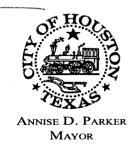

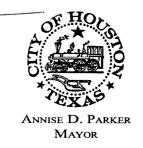

TRA FY2011 Budget

Attached for your review is TRA's FY10 Budget vs. FY11 Budget Cost Analysis. TRA has shown restraint and fiscal discipline by presenting a new budget for FY11 that is approximately 5.5 percent less than FY10. The Public Utilities and Resource Management Divisions met with TRA representatives to review every line item to ensure appropriateness and reasonableness in budgeting costs to support the operation and maintenance of Lake Livingston and the Dam, as well as the Wallisville Reservoir.

Total variance for FY11 is \$236,300 less than FY10. TRA did not include any salary increases in the new budget. Major budget variances occurred in Engineering and at Wallisville. The reductions are not driven by cutting services; instead, it is due to reductions in requirements and has no effect on the ability to maintain the same quality of service and product.

Engineering (-\$50,000)

This category is \$50,000 less in FY11 due to conducting less Water Availability/Inflow Studies for Lake Livingston. Previous years' studies and remedial work has been effective in locating and correcting polluting inflow water sources. As future conditions change, increased studies may be necessary. The cost savings reflect a reduction in requirements necessary to maintain the high water quality flow into Lake Livingston.

Wallisville Reservoir (-\$144,000)

Wallisville was hit very hard by hurricane Ike in 2008, and there was considerable debris damage to facilities and the environment. The reduction in O&M of \$144,500, from \$628,500 to \$484,000 in FY11, reflects the scaled-down cleanup effort. These costs are set by the U.S. Corps of Engineers, who have authority over the reservoir and surrounding marsh lands. Public Utilities leadership visited Wallisville in May 2010, and toured the facilities to view the cleanup effort and the capital improvements made to the gates and locks. The cost savings reflect a reduction in requirements.

Administrative Overhead (-\$35,760)

Overhead is lower as a result of the O&M budget reduction. The overhead calculation has been reviewed by Public Utilities and Resource Management recently and deemed fair and reasonable.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

Lake Livingston is the largest single-purpose water supply lake in Texas. It has approximately 83,000 surface acres, 450 miles of shoreline, and is located in parts of Trinity, Polk, Walker, and San Jacinto counties. It has the capacity to store 1.75 million acre feet of water. The Wallisville Saltwater Barrier Project is a Corps of Engineers multi-purpose project located in Chambers County. The Project's dependable water supply was purchased by TRA and the City of Houston as local sponsors. Houston owns 70 percent of the dependable water supply yield of the Livingston-Wallisville Projects and the Authority owns the remaining 30 percent. The Authority's Huntsville, Livingston, and Trinity County Regional Water Supply Systems draw raw water from Lake Livingston.

WORK PROGRAM

There will be thirty-one (31) personnel employed at this project for FY 2011. The project is managed by one (1) Project Manager who is responsible for all aspects of the operation of the system. The activities of the project are carried out by a staff of twenty-six (26) full time employees and four (4) part-time/seasonal employees. Operation, maintenance and administrative responsibilities are as follows:

Operations

Operations responsibilities include:

- A. Maintain a complete record of all expenditures and receipts in accordance with the Authority's fiscal control policies.
- B. Utilize current information technology to maintain a close liaison with the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, the National Weather Service, and the U. S. Geological Survey to be aware continually of upstream discharges, adverse weather conditions, and stream flow in the basin and provide discharges in accordance with stream requirements and standard operating procedures.
- C. Utilize an automated system of rain gauges in strategic locations around the reservoir to support operations and make this data available to the National Weather Service.
- D. Maintain surveillance of Project properties, including approximately 83,000 surface acres of the Lake and its 450 miles of shoreline.
- E. Complete daily visual inspections of the 2.25 mile earthen embankment, the outlet works, gated spillway, and weir structure to determine any changes occurring.
- F. Monitor the piezometers contained within the earthen embankment monthly to be aware of underground conditions beneath the embankment. Transmit monthly piezometric data to Independent Consulting Engineer for evaluation. Maintain yearly collections of operational, inspection, and measurement data for analysis by consulting engineer during comprehensive evaluations.
- G. Perform a routine sampling program to closely monitor the water quality of the reservoir, its tributaries, and the Lower Trinity Basin, in coordination with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's Clean Rivers program.
- H. Closely monitor sewage treatment plant discharges into the reservoir and its tributaries in accordance with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality guidelines.
- Maintain laboratory facilities in order to perform the necessary chemical and biological analysis as required by the Texas Department of State Health Services, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and routine monitoring program.
- J. Coordinate all aquatic vegetation control measures in conjunction with the Maintenance Work Program.
- K. Continue assisting Texas Parks and Wildlife Department in Striped Bass procurement.

Maintenance

Maintenance responsibilities include:

- A. Maintain a continual painting program on all painted surfaces of the gates, spillway and associated control works, the outlet tower, and the buildings of the Projects.
- B. Maintain all vehicles and equipment in first-class working order in accordance with preventative maintenance schedules.
- C. Maintain riprap along the 2.25 mile embankment as well as below the gated spillway and outlet works.
- D. Maintain downstream embankment by routine mowing, irrigation and slide repair.
- E. Coordinate aquatic vegetation control, particularly water lettuce and water hyacinth where necessary to assist navigation.
- F. Monitor horizontal and vertical control monuments along the embankment and structures to determine any changes occurring.
- G. Maintain approximately 260 acres of grounds, 2.25 miles of paving and 1 mile of shoreline.
- H. Monitor upstream rip rap cover for slippage or exposure of earthen embankment.

<u>Administration</u>

Administration responsibilities include:

- 1. Administration of Permit and Licensing Program.
 - A. Administer Texas Commission on Environmental Quality regulations for approximately 9,000 on-site sewage disposal systems to ensure the health and well being of the general public.
 - Perform site inspections for private on-site wastewater disposal systems in the designated Water Quality Zone and make inspections of all private facilities.
 - C. Maintain local enforcement of Texas Commission on Environmental Quality regulations and TRA ordinances. Assist the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality in any enforcement activities related to the Texas Water Quality Act and Chapter 341 of the Health and Safety Code.
 - D. Provide information and guidance to the public that will make it aware of the possible sources of pollution and strive to obtain cooperation and support of pollution control programs.

2. Security

Increase security of the Project and protection of the public in the vicinity of the dam, utilizing barriers, surveillance equipment, and security personnel.

3. Wallisville

Make annual payments to the U.S. Government for the TRA/Houston share of principal and interest, and for a portion of the Corps operation and maintenance expense at Wallisville.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

\$1,338,005.55 from the Water and Sewer System Operating Fund (8300)

This is a Request for Council Action (RCA) to authorize payment of an invoice received from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for the annual Consolidated Water Quality (CWQ) fee that applies to the City of Houston's wastewater treatment plants.

The current invoice covers the period from September 1, 2010 to August 31, 2011 corresponding to TCEQ's fiscal year FY11. The annual assessment is based on the permitted flow and pollutants for each wastewater treatment plant. The fee rate schedule is found in TCEQ's regulations, - Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Chapter 21: Water Quality Fees, Section 21.3. Fee Assessment.

The revenue resulting from the Consolidated Water Quality fee pays TCEQ's expenses to inspect wastewater treatment facilities and to enforce the provisions of the Texas Water Code. It also funds comprehensive monitoring of water quality for each river basin, conducted under the Texas Clean Rivers Program.

The attached invoice reflects a fee increase by the TCEQ as a result of: 1) Kingwood West WWTP becoming a major treatment plant (over 1.0 MGD); and 2) an adjustment, based on the Consumer Price Index, of the statutory cap set in the Texas Water Code for the Water Use Assessment Fee and the Consolidated Water Quality Fee from \$100,000.00 to \$102,000.00, which affected five wastewater treatment facilities. The fee was increased from \$1,320,929.35 to \$1,338,005.55.

Recommend that Council approve the Department of Public Works and Engineering's request to pay TCEQ the invoiced amount of \$1,338,005.55.

