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Two firms, CenterPoint Energy Services, Inc. and Cokinos Energy, were tied after the submission of proposals. These firms were requested to submit a best and final offer and it was determined that CenterPoint Energy Services Inc. offers the best value for the City.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: The proposed contract will commence on February 1, 2013 for an initial term of three years, with two (2) one year renewal options. The contract allows the city to lock in natural gas based on the NYMEX index and set pricing for selected terms for the remainder of the contract. Absent a lock, the commodity price under the contract will be the Houston Ship Channel price for natural gas price plus a fixed adder.

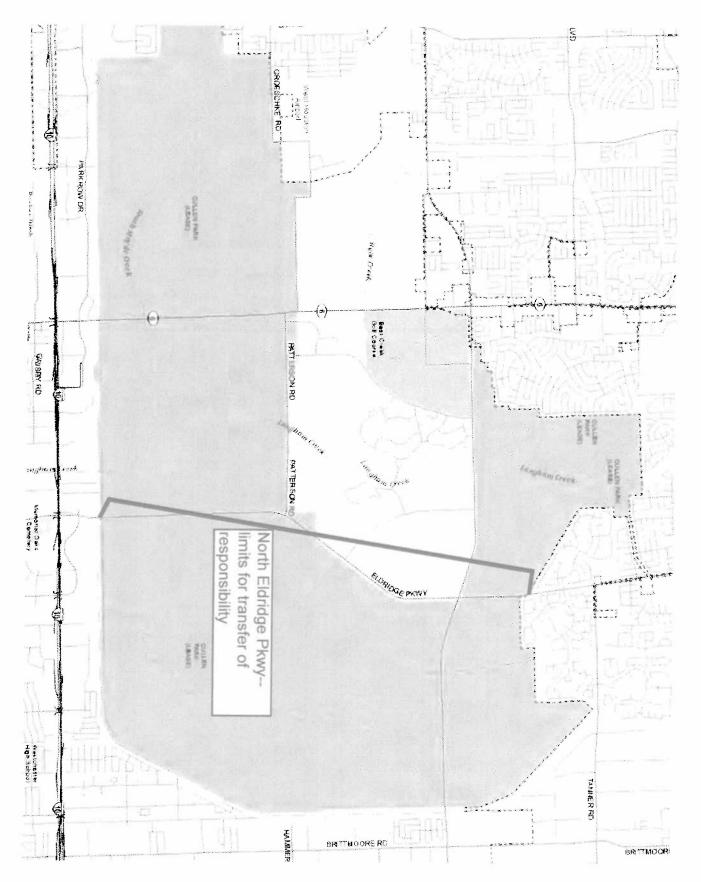

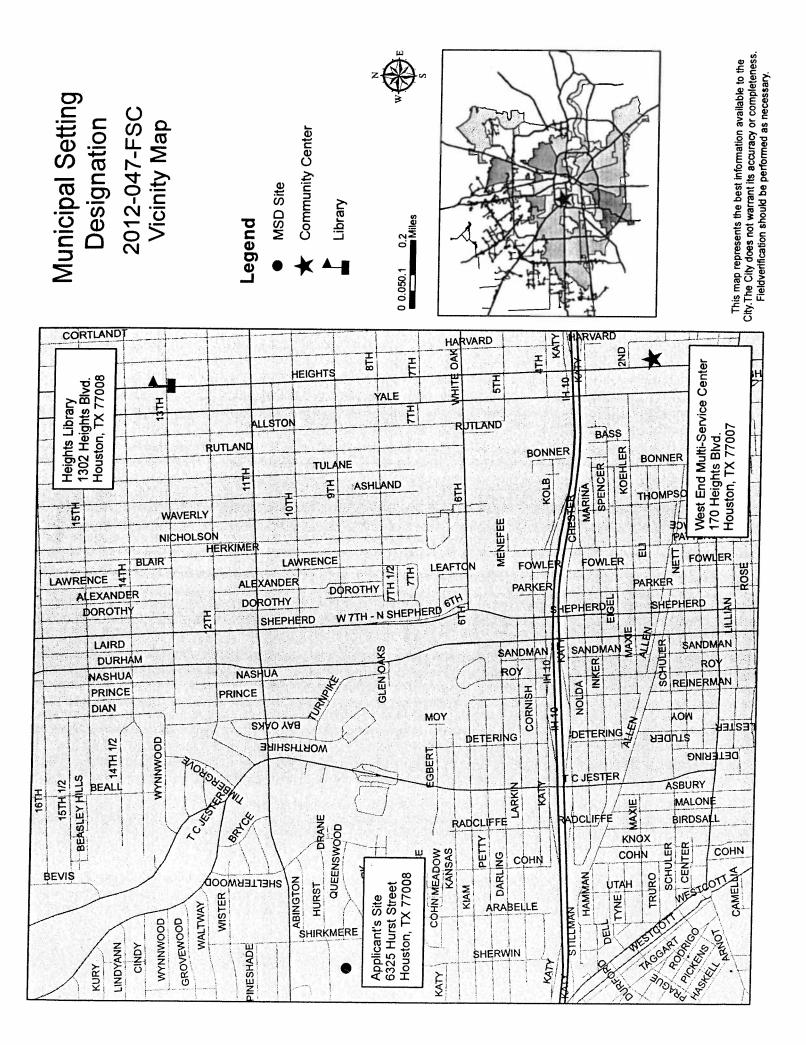

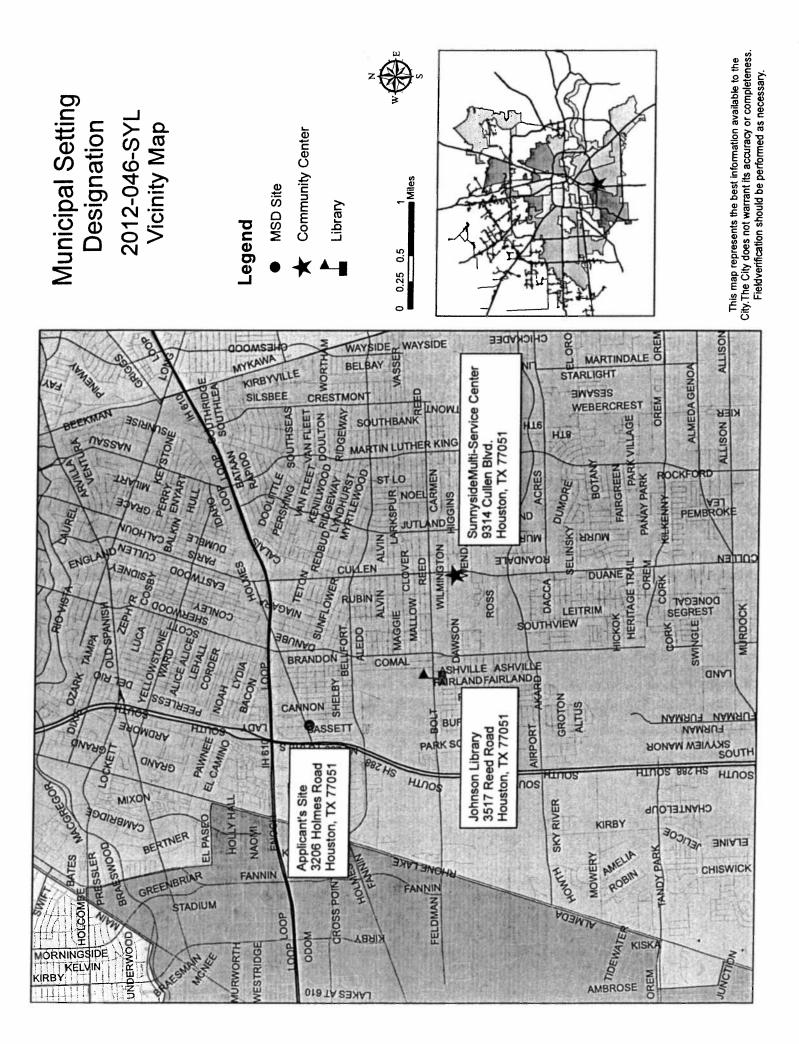

Subsequently, the second and the third amendments to the original contract were approved for the construction of Kirby Drive from West Airport to Sims Bayou and Mowery Road from Edwina to future Kirby Drive (on August 6, 2008 by Ordinance 2008-0693) and the construction of North Park Drive from West Lake Houston Parkway to Mills Branch (on January 14, 2009 by Ordinance 2009-0021) respectively. Both Kirby Drive project and North Park Drive project were constructed in 2011. Additional funds to complete engineering