Sources of System Revenues - General

As of June 30, 1999, the Water Facilities and the Sewer Facilities served approximately 395,000 and 384,000 active service connections, respectively. During Fiscal Year 1999, approximately 46% of System Gross Revenues were derived from the sale of water (87% from treated water and 13% from untreated water), approximately 45% from providing wastewater treatment services, 6% from interest income and the remaining 3% from various other sources. Of the treated water sales, 93% of revenues were from retail customers and 7% from bulk sales to other governmental entities.

The untreated water sales are made pursuant to existing "take-or-pay" contracts with industrial and other customers. Under its current policy, the City will no longer enter into "take-or-pay" contracts, but will require contracts which provide for billing on the basis of actual consumption of untreated water.