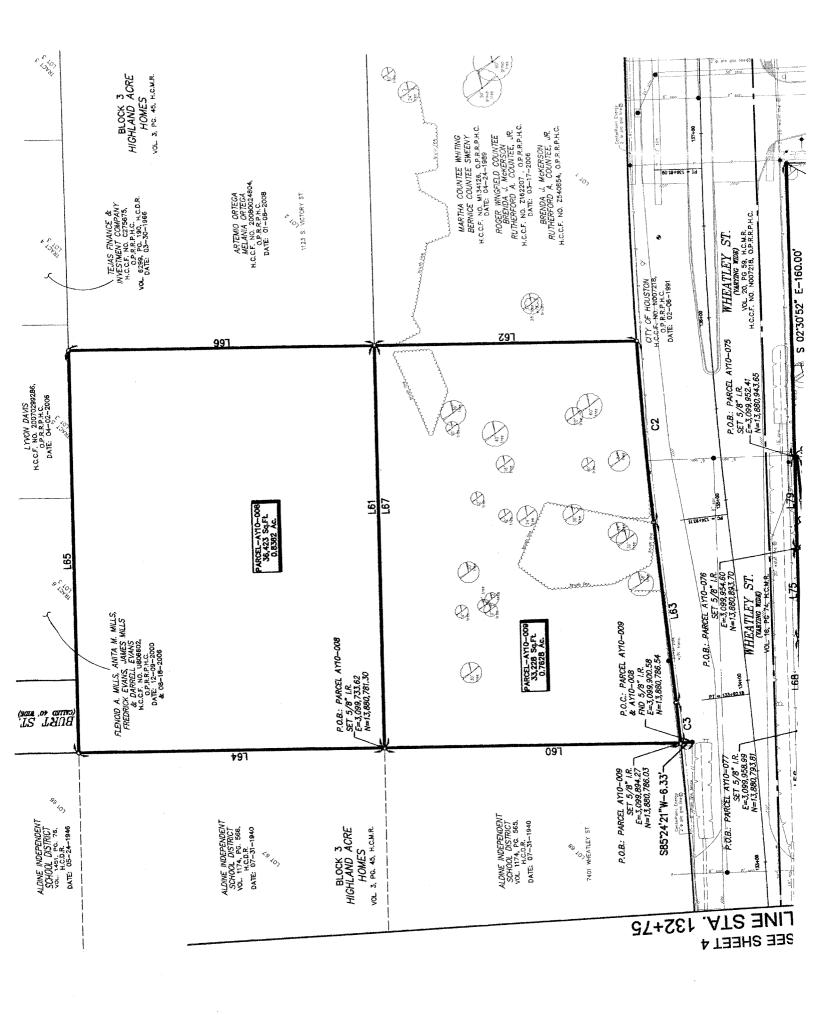


PARCEL MAP

The City Purchasing Agent recommends that City Council approve an ordinance authorizing the appropriation of \$336,500.00 out of the Equipment Acquisition Consolidated Fund (Fund 1800) for the Houston Fire Department. It is further recommended that City Council amend Council Motion No. 2010-0015, passed January 13, 2010 to purchase ten additional ambulance cabs & chassis (vehicles) for a total increase of \$336,500.00 for the Houston Fire Department and that authorization be given to issue a purchase order to the awarded supplier, Knapp Chevrolet, Inc. These emergency vehicles will be used citywide by Department personnel for delivery of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to the citizens of Houston and will be used 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The funding for these ambulance cabs & chassis is included in the adopted Equipment Acquisition Plan.

In October of 2009, as a result of advertising this bid in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas bid laws, bids were received from three suppliers. The bid document included a provision that allows the City to purchase additional vehicles through January 13, 2011 provided the awarded supplier agrees to honor the original bid price. Knapp Chevrolet, Inc. has agreed in writing to honor its original unit bid price of \$33,650.00

These vehicles will come with a full three-year/36,000 miles bumper-to-bumper warranty and a five-year/100,000 miles warranty on the power train, and the life expectancy is three years or 100,000 miles. The vehicles that will be purchased will meet the EPA's current emission standards for low emission vehicles. See the attached Equipment usage Summary for vehicle usage and replacement details.

The Director of the Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that City Council approve an Ordinance to create the BARC Special Revenue Fund. The BARC Special Revenue Fund presents a strategic opportunity to increase private sector support of the BARC facility, which will allow the shelter to continue on its improved trajectory and expand programs. The BARC Special Revenue Fund will provide assurance to current and potential donors that contributions made to the facility will directly benefit BARC animals and BARC programs to reduce the impact homeless animals have on Houston communities.

ARA's research indicates that segregating animal control and shelter donation revenue from other cities' General Funds is critical to significantly increase donation revenue. In the course of BARC's enhanced public outreach, multiple animal welfare and advocacy stakeholder groups have communicated to ARA that efforts to access significant unexploited private funding capacity are stunted by the fact that funds donated to the shelter facility are not dedicated exclusively to improving the lives of animals in BARC's care. These local observations reinforce the findings of ARA's research into shelter operations and funding in other cities.

ARA has laid the foundation for a robust infrastructure to increase donation revenue from the private sector, in both small and large increments. The new BARC website, which went live on October 18, features a "donation button" and dedicated site at which individual visitors may donate to the shelter. ARA will also recommend to City Council that the City establish the Houston BARC Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization which will spearhead fundraising for the shelter and programs. Similar organizations such as the Parks Board have proven the potential of this relationship.

This ordinance will accomplish the transfer of \$6,121,549.00 from ARA General Fund accounts to the Fund. The transfer amount will establish the BARC Special Revenue Fund, which shall also be authorized to receive funds from any source for the purpose of supporting the maintenance and operation of BARC shelter facilities and programs. ARA will retain operational and budget responsibility for BARC as a division within the department.

The changes were codified in Chapter 283 of the Texas Local Government Code, with additional amendments in 2005 and 2007. Chapter 283 specifies that although the City continues to have the authority to require construction, inspection and other related permits from CTPs, the City is prohibited from imposing a fee for the permits.

ARTICLE XIV. GRANT OF PRIVILEGES TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS PROVIDERS TO PLACE TELECOMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES ACROSS, ALONG OR UNDER PUBLIC WAYS

Sec. 40-331. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following words and terms shall have the meanings provided below, unless the context of their usage clearly indicates another meaning:

Access line means a unit of measurement representing (1) each switched transmission path of the transmission media within the public way extended to the end-user customer's premises network interface within the city that allows delivery of services within the city; (2) each termination point or points of a non-switched telephone or other circuit consisting of transmission media connecting specific locations identified by, and provided to, the end-user for delivery of non-switched services within the city; or (3) each loop provided to any person used for the provision of services. Interoffice transport and other transmission media that do not terminate at an end-use customer's network interface device are not access lines that would be separately identified and counted.

Cable services shall have the meaning defined for such term in the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, 47 U.S.C. § 521 et seq., as amended.

City engineer means the city engineer for the city or a designee thereof.

<u>CPI-U</u> means the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (U.S. City Average, all items).

Director means the director of the city's department of administration and regulatory affairs department, or another person such director may its successor department, including the director's designatee.

Director of public works and engineering means the director of the city's public works and engineering department, or its successor department, including the director's designee.

Grantee means the grantee under a right-of-way ordinance.

<u>Line f</u><u>F</u>ee means the fees <u>payable to the city by a telecommunications</u> <u>provided for payment by a grantee provider as provided in subject to this article.</u>

Network facilities means conduits, ducts, manholes, vaults, tanks, towers, wave guides, optic fiber, microwave, dishes, and any associated converters,

electrical lines, communications lines, transmission lines, cables, wires, amplifiers, switches, utility equipment, or other such object, device or facilities, including attachments and encasements containing such facilities, whether underground or overhead, which that are designed, installed and constructed within the public way for the purpose of producing, receiving, amplifying, switching, transmitting or distributing audio, video, or other forms of electronic or optical signals to or from customers, subscribers or locations within the city limits of the city in providing services. Network facilities do not include such facilities to the extent that they are solely used to provide cable services or security monitoring services under Chapter 283 of the Texas Local Government Code or services under Chapter 66 of the Utilities Code or respective successor laws.

<u>Network facilities franchise means an ordinance adopted pursuant to this article granting a telecommunications provider authority to use the public way as provided therein.</u>

<u>Payment date means January 1 of each year during the term of a network facilities franchise.</u>

Public way means property of the city and/or public grounds or any public street rights-of-way located in the city; including the entire area between the boundary lines of every way-right-of-way (including but not limited to roads, streets, alleys, highways, boulevards, bridges, tunnels or similar thoroughfares, and public utility easements) held by the city, whether acquired by purchase, grant; or dedication and acceptance by the city; or by the public, that has been opened to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel; and shall include any designated state or federal highway or road or any designated county road under the administrative control of the city for maintenance, repair, or vehicular traffic control purposes. The term public way shall also include the entire area within the boundary lines of every stream, lake, river, bayou, creek, ditch or other body or course of water that is owned by the city, dedicated to or open to the use of the public, or maintained by the city.

Right-of-way ordinance means an ordinance adopted pursuant to this article granting a telecommunications provider authority to make use of the public ways as provided therein.

Services means telecommunication services provided by a grantee through its network facilities, excluding cable services, but including without limitation (a) access lines provided to end users or to other telecommunications companies for the purpose of voice, data or non-cable video transmission; (b) the provision of non-switched telephone circuits consisting of transmission media connecting specific locations identified by, and provided to, the end-user for delivery of non-switched services within the city; (c) the provision of switched access lines for the distribution

of voice, data and non-cable video transmission; or (d) any other telecommunication services authorized by State or Federal located wholly or partially in the public way without regard to technology. This definition does not include services provided under Chapter 283 of the Texas Local Government Code or under Chapter 66 of the Texas Utilities Code or any respective successor law.

Private or commercial purposes means any purposes, other than public purposes.

Telecommunications provider means a person who of fers <u>or provides</u> services to customers through network facilities located <u>wholly or partially</u> in the public ways.

Sec. 40-332. Declaration of policy.

- (a) It shall be The policy of the city regarding to granting the right to any person the right to lay, construct, operate, lease or make any use whatsoever of any network facility for private or commercial purposes, across, along, over, above or under any public way within the city is stated in accordance with this article. Except as otherwise specifically provided, this article shall be administered by the director.
- (b) It is not the policy or intention of this article to prohibit, regulate, license or franchise the provision of any services within the city, and no provision of this article shall be so construed: Aany terms or conditions contained in this article or any right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise relate to the rights of a person to make use of the public ways, not in limitation of any rights granted by the Texas Public Utility Commission of Texas, the Federal Communications Commission, or their successors respective successor agency.