services for the reconstruction of Northline project was approved (on June 17, 2009 by Ordinance 2009-0545) and the project is currently in the 90% of Phase II – Final Design.

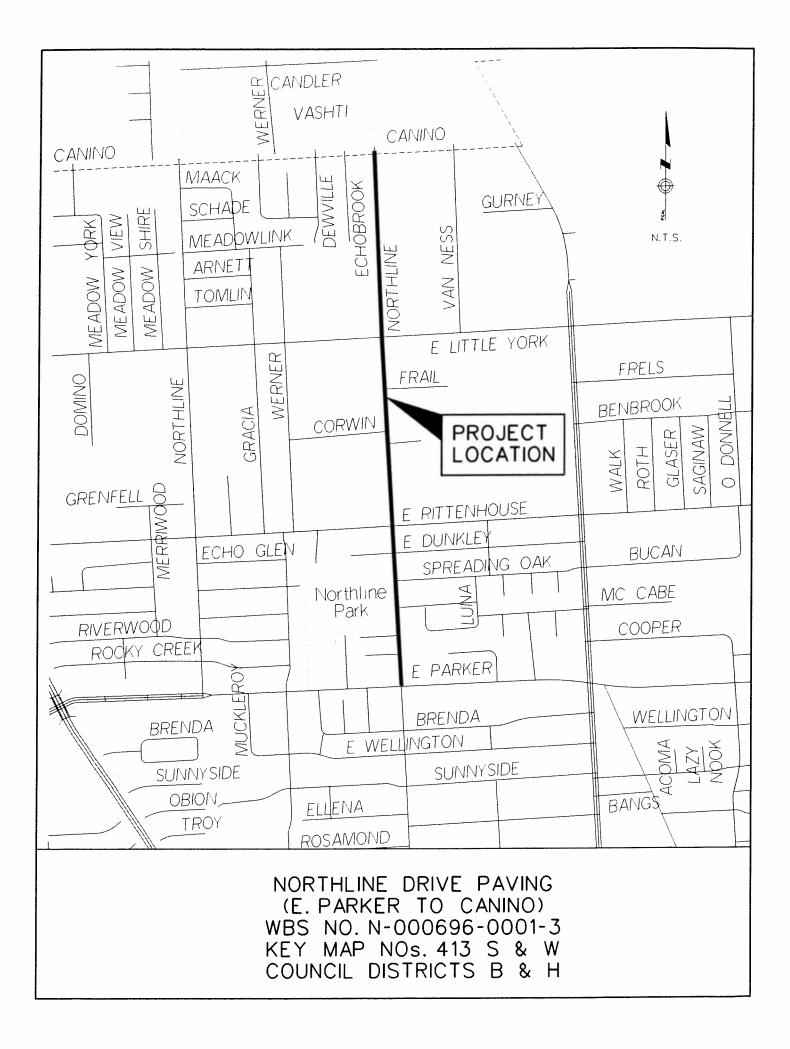
M/WBE INFORMATION: The M/WBE goal established for the overall project is set at 24%. The original contract and subsequent appropriations total \$3,494,244.00. The consultant has been paid \$3,243,307.61 (92.82%) to date. Of this amount, \$846,345.67 (26.10%) has been paid to M/WBE sub consultants to date. Assuming approval of the requested additional appropriation, the contract amount will be increased to \$3,702,367.00. The consultant has updated the following program to achieve this goal:

