitia Plummer out on Personal business.

At 1:33 p.m., Mayor Turner called the meeting to order and recognized Council Member Knox for the first presentation.

The Houston City Council reconvened at 9:00 a.m., Wednesday, November 9, 2022, with Mayor Sylvester Turner presiding with Council Members Amy Peck, Tarsha Jackson, Abbie Kamin, Carolyn Evans-Shabazz, Dave Martin, Tiffany Thomas, Mary Nan Huffman, Karla Cisneros, Robert Gallegos, Edward Pollard, Martha Castex-Tatum, Mike Knox, David W. Robinson, Michael Kubosh, Letitia Plummer and Sallie Alcorn; Arturo Michel, City Attorney, Legal Department and Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director, present.

At 9:11 a.m., Mayor Turner called the meeting of the Houston City Council to order.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Turner stated on yesterday, the City of Houston employee who lost his life was George Osorio, who worked for the Houston Parks and Recreation Department. He was killed in a tragic work-related incident at Melrose Park and according to Director Allen, Mr. Osorio had been with the Parks and Recreation Department for two (2) years as an electrician. He was a dedicated employee who went above and beyond to help with various projects. He does want to extend, on behalf of the City of Houston, his prayers to Mr. Osorio's family and co-workers.

The elections are now over. The City of Houston bonds passed. So, funding for such items as Police and Fire vehicles, Parks Department, Solid Waste and the Library Departments, as well as the new animal shelter for BARC, will be moving forward.

Mayor Turner wants to congratulate the University of Houston (Central Campus) for winning the Mayor's Early Vote Challenge. They had over 4,800 college students who voted on their campus.

The Astros parade was simply phenomenal. More people attended this year than in 2017. He wanted to give special acknowledgements to Special Events Director Susan Christian and her team, as well as everybody they had working with them. Mayor Turner wanted to give a great deal of credit to HPD, Fire Department, Houston Public Works and municipal employees because they were putting the rails up and down Smith Street. He wants to thank the Astros, Jim Crane and his organization for making it happen. He is so proud of Dusty Baker and happy for him.

Mayor Turner stated as grand as that parade was on Monday, Friday is coming. Veteran's Day is Friday and the program starts at 10:00 a.m. at City Hall with the parade immediately after. He is asking the city employees to show up at 10:00 a.m. for the program. He is asking again for Houstonians to really come out on Friday to be a part of the Veterans parade. Let's show up for the Veterans and their families.

This is an incredible time to be a Houstonian. The Houston Open is this week. The Cadence Bank Houston Open will be at Memorial Park. They start playing tomorrow through Sunday. For those who are interested in going, to please let them know.