Sec. 40-333. Rights to be granted by ordinance franchise.

As provided by sections 17 and 18 of article II of the city charter, the rights referred to in section 40-334 of to be granted under this Code article shall only be granted by ordinance a network facilities franchise passed in the manner, with the formalities, and subject to all of the applicable terms and conditions stated in those sections that section of the charter.

Sec. 40-334. Network facilities required to be authorized.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person telecommunications provider to lay, construct, operate, offer for lease or make available for any use whatsoever of any network facilities across, along, over, above, or under any public way within the limits of the city for any private or commercial purpose unless the right to do so has been granted to such

personthe telecommunications provider by a right-of-way ordinancenetwork facilities franchise in accordance with this article.

- (b) A persontelecommunications provider desiring a right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise shall make written application upon a form promulgated by the director on which. The applicant shall be set forth upon the application a detailed description of existing or proposed network facilities, along with including the proposed number of linear feet and location thereof, the nature of the business or use to be transacted in the public way and such other information as may be required by the director, under the charter or any other city ordinance, sufficient to enable the director to determine the advisability of granting a right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise and to establish the capacity of the applicant applicant's capacity to meet its financial or other obligations thereunder.
- (c) A right-of-way ordinance shall network facilities franchise shall authorize the specific use that the granteetelecommunications provider shall be permitted to make of the public ways. No facility shall be located, or made use of, operated or used in any public way in a manner not expressly stated in the right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise. No right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise shall be construed to grant access to city land owned in fee simple, other than streets or thoroughfares the public way, unless specifically included therein. No grantee telecommunications provider shall make any use of a public way or allow any other person to make use of the grantee's its network facilities located in a public way, that is not unless stated in the grantee's right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise. A grantee telecommunications provider shall not permit any other person to make locate, operate or use of the grantee's provider's network facilities in the public ways without demonstration proof that the person is authorized to make holds authorization for the contemplated location, operation, or use by under any required right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise duly granted pursuant to this section by the city and that the person holds a permit for the construction issued in accordance with this article. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a right-of-way ordinance a network facilities franchise is not required for any person engaging solely in resale of a grantee's telecommunications provider's services or the provision of service by unbundled network elements obtained from a grantee telecommunications provider, provided that the applicable right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise covers the network facilities involved and the person does not own or operate any network facilities in the public ways.
- (d) This article shall not apply to any telecommunications provider already specifically franchised by the city on the effective date of this ordinance; provided that upon the termination of such franchise, the telecommunications provider shall be subject to this article hereto in the same manner as any other telecommunications provider. In addition, Nothing in this article shall be construed to diminish the right or authority ability of the city to require any other user of the public ways to secure appropriate city authorization for such use, including without limitation cable services providers, or security monitoring services.

Sec. 40-335. Right-of-way ordinance Network Facilities Franchise fees.

- (a) Statement of policy. The fee compensation to be paid under any right-of-way ordinance in which the grantee provides access lines shall be determined under this section. Each year, the director shall determine the total annual amount of compensation payable cumulatively from all such grantees, based on the total number of linear feet of public ways occupied by a telecommunications providers that have facilities in the public ways within the city, then convert the amount into monthly line fees payable by each grantee as provided in this section. The compensation to be paid by grantees not providing any access lines are not covered by this section and provider subject to this article under any network facilities franchise shall be determined by the director and approved by ordinance by city council, in accordance with applicable law in a competitively neutral manner by the director and set forth in a network facilities franchise approved by city council.
- (b) Total annual amount of compensation payable. The total annual amount of compensation payable by all grantees cumulatively shall be based on the total number of linear feet of the public way occupied by all telecommunications providers within the corporate limits of the city multiplied by an amount per linear foot. The amount per linear foot shall be: \$1.18 for the 12-month period beginning October 1, 1998; \$1.32 for the 12-month period beginning October 1, 2000; and \$1.60 for the 12-month period beginning October 1, 2001. For the 12-month period beginning October 1, 2002, and each subsequent 12-month period thereafter, the amount per linear foot shall be adjusted by multiplying the linear foot rate for the period beginning October 1, 2001, by a growth factor. The growth factor shall be calculated by dividing the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (U.S. City Average, all items) (CPI-U) for the month of March immediately preceding the anniversary of the effective date of this ordinance by the CPI-U in effect for the month of March 2002.
- (1) No later than August 1 of each year, each grantee shall file <u>a report</u> with the city secretary, on a form promulgated by the director, the total number of linear feet of public way which it occupied within the city as of June 30 of the previous year.
- (2) If the number of linear feet related to a grantee cannot be precisely determined, the director will determine a reasonable method of estimating the number of linear feet and that method shall be delineated in the grantee's right-of-way ordinance. The information required by the right-of-way ordinance to derive the estimate shall be filed with the city secretary no later than August 1 of each year.
- (b) With each annual fee remittance, a telecommunications provider shall file a report with the city secretary and the director on a form promulgated by the director showing in detail the calculation of the fee for the preceding calendar year. An officer or

authorized representative of the telecommunications provider shall certify that the information contained in the report is true and correct (to the best of the officer's or representative's knowledge and belief) after due inquiry. The report shall be treated as confidential information to the extent permitted by law. Upon written request by the director, a telecommunications provider shall verify the information contained in its report, and upon 30 days advance written notice, all non-customer specific records and other documents required for verification shall be subject to inspection by the director, expressly excluding any records, documents, or other writings the disclosure of which is prohibited by state or federal law, including the Electronic Communications Privacy Act, 18 U.S.C. Sec. 2701, et. seq. Upon receipt of any such request, the telecommunications provider shall promptly designate or identify the specific information proposed to be withheld and the law supporting or authorizing its non-disclosure.

- (c) Monthly line fees. Each grantee shall remit to the city the total annual amount of compensation payable pursuant to a line fee for each access line activated at month-end for use by an end use customer of the grantee or activated for the end use customer of another person that uses the grantee's network facilities for the provision of telephone or other service located within the city; provided that grantees shall not be obligated to pay the city for any access lines for which revenues remain uncollectible.
- (c) Payment due date. Each telecommunications provider shall remit fees on an annual basis. Payment shall be made on or before the payment date.
- (1) For the 12-month period beginning October 1, 1998, monthly line fees shall be:
 - \$ 1.34 for residential access lines
 - \$ 4.55 for non-residential access lines
 - \$ 14.50 for each termination point of a non-switched telephone or other circuit consisting of transmission media connecting specific locations identified by, and provided to, the end-user for delivery of non-switched services within the city.
 - (2) For each subsequent 12-month period, the monthly line fees shall be recalculated pursuant to the applicable linear foot charge stated in subsection (b), the number of linear feet as of June 30 and the number of access lines as of June 30, adjusted by an amount of over- or under-collection pursuant to subsections (c)(3) and (4) below.
- (3) The amount of over- or under-collection for the nine month period beginning October 1, 1998, shall be computed by subtracting the compensation collected for the nine month period beginning October 1, 1998, from 75

percent of the total amount of compensation payable for the 12-month period beginning October 1, 1998, based on the amount per linear foot set forth in subsection (b) above, multiplied by the total number of linear feet as of June 30, 1998. The over- or under-collection amount shall be added to the compensation payable for the 12-month period beginning October 1, 1999, calculated pursuant to subsection (b) above.

- (4) The amount of over- or under-collection for the 12-month period beginning July 1, 1999, shall be computed by subtracting the compensation collected for the 12-month period beginning July 1, 1999, from the total amount of compensation payable for the 12-month period beginning July 1, 1999, based on the amounts per linear foot set forth in subsection (b) above multiplied by the total number of linear feet as of June 30, 1999. The over-or under-collection amount shall be added to the compensation payable for the 12-month period beginning October 1, 2000, calculated pursuant to subsection (b) above. The amount of over- or under-collection for subsequent 12-month periods shall be determined by repeating the process described in this subsection.
- (5) With each quarterly remittance, all grantees shall file a report on a form promulgated by the director showing the number of access lines at the end of each month in the quarter that the grantee provided that are used to serve premises within the city. Such report shall specifically identify access lines owned, operated or maintained by the grantee that are leased and/or used by persons who are not end use customers. Such report shall show the number of access lines by category, to the extent known, as set forth in item (1), above. The report shall be used solely for the purposes of verifying the number of the grantee's access lines serving premises within the city.
- (6) For purposes of this section only, lines terminating at customers with "Lifeline," "Tel-Assistance," or other service that is similarly discounted for the purpose of advancing universal service to the economically disadvantaged shall not be included in the count of access lines upon which the line fee is remitted.
- (7) With respect to any person leasing, reselling, or otherwise using grantee's access lines, if the grantee does not have sufficient information to determine the appropriate rate to apply, then the higher line fee shall apply until such time as the person using the access lines provides to the grantee sufficient written information to determine the correct line fee.
- (d) Reports and records. The forms required to be filed in subsection (a), (b), and (c) shall each be accompanied by a certified statement from an authorized officer or duly authorized representative of the telecommunications provider stating that the information

contained in the report is true and correct to the best of the officer or representative's knowledge and belief after due inquiry. A copy of the completed forms and the accompanying certified statements filed with the city secretary shall be provided to the director. The forms provided shall be treated in the same manner as provided for the disclosure of confidential information in the applicable right-of-way ordinance. Upon written request, telecommunications providers shall verify the information contained in the forms and, upon reasonable advance notice, all non-customer specific records and other documents required for verification shall be subject to inspection by the city, expressly excluding any records, documents, or other writings the disclosure of which is prohibited by state or federal law, including the Electronic Communications Privacy Act, 18 U.S.C. Sec. 2701, et. seq.