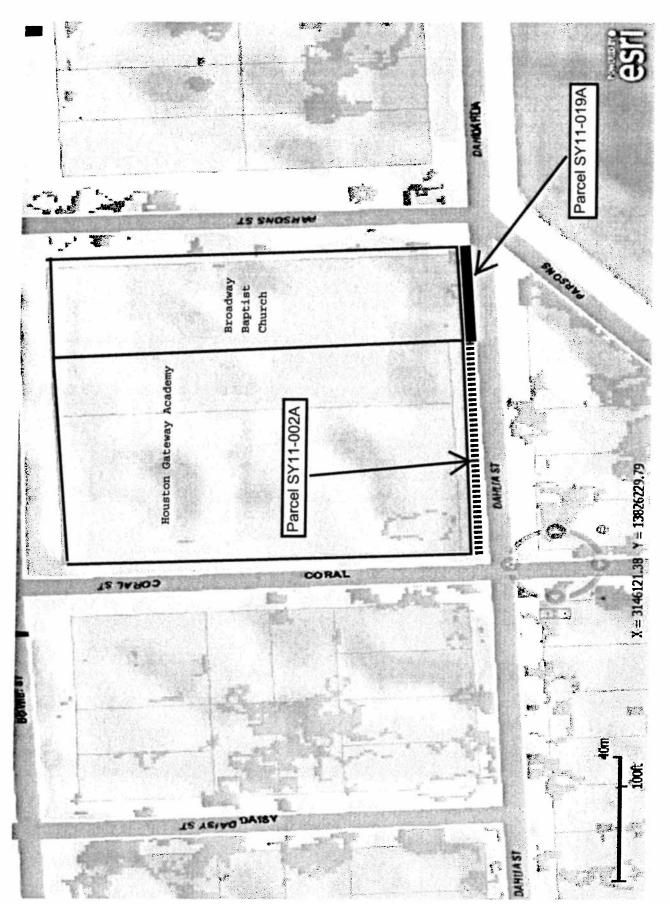

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: In accordance with Council approved Ordinance 2011-1001, HPARD applied for and was awarded a grant from the Texas Department of Agriculture Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) to cover the cost of offering free meals and snacks to 1,500 daily participants of at-risk afterschool programs. The Houston Parks and Recreation Department (HPARD) requests approval of an ordinance awarding a six month contract with four one-year option terms, totaling four and a half years to Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc. for the HPARD After-School Meal Program to be funded by the CACFP grant. The vendor contract, as approved by the State of Texas, supports a federally funded program that provides supper and supplements that will meet the Federally Regulated Child Nutritional Standards required by the grant program. The After- School Meal Program will provide suppers and snacks between January 14, 2013 and May 30, 2013 at 53 State-approved sites throughout the Greater Houston Area. The free meals and snacks will be served to participants of HPARD's After-School Enrichment Program at 49 eligible community centers and at four (4) additional sites operated by non-profit organizations					
that qualify for the program. A complete list of sites and Council Districts is attached. The vendor solicitation was advertised in the Houston Chronicle and in the City of Houston's Strategic Purchasing e-bid Web site. Sixteen (16) vendors downloaded the Request for Proposal (RFP). Only one proposal was submitted. HPARD staff contacted vendors who downloaded the RFP but did not respond. The primary reason given for not responding was that the number of meals exceeded their capacity.

- 2. Business license, referrals, Bid Bond, and confirmed prices were inclusive of milk, juice, packaging, transportation, and condiments
- 3. MWDBE documentation
- 4. Appropriate evidence that corrective actions of any and all Health Department violations are in compliance with the City of Houston's inspection guidelines.

In the six months and in all option years, the contract amount is limited to the grant amount awarded by the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA). The total amount projected for the four and a half-year contract shall not exceed \$3,350,160 without further Council action. The contract may be terminated at any time during the term of the contract if the State of Texas cancels or does not approve funding for food service.