- (e) Notification of line fees. The city will provide to grantees in writing the adjusted line fees calculated pursuant to this section on or before September 1 of each year. The adjusted line fees shall be implemented by grantees effective October 1 of each year. All grantees are responsible for obtaining or verifying the adjusted line fees, and the failure of any grantee to receive the written notice described herein shall not affect the obligations of the grantee to remit the proper line fees.
- (f) Payment due date. Each grantee shall remit fees on a quarterly basis together with the certified statement required in subsection (d). Payment shall be made on or before the 45th day following the close of each calendar quarter for which the payment is calculated and shall be paid by wire transfer to an account designated by the director. Upon showing of good cause, this wire transfer requirement may be waived by the director. Late payments Fees that are not received by the city by the payment date shall incur interest beginning on the date the payment is due at the rate of ten twelve percent per annum, compounded daily.
- (gd) Circumvention of line—fee prohibited. Telecommunications A telecommunications provider shall not underpay fees due to the city, circumvent payment of compensation the fee for use of the public way or evade payment of fees by bartering, transfer of rights, or by any other means that results in undercounting of the number of access lines or telecommunications providers' linear feet of network facilities in the public way within the city. Capacity or services may be bartered if the imputed access lines are reported in accordance with this article.
- (he) Leased network facilities. Other provisions of this article notwithstanding, a grantee shall not include in its monthly count of access lines, and shall not be required to remit a line fee to the city on, those access lines that are leased or otherwise provided to another person for consideration if:
- (1) the person has a current right-of-way ordinance from the city under this article: and

- (2) the person has furnished the grantee adequate proof that (A) the person intends to include the leased access lines in its monthly count to the city, (B) the person intends to remit to the city a line fee on those access lines and (C) the city has approved of the arrangement.
- A telecommunications provider may lease its network facilities or otherwise make its network facilities available, in whole or in part, to its customers in the ordinary provision of services, if the telecommunications provider retains the responsibility for servicing and repairing the network facilities. This shall not be construed to provide any person, other than an affiliate, with authority to place any facilities in the public way without a valid franchise granted by the city, if one is required. The director shall determine whether a franchise is required in accordance with applicable law, and such determination shall be made as if the third party were the owner of the network facilities used by the third party, rather than the telecommunications provider. A telecommunications provider shall notify the city within 30 days of any lease of its network facilities.
- A telecommunications provider's acceptance of a network facilities franchise constitutes its agreement to notify its customers or subscribers making sales of telecommunications services through the use of its network facilities of the possible need for a certificate from the Public Utility Commission of Texas, an FCC license, other state or federal authorization, or city franchise. A telecommunications provider shall notify its existing customers or subscribers of the requirement of this provision within 30 days of the acquisition of each customer or subscriber.
- (if) Line Fees paid pursuant to this section shall constitute the sole compensation to the city for all of the grantee's network facilities located in the public ways, including inter-office transport and other transmission media that do not terminate at an end-user customer's network interface device, even though those types of lines are considered as a part of the linear foot calculations a telecommunications provider's use of the public way.

Sec. 40-336. Conditions of right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise.

The rights <u>A network facilities franchise that is granted</u> to any <u>grantee telecommunications provider</u> under this article shall incorporate the terms of this article and be further subject to the following specific provisions, <u>whether or not such terms are specifically included in such network facilities franchise</u>, <u>unless city council specifically provides otherwise in the right-of-way ordinance</u>:

(a1) Enforcement. The city attorney, or the city attorney's designee, shall have the right to enforce all legal rights and obligations under the right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise without further authorization. The

grantee telecommunications provider shall provide the city access to all documents and records the director or the city attorney deems reasonably necessary to assist in determining the grantee's telecommunications provider's compliance with the right-of-way ordinance; provided that any documents that would be privileged under the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure shall not be required to be provided to the city network facilities franchise.

- (b2) Interference with public use prohibited. The grantee obligation and duty of a telecommunications provider to shall lay, construct, operate, lease, maintain, repair and replace the network facilities shall so as not to unreasonably interfere with the public use of the public way. Insofar as it is practical to do so, the grantee telecommunications provider shall use existing network facilities in the provision of the services. The grantee telecommunications provider shall provide and maintain current any information reasonably related to location or operation of the network facilities or services determined to be necessary by the city engineer or the director. The grantee telecommunications provider shall maintain the network facilities in good order and condition, subject to ordinary wear and tear.
- (e3)Permit fees included in line fees. In addition to the portion of line fees intended to compensate the city for a grantee's use of the public ways, a A portion of the line fee payments due to the city under a network facilities franchise hereunder constitutes compensation payment to the city for the cost of permits and inspections, or other similar approvals or submissions that a telecommunications provider is required to obtain by a grantee for its work in the public ways under authorized by an appropriate right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise. As a result, no additional fees shall be charged to the grantee therefor. On at least an annual basis, the directors of the departments of administration and regulatory affairs and public works and engineering shall determine the amount of the customary fees that would have been charged to other persons for such activities and transfer the amount from the fund receiving the line fees into the proper fund from which such activities were provided telecommunications provider. This subsection shall not be construed to waive any requirement relating to permitting, inspections or similar approvals or submissions other than the payment of separate fees therefor.
- (d4) Permitting and plan approval.
 - (1)<u>a.</u> New construction permit. Before commencing any work in the public way other than routine maintenance or emergency work (as described in items (2) and (3) <u>subsections b and c below</u>), the grantee <u>a telecommunications provider</u> shall apply for and obtain a new

construction permit. The application shall include a written work description, including scale drawings with plan and profile, showing the network facilities' location (or proposed location) and estimated depth of the network facilities (existing and proposed) in the immediate area of the proposed new construction. Such drawings and specifications shall be prepared, executed and sealed by a registered professional engineer, as may be required by the Texas Engineering Practice Act or by the city engineer. Such drawings and specifications will be reviewed by the city engineer and any comments will be provided to the grantee telecommunications provider as soon as practicable. The grantee telecommunications provider shall make any changes to the drawings and specifications requested by the city engineer.

- (2)b. Routine maintenance. The director of public works and engineering may promulgate rules and procedures for routine maintenance of existing network facilities located in the public ways, including but not limited to required notices by the telecommunications provider that the granteetelecommunications provider shall provide, standards for street and curb repairs, and inspection of facilities and street repairs necessitated by such maintenance. When routine Routine maintenance or repair is performed on existing network facilities located in the public ways, the work shall be performed in a manner that is consistent with then-applicable city standards as promulgated by the director of public works and engineering.
- Emergency repairs. When an emergency occurs that could not (3)c. reasonably have been foreseen and requires Emergency repairs requiring immediate work other than routine maintenance located in the public way, repairs may be performed granteetelecommunications provider and notice shall be given in writing to the director of public works and engineering within 24 hours following the commencement of such emergency repairs. Such The notice shall state the nature of the emergency, the repairs required and an estimate of the length of time estimated necessary to complete the emergency repairs. The granteetelecommunications provider shall apply for the all required approvals, including those required under section 40-446(f)(2) article XVII of this chapter as soon as reasonably practicable, and any Any work performed that is not consistent with then-applicable city standards shall be corrected upon notice thereof from the city director of public works and engineering.
- (4)<u>d.</u> Payment of fees required. The city is not required to grant any permit or approval to the <u>grantee telecommunications provider unless</u> and

- until all fees due and payable pursuant to the right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise have been paid in full.
- (5)e. Other licenses and fees. The grantee telecommunications provider shall obtain and pay the cost of all licenses, permits, and certificates required by any statute, ordinance, rule or regulation of any state or federal regulatory body having jurisdiction over the conduct of its operations hereunder. The grantee telecommunications provider shall give notice to the director of any revocation or failure to obtain any such license, permit or certificate affecting its performance hereunder within 15 days of such revocation or of the day upon which the grantee telecommunications provider received actual or constructive notice of its failure to obtain such license, permit or certificate.
- (6)f. City engineer's procedures. Notwithstanding the above, the city engineer may promulgate procedures, applicable to all similarly situated grantees telecommunications providers, regarding that provide for pre-approval of work in the public ways by a grantee telecommunications provider in circumstances that do not require detailed review of the proposed work.
- (e5) Work standards. All work in the public way shall be performed in accordance with the city's Standard Construction Specifications and Standard Construction Details, as such may be amended from time to time, and shall be subject to the regulation, control and direction of the director of public works and engineering. All work done in connection with the laying, construction, operation, maintenance, repair and replacement of the network facilities shall be in compliance with all applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of city, the applicable county, the state, and the United States.
- (f6) Work in the public way. Any work that constitutes an obstruction of a street for which a permit is required under section 40-362 of this Code shall only be performed in accordance with a permit issued under article XVII of this chapter.
- (g7) Restoration.
- (1) At its sole cost and expense, the grantee A telecommunications provider shall repair, clean up and restore the public way disturbed or affected during the maintenance, construction, repair, replacement or removal of the network facilities in accordance with article V of this chapter, and shall warrant the repair and restoration of such public way and other surfaces for a period of two years from the date of completion of same. The director of public works

and engineering shall require a bond as may be required under then-current city regulations; in the absence thereof, the grantee shall provide a surface correction bond in an amount estimated by the city engineer to be the cost of repair of the public way. The terms and conditions of the bond will be substantially similar to those required by the city of other persons performing similar work in the public way. Such repairs, clean up and restoration shall be carried out pursuant to standards promulgated by the director of public works and engineering, and shall return the public way and other disturbed surfaces to substantially the same condition as before the grantee's work began.

- (2) Any excavation in any portion of the public way shall be replaced with materials of the same kind as those removed unless the director of public works and engineering approves of some other type of fill or material. Without limitation of the above, if after refilling an excavation the earth within the excavated area settles so as to leave a depression, and the depression is related to the grantee's work, the grantee shall make further necessary fills or other repair work from for a period of two years from the date of completion of grantee's work to correct the problem as ordered by the director of public works and engineering. The determination that the public way and other surfaces have been returned to substantially the same condition shall be within the reasonable exercise of the director of public works and engineering's discretion.
- Relocation or removal. The grantee A telecommunications provider may be (h8)required to lower, relocate or remove any its network facilities in any public way in accordance with article XVIII of this chapter. without cost to the city if reasonably necessary as determined by the city engineer to abate a condition actually or potentially dangerous to the public health or safety, or as may be reasonably necessary to accommodate any public works project (including Metropolitan Transit Authority (METRO), and any other publicly funded projects within the city) in the public way including, without limitation street construction and widening, water, sanitary sewer, storm drains, street lights and traffic signal conduits, or any other public facilities in or under the public way. In the alternative, where the city engineer determines it to be feasible, the grantee may be allowed to pay any additional costs incurred for the design or construction of such public works project in a manner that will avoid the relocation or removal of the network facilities. In determining the feasibility, the city engineer shall be guided by the principles of economic waste.

⁽i) Timely completion. If the grantee fails to either (i) commence or thereafter to diligently prosecute any repair, refilling, lowering, relocation, or other work required by the city, or (ii) diligently complete any work that disturbs the public way, the city may cause the

work to be done or completed at the expense of the grantee and may recover all such expense from the grantee together with all costs and reasonable attorney fees.

- (ja) Subsequent rules and regulations. The city council or the director of public works and engineering may make such other reasonable rules and regulations for the placement and manner of the network facilities as they may deem appropriate for the protection of the public and the public way and to avoid unreasonable interference with other uses or contemplated uses of the public way. Without limitation of the above, the city council may amend the rules or regulations to require that all network facilities constructed after the effective date of such amended rules be placed underground.
- (k<u>10</u>) Inspections. The city engineer may perform inspections, upon 24 hour written notice from the city, of any network facilities located in the public way from time to time as the city engineer may deemed appropriate. The grantee A telecommunications provider may have a representative present during such inspection.
- (111) Abandonment of obsolete network facilities. The grantee Upon request by the city engineer, a telecommunications provider shall remove aerial facilities and/or facilities in conduits when such facilities are obsolete and no longer in service. When a telecommunications provider removes or abandons permanent structures in the public ways are removed or abandoned, the telecommunications provider shall notify the city engineer shall be notified in writing of such removal or abandonment and shall file with the city engineer the location and description of each facility removed or abandoned. The city engineer may additionally direct such remedial measures as the city engineer may determine are necessary for the public safety and the integrity of the public ways.
- (m) Abandonment of public way. If the city conveys, closes, abandons, or releases its interest in any public way containing network facilities installed or operated pursuant to the right-of-way ordinance, any such conveyance, closure, abandonment or release shall be subject to the rights of the grantee under the right-of-way ordinance.
 - (n12) Bonding. The grantee telecommunications provider shall comply with all applicable requirements relating to the provision of bonds or other security to the city in connection with its work in the public way.

(p) Temporary rearrangement of aerial wires. Upon request, the grantee shall
remove or raise or lower its aerial wires, fiber or cables temporarily to permit the movino

(o) Reserved.

of houses or other bulky structures. The expense of such temporary rearrangements shall be paid by the party or parties requesting them, excluding the city and METRO projects within the city, and the grantee may require payment in advance. The grantee shall be given time as approved by the city engineer, but not less than four working days (96 hours) advance notice to carry out such temporary rearrangements. All wires and cables, except drop or service wires and cables, shall be not less than that distance required by law, above the traveled surface of any city street, alley or sidewalk and above the surface of any city parks or playgrounds.

- (q13) Tree trimming. The right, license, privilege and permission is hereby granted to the grantee A telecommunications provider, its contractors and agents, to may trim trees that are upon and overhanging the public ways and public places of the city so as to prevent the branches of such trees from coming in contact with the grantee's telecommunications provider's fiber or cables. At the option of the city, said trimming shall be done under the supervision and direction of the city or of any city official to whom said duties have been or may be delegated.
- (<u>f14</u>) Indemnification and insurance. The <u>right-of-way ordinance</u> network facilities <u>franchise</u> shall contain indemnity and insurance provisions in a form acceptable to the city attorney.
- (s<u>15</u>) Default and termination; valuation. <u>A</u> The right-of-way ordinance <u>network</u> <u>facilities franchise</u> shall contain provisions relating to default and termination. For purposes of compliance with article II, section 17 of the charter of the city, unless the <u>right-of-way ordinance network facilities franchise</u> provides otherwise, there shall be no requirement that the network facilities be purchased by the city upon termination <u>of a network facilities franchise</u> thereof.
- (t<u>16</u>) Other terms and conditions. The right-of-way ordinancenetwork facilities franchise may contain such other terms and conditions as the director and the city attorney may prescribe and city council may approve that are not inconsistent with the terms of this article herewith.

Sec. 40-337. Penalty for unauthorized use of the public ways.

It shall be unlawful to make use of the public ways in violation of the terms of this article. Without limitation of other remedies available to the city, persons making use of the public ways in violation of this article, or otherwise without valid consent of the city, shall be liable for all fees authorized by this article dating back to the inception of such use.

TAX INCREMENT REINVESTMENT ZONE NUMBER THIRTEEN OLD SIXTH WARD ZONE PART C – AMENDING THE PROJECT PLAN AND REINVESTMENT ZONE FINANCING PLAN

Amended August 11, 2010

Introduction:

Reinvestment Zone Number Thirteen, City of Houston, Texas, also known as the Old Sixth Ward Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone ("Zone") was created by Ordinance No. 1998-1256 adopted December 29, 1998 as requested by the Old Sixth Ward Neighborhood Association and petitioners in an area located west of downtown Houston, north of Memorial Drive and on approximately 151 acres of land known as the historic Old Sixth Ward neighborhood. The purposes of the Zone were to advance historic preservation, facilitate physical improvements to the historic Dow School, encourage affordable and market-rate housing projects, and encourage development and redevelopment in the area.

Section One:

The Part A and Part B Plan: The City Council adopted a Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan by Ordinance No. 1999-0794, on July 28, 1999 (the "Part A Plan"). The Part A Plan was amended subsequently by Ordinance No. 1999-0827 on September 11, 1999 (the "Part B Plan"). Together the Part A and Part B Plans (the "Plans") provided mechanisms needed to assist in the repositioning of the Old Sixth Ward from a blighted and deteriorated neighborhood into a viable residential community. Proposed public improvements included in the Plans addressed existing conditions consisting of substandard and deteriorating structures; inadequate and deteriorated streets, utilities, and sidewalks; faulty and obsolete lot layouts; safety issues; and school improvements.

The Zone and the City now desire to amend the Plans as further described herein, (the "Part C Plan").

Section Two:

The Part C Plan: The Part C Plan will remedy recent and historic negative trends within the Old Sixth Ward area by creating a viable and attractive environment for investment and redevelopment. Improvements have been identified that will enhance the community by attracting new businesses and residents to the area. The proposed Part C Plan provides for additional funding which will be utilized for public improvement project costs consistent with the Plans. Consisting of upgrades and improvements to public utility systems and roadways, parks, land acquisition, historic preservation, environmental remediation, streetscape improvements and provisions for public art, lighting and landscaping, the goals of the Zone are to create a new urban neighborhood while respecting the historic character of the area; create gateways between the Old Sixth Ward and adjacent districts through the development of

connections with other neighborhoods and activity centers; produce a product unique to Old Sixth Ward; and enhance the sense of civic pride for area residents.

Public improvements proposed in this Part C Plan are in relationship to the original goals of the Zone and are as follows:

Goals

Goal 1: The reinforcement of retail developments along the Washington Avenue corridor.

The retention and expansion of retail and commercial developments along Washington Avenue is of key importance to the successful redevelopment of the area. The provision of base level retail functionality is essential to the continued expansion of residential projects in the area. In particular, it is envisioned to develop historic Washington Avenue into a key arterial/town center with an emphasis on parking, lighting, street trees, landscaping, wide sidewalks, public art and adequate pedestrian amenities.

<u>Goal 2</u>: The creation of pedestrian-friendly, safe environments through the reconstruction of the pedestrian realm with ample lighting and streetscape amenities.

Streetscape/pedestrian level enhancements are required to create an environment that will help stimulate investment in retail, residential, and commercial developments. Enhanced streetscapes components will include: sidewalks, lighting, signage, street trees, landscaping, benches and other pedestrian amenities. Construction of sidewalk systems including ADA compliant ramps and other treatments will improve pedestrian safety, enhance the visual environment and provide connectivity both within the community and to adjacent districts. Attention will be placed on the leveraging of Zone monies with sister agencies.

Goal 3: Improvements to public streets and public utility systems to create an environment that will stimulate private investment in retail, residential, and multi-family developments.

Reconstruction (major and minor) of key streets and utility systems will be taken to enhance the level of service in the area, improve functionality, replace aged facilities, and increase aesthetics. All roadway improvements will be integrated with street reconstruction projects of the City of Houston, and others as needed, and where possible, will add elements not included in those projects.

Goal 4: Redevelopment and upgrades to public green space, parks, and other appropriate recreational facilities.

Development of parks, public open green space, and related amenities including access and egress improvements, land acquisition, dedication of public easements, parking, and the construction of enhancements. All improvements will be integrated with adjacent land uses and provided with upgrades focused on connectivity, pedestrian safety, and the visual environment.

Goal 5: Cultural and Public Facilities, Affordable Housing and Historic Preservation.

Increasing public and cultural facilities, historic preservation programs, and affordable housing for Old Sixth Ward residents emerged as important public policy goals since the implementation of the Plan A. Zone funds will be leveraged with funds from private, public, and non-profit developers to integrate affordable housing and historic preservation initiatives into ongoing and proposed redevelopment projects in the Old Sixth Ward. As such, the acquisition and rehabilitation of historic structures and historic landmarks for the purposes of preservation and restoration is anticipated. These projects, along with improved infrastructure, will enhance the quality of life for existing and new residents and businesses.

Other Project Plan Provisions:

Project Plan:

Affordable Housing: The Old Sixth Ward was created by the petition of property owners constituting more than 50% of the assessed value of property in the Zone. One -third of the tax increment revenues of the Zone are dedicated to the provision of affordable housing, which may be provided inside or outside the Zone as authorized by Chapter 311, Texas Tax Code.. An estimated \$11,765,306 will be used for affordable housing over the life of the Zone.

Existing and Proposed Land Uses Within the Zone: Maps showing the existing uses and conditions and proposed improvements to and uses of the areas in Maps 1 and 2 are attached hereto.

<u>Proposed Changes to Zoning Ordinances</u>, the Master Plan of the Municipality, Building Codes of <u>Other Municipal Ordinances</u>: No such changes to any of the aforementioned are contemplated by this Second Amendment.

Method of Relocating Persons: It is not anticipated that any current resident of the Old Sixth Ward will be relocated as a result of this Second Amendment.

Financing Plan:

<u>Estimated Project Costs</u>: Exhibit 1 details the proposed project costs, including administrative costs. The existing project costs included in the Plans remain valid for those projects at this time.

<u>Economic Feasibility</u>: Exhibits 2 through 5 attached hereto are updated revenue estimates. These estimates detail the total appraised value, the captured appraised value, and the net revenue from each taxing entity participating in the Old Sixth Ward Zone over the remaining life of the Zone.

Estimated Bond Indebtedness: Notes have been issued by the Zone. On October 22, 2008, by Ordinance No. 2008-941, City Council approved an Agreement for Financing Public Infrastructure Improvements by and among the City of Houston, Reinvestment Zone Number Thirteen, and the Old Sixth Ward Redevelopment Authority. Subsequently on August 26, 2008, by Ordinance 2009-793, City Council approved a First Amended and Restated Agreement for Financing Public Infrastructure Improvements. Additional bonds or notes may be issued. The

value and timing of these future bond or note issuances will correlate to the debt capacity as derived from the revenue schedules attached hereto, and by actual market conditions for the issuance and sale of such bonds or notes. The Zone will explore other financing methods as well, including developer agreement financing and collaboration with other entities for grant funding and partnerships.

<u>Duration of the Zone</u>: The Zone duration remains unchanged. When initially created by City Council on December 29, 1998, the duration of the Zone was established at 30 years. The Zone will expire on December 31, 2028.

Taxing Jurisdiction Participation: Property valuation of the Zone has increased from \$34,345,500 in tax year 1998 (the Zone Base Year) to a projected \$146,538,081 in tax year 2010. The 2010 incremental revenue estimate from all participating jurisdictions is sufficient to cover the costs of the proposed redevelopment as well as to support the public improvement projects proposed for the Zone. This Second Amendment estimates a total project cost of \$28,532,240.

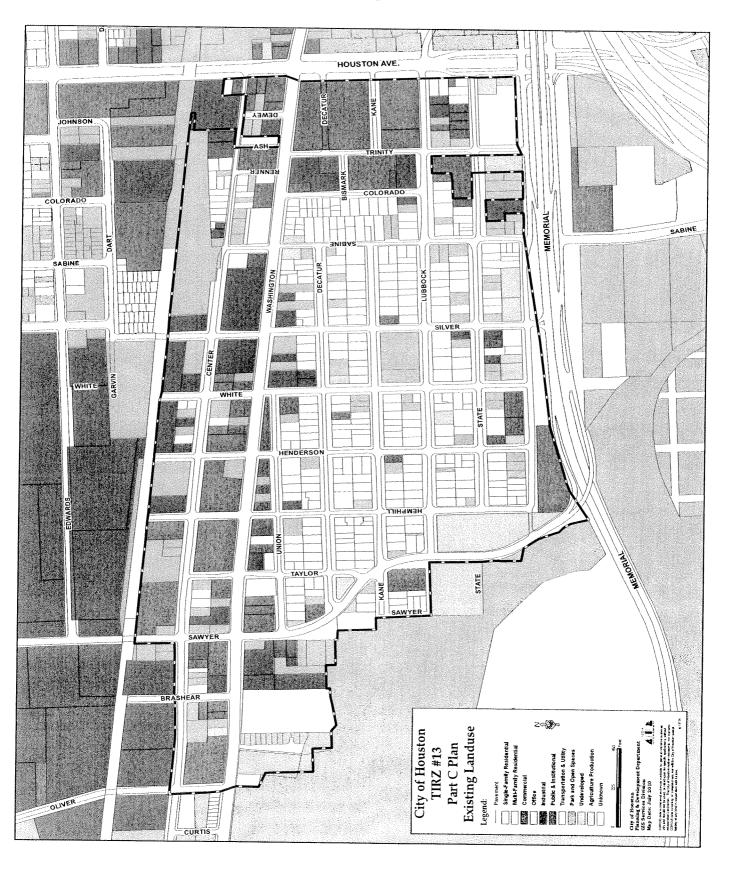

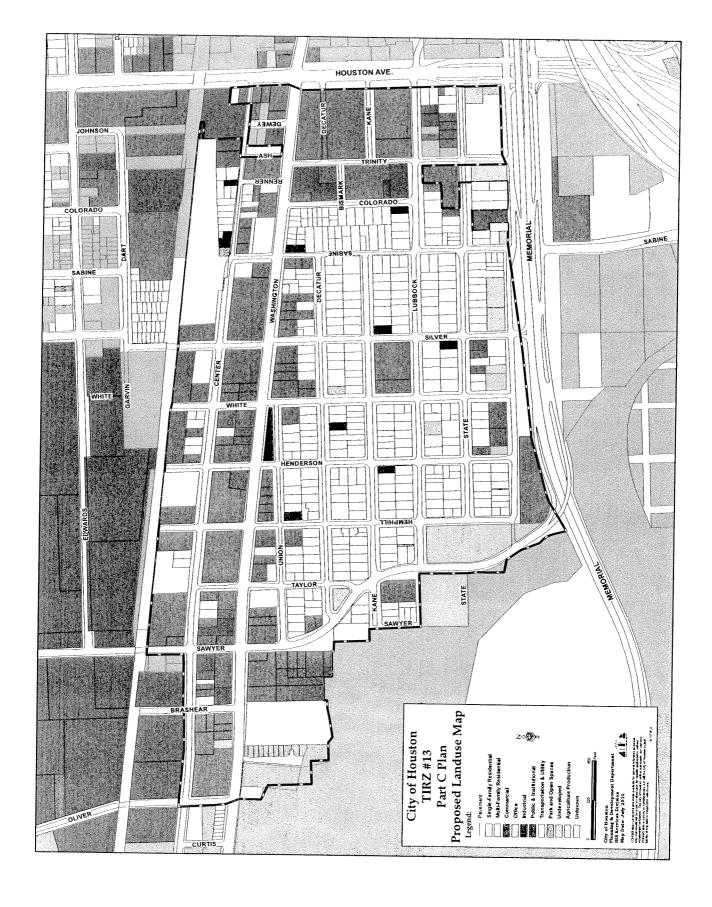

The Houston Police Department is the coordinating agency for the Houston Auto Crimes Task Force Grant. This program, in its nineteenth year of funding, was created with grant funds from the Texas Automobile Theft Prevention Authority (ABTPA) to reduce the auto theft rate in the Houston area. The program has been highly successful having reduced the auto theft rate in the City of Houston and Harris County by 66% since its inception.

The success is largely credited to the combined participation of the Houston Police Department, Texas Department of Public Safety, Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office and the Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County Department of Public Safety (Metro PD). These law enforcement agencies have requested to continue their participation in the program by presenting their individual inter-local agreements for renewal. The Interlocal agreements establish the relationship and responsibilities among the participants. Financial participation is as follows:

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

Following passage of City of Houston Ordinance 2010-305 concerning water and sewer rates, pursuant to the Texas Government Code the City of Houston filed a declaratory judgment action in Travis County, Texas for the purpose of validating rate increases contemplated in the ordinance. Messers. Hotze and Bettencourt intervened in the action. The City prevailed in the trial court. In summary, the trial court granted the requested declaratory judgment validating the rate increases, ordered the Intervenors to post a bond and entered an order dismissing the Intervenors from the action for failure to file the bond. Intervenors appealed each of the three rulings. The appeals, now consolidated, are pending before the Court of Appeals for the Third District of Texas.

Andrews Kurth LLP has considerable experience both in representing local government entities and in the appellate arena. The firm represented the City of Houston in the underlying action and is familiar with the issues involved in the appeal. Andrews Kurth LLP is uniquely qualified to handle the appeal and a contract for the firm's retention relative to 03-10-00423-CV, 03-10-00433-CV and 03-10-00497-CV in the Court of Appeals for the Third District of Texas is the subject of the present Request for Council Action.

Such contract will be entered into under the new maximum fee schedule established by the City Attorney's Office providing for discounted rates.

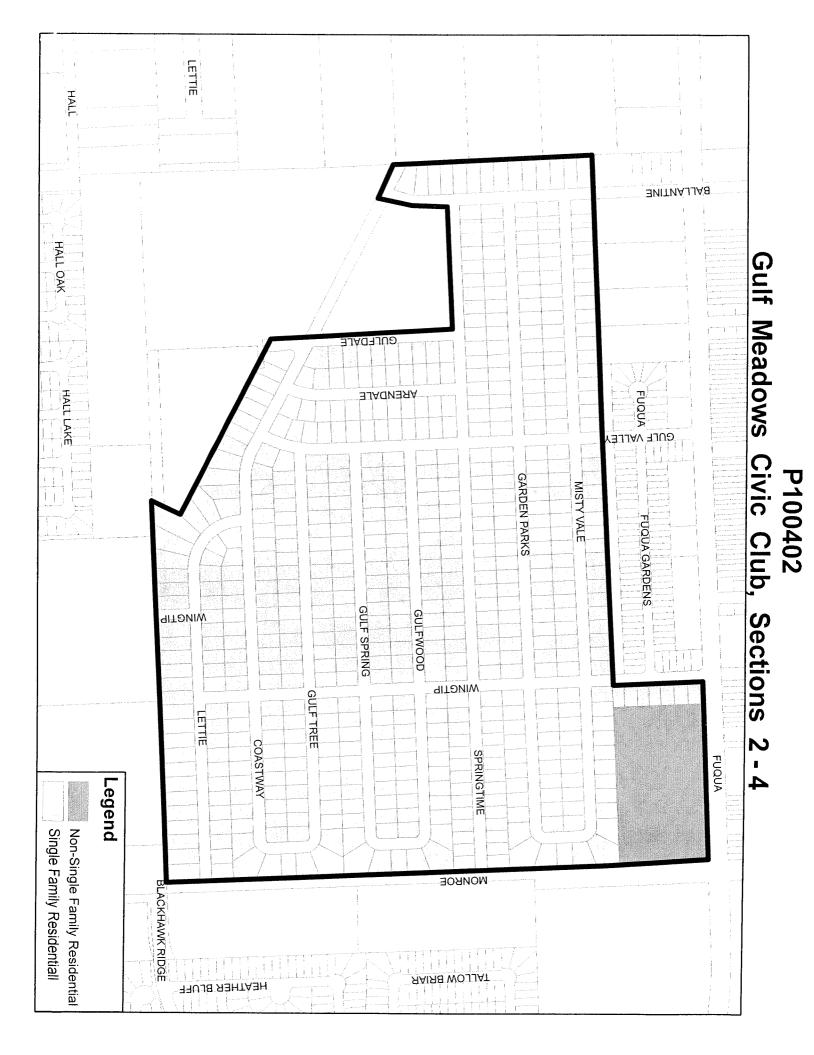

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: On May 24, 2005, the City entered into a contract with 3D/International, Inc. to provide design services for exterior and interior renovations to Terminal C and adjacent parking garages at George Bush Intercontinental Airport/Houston (IAH). Under construction Project 490H, services provided to date include renovations to the exterior of the terminal and garages, as well as upgrades to the garage parking decks and modifications to the drive and walking surfaces at the curbsides. Under construction Project 490K, services provided to date include renovations to the interior of the terminal building, including work at the Inter-Terminal Train level, Baggage Claim level, Ticket Lobby level and the Mezzanine level.

The Museum's contractor encountered the 24-inch main during construction and, in order to avoid construction delays, the Museum relocated the line at its own expense. After the line was discovered and relocation planned, the City asked the contractor to make certain improvements including an additional valve for improved system operation. The Museum deducted \$150,000 from its lease payment to the Parks Department in an attempt to account for the expense of the relocation. This amount was the estimated City share of the cost of relocating the City's 24-inch main. In order to ensure that the Parks Department budget is not adversely affected by this movement on PWE infrastructure, the City has arranged, and the Museum has agreed, to pay the withheld rent to the Parks Department and to be reimbursed for the actual percentage of its costs by the Department of Public Works and Engineering. 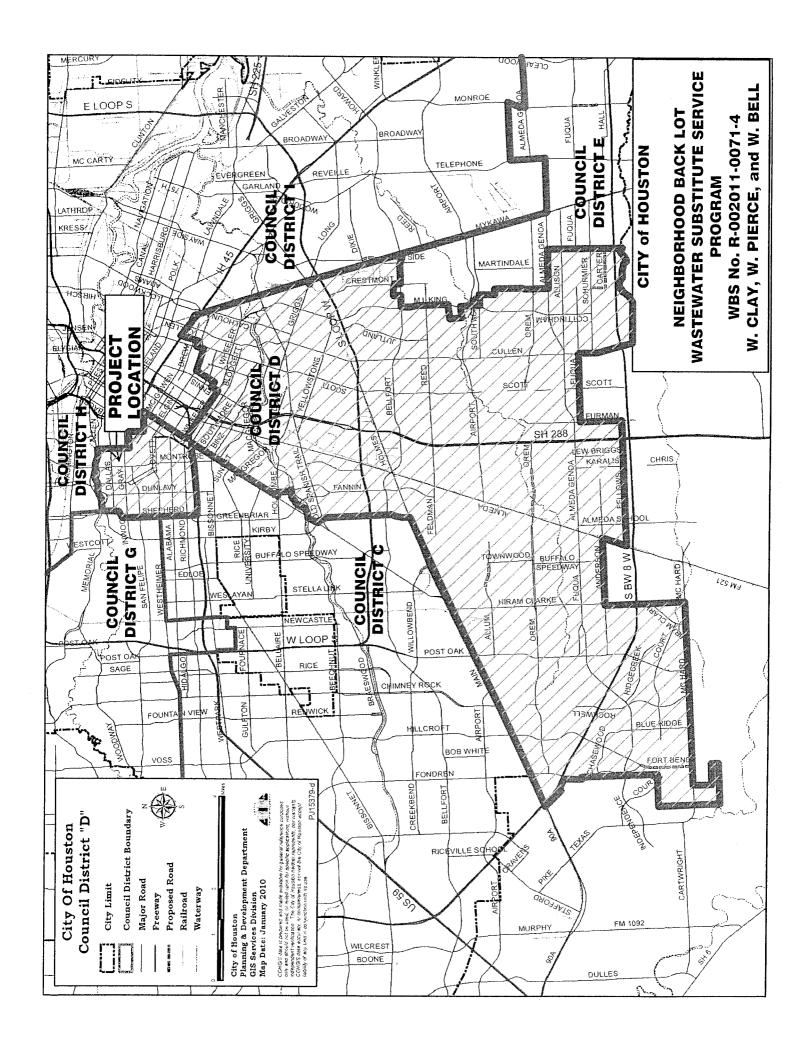

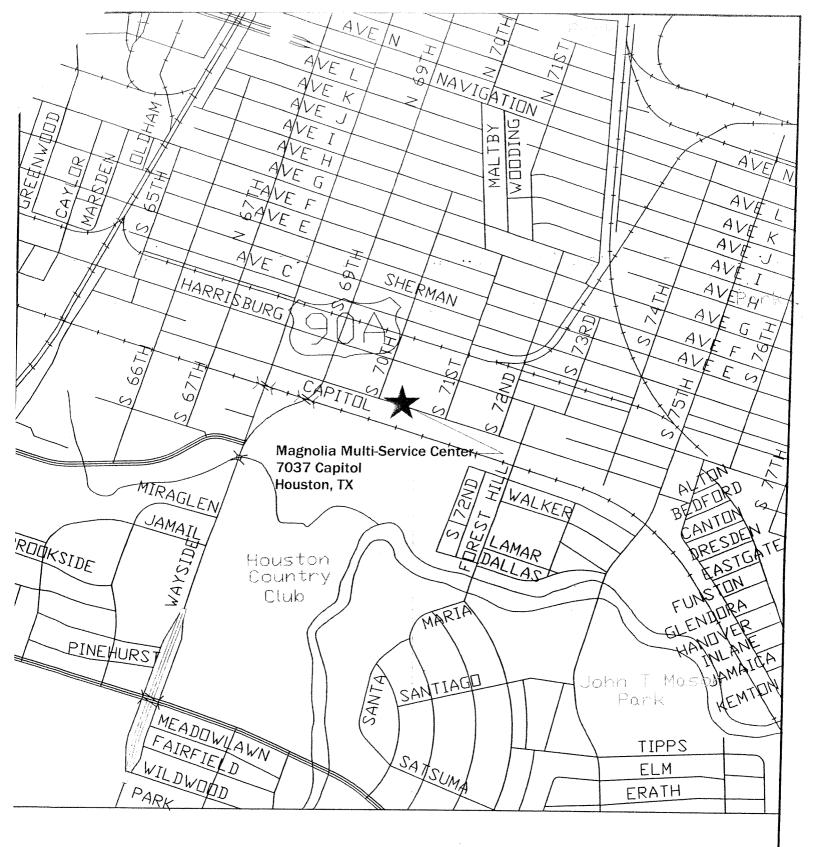

PREVIOUS CHANGE ORDERS: Change Orders 1-12 addressed unforeseen conditions discovered during the renovation process and provided additional improvements requested by the Health and Human Services Department to handle increased demands for services and regulatory compliance. The overall increased scope of work consisted of the following: (a) Demolition and replacement of sheetrock and insulation due to extensive mold discovered behind vinyl wall covering on all outside walls. (b) New grounding system to comply with Code. (c) Replacement of plumbing controls due to the discovery of numerous domestic water valves above ceiling and behind walls being badly corroded and in danger of bursting. (d) Replacement of deteriorated lightweight concrete and metalroof deck resulting in a life/safety issue over the daycare center. (e) Enhancements needed in the daycare kitchen due to equipment failure. (f) Reconfiguration of space to accommodate additional occupancy in the Woman Infant Child (WIC) Center as a result of the closure of Gulfgate WIC facility due to Hurricane Ike damages. (g) Addition of sinks in each exam room to comply with state regulation and certification. Change Order 13 provided a credit for deleted lighting not provided by the contractor.

M/WBE PARTICIPATION: The contract contained a 15% MBE goal, 5% SBE goal and 5% WBE goal. The contractor achieved 21.43% MBE participation, 6.31% SBE participation, and 0% WBE participation as a result of the WBE firm, MEK Interiors and Floors, Inc., refusing to honor their bid. According to the Affirmative Action and Contract Compliance Division, the contractor exceeded the goal for MBE participation to make up the difference and was assigned an outstanding rating.

Specifically, taxicab, limousine, jitney, pedicab and low-speed shuttle owners and operators were invited to participate in stakeholder discussions during meetings held on July 26th, August 9th and 26th, and September 2nd and 8th. In recommending these new regulations, ARA intends to communicate to the riding public that green alternatives for public transportation are available in Houston, while providing regulatory certainty to existing and potential suppliers of this service, thereby incentivizing investment in existing or emerging technologies. ARA believes that by accomplishing these goals the City of Houston will foster an unprecedented level of low environmental impact transportation to the citizens of Houston.

Recommended Amendments to Chapter 46 of the Houston Code of Ordinances, Related to Vehicles-for-Hire

Many provisions suggested by industry are incorporated into the following recommended amendments. These recommendations address specific safe vehicle operating requirements without prescribing specific equipment which imposes a barrier to entry rather than specifically addressing a potential hazard. Where possible, requirements for both types of vehicles were drafted to mirror existing permitting and licensing requirements for other categories of vehicles for hire. For example, standard requirements such as criminal background checks and drug screens will be mandated for all applicants, and for those that are denied or revoked due process would exist in the form of an administrative hearing. Hygiene and professional appearance requirements are being recommended, as well as operational rules for stopping and standing on the public rights-of-way similar to those for taxicabs, limousines, etc. Recommended provisions unique to these two new categories of vehicles for hire include enhanced insurance requirements and a restriction to operate on roadways with a maximum speed limit of 35 mph. Following are specific recommended provisions for each of the two new categories of vehicles.

Recommended provisions specifically related to low-speed shuttles include:

- Low-speed shuttles shall be defined as: A motorized non-gasoline powered vehicle with a passenger capacity of from 4-8 passengers, including the driver, that is capable of attaining a top speed of at least 20 mph and no more than 25 mph, and that complies with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard Number 500 ("FMVSS 500").
- Maximum vehicle age: 6 years
- Fees:
 - \$400 annual permit fee per vehicle
 - \$10 driver's license application fee (license term is two years)
 - \$25 vehicle inspection fee
 - \$100 company permit application fee (permit term is five years)
 - \$30 per zone/rate per vehicle
- Minimum Insurance: Commercial automobile liability policy that provides a minimum coverage amount of \$500,000 combined single limit per occurrence
- Vehicle Equipment:
 - Must be registered as a motor vehicle under Texas law with all required equipment
 - Seat belt for each passenger
- Operating Restrictions: Permittees will submit requests for zones within which their vehicles may be operated.

Recommended provisions specifically related to pedicabs include:

- Pedicabs shall be defined as: A bicycle or tricycle that transports or is held out to the public as available to transport passengers for hire, including a bicycle that pulls, or to which is attached, a trailer, sidecar or similar device. Allows the use of both trikes and trailer-bikes to provide service
- Vehicle Age: Non-motorized vehicles have no maximum age limit
- Fees:
 - \$200 annual permit fee per vehicle
 - \$10 driver's license application fee (license term is two years)
 - \$25 vehicle inspection fee
 - \$100 company permit application fee (permit term is five years)
- Minimum Insurance: Commercial general liability policy that provides a minimum coverage amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence
- Vehicle Equipment:
 - White light visible at least 100 feet from front of vehicle during daylight; 500 feet at night; red reflector and red light on rear of vehicle with same visibility requirements
 - Seat belt for each passenger
 - Braking system capable of stopping a vehicle with a loaded passenger compartment in a linear fashion; trailers must be equipped with a dedicated braking system

In addition to creating provisions specific to pedicab and low-speed shuttle licenses and permits in Chapter 46, other areas of the Code of Ordinances will be affected when these new regulations are enacted. As such, to create a comprehensive

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regulatory framework for green vehicles-for-hire, ARA also recommends changes to Chapters 1 and 45 of the Code of Ordinances, as detailed in the following paragraphs.

Recommended amendments to Chapter 1, Section 1-10

Section 1-10 of the Houston Code of Ordinances (the Code) states that licenses or permits governed by Chapter 46 of the Code can be denied, revoked or refused, as applicable, if an applicant, licensee, or permittee has been convicted of designated offenses within the ten-year period immediately preceding the date of filing of the application or has spent time in jail or prison during the ten-year period immediately preceding the date of filing of the application for such a conviction, or is subject to deferred adjudication in connection with the designated offenses.

These designated offenses include those involving: fraud or theft; forgery; the unauthorized use of a motor vehicle; violation of state or federal laws regulating firearms; violence to a person classified as a Class B misdemeanor or higher; prostitution or the promotion of prostitution; rape, sexual assault, rape of a child, sexual abuse of a child, indecency with a child, or resulting in designation of the individual as a "registered sex offender" by any state or the federal government; any offense involving driving a motor vehicle while intoxicated, whether under the influence of alcohol or drugs; or, the use or sale of drugs.

ARA recommends that Section 1-10 of the Code be amended to include pedicab and low-speed shuttle licenses and permits among those licenses and permits that can be denied, revoked or refused if a licensee, permittee, or applicant has been convicted of any of the offenses specifically designated in Section 1-10 during the preceding 10-year period. ARA further recommends that licensees or potential licensees be deemed ineligible if they have three or more moving violations of the traffic laws of the State of Texas or any other state if the violations occurred within the two years immediately preceding the application for or renewal of a license, or of the notice of a hearing for revocation of a license.

Recommended amendments to Chapter 45, Section 45-326

Section 45-326 currently prohibits a child, or parent of a child less than 14 years of age, from "operating or riding upon a bicycle or any side car, trailer, child carrier, seat or other device attached to a bicycle unless the child is wearing a helmet." ARA recognizes the public safety purpose of Section 45-326 and its intent to protect our younger riders. However, in enacting this provision in 1995, City Council could not have foreseen the applicability to public transportation services in the vehicle for hire industry.

In meeting with stakeholders in the pedicab industry, ARA has determined that it is impracticable to require children riding in pedicabs to wear helmets due to sizing, hygiene and enforcement issues. Therefore, ARA recommends that Section 45-326 of the Code be amended to provide an exemption that children not be required to wear a helmet if and only if they are a passenger in a pedicab permitted by the City which is being operated by a licensed pedicab driver pursuant to Article III of Chapter 46 of the Code of Ordinances.

Recommendation:

ARA recommends City Council approval of the recommended revisions to Chapters 1, 45 and 46 of the Code of Ordinances. These recommendations are intended to provide a framework that not only addresses technology currently employed by the vehicle-for-hire industry, but also is flexible enough to allow the application of technologies that have not yet emerged.

These recommendations were presented to the Development and Regulatory Affairs Committee on September 30, 2010.
