- ➤ In Fiscal Year 2014, the City awarded a total of \$1.3B for construction, professional services, and purchasing agreements. Of this total, certified firms were awarded more than \$291.8M.
- ➤ While the City awarded a total of \$1.3B, from that \$163.6M were exempt contracts, \$74.8M were contracts with waivers, and \$24.2M were non goal-oriented contracts. Even still, an additional amount of \$16.9M was awarded to certified firms on contracts that do not require certified firms.



## **Contracts with DBE Goals**



- In FY2014, DBE Certified Firms were utilized on 11 contracts by HAS, GSD and PWE departments.
- The total amount awarded on these contracts was \$100,648,903.
- ➤ DBE Certified firms were awarded \$19,085,711 of that amount.
- ➤ A 10%-30% goal has been established on these contracts therefore the participation of DBEs is anticipated to increase by the end of each contract.







- Interlocal Agreements/Cooperative Purchasing Agreements/DIR- Agreements the City enters into with other governmental entities in the interest of cooperatively sharing resources.
- **Emergency Contracts** Contracts awarded to meet an immediate need.
- Specialized Contracts- Services or goods requested are of a specialized, technical or unique nature.
- Economic Burden/Risk/Delay- Unwarranted economic burden or risk on the City or unduly delay acquisition of the goods or services.

- Non-Divisible Contracts cannot be divided to create subcontracting opportunities.
- ➤ No MWSBEs available No MWSBEs available in the marketplace to perform the work or requires a specialized license to do the work.
- > Sole Source Contracts awarded to meet a need that can only be supplied from a firm that provides specialized and/or unique products or services.
- Direct shipment Contracts where the goods are directly shipped to the City.





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## **Pre-Bid Good Faith Efforts**



#### MWSBE goals are not mandated.

➤ Contractors are required to make Good Faith Efforts (GFE) to meet contract goals as set forth in City's GFE Policy.

#### New Requirement as of July 2013

- ➤ Bidders on construction contracts were required to submit MWBE Participation Plans with bids in order to be responsive
- ➤ If unable to meet advertised MWBE goal, contractor must submit evidence of their efforts to meet goal
- ➢ OBO determines whether efforts were "good faith efforts" based on the City's written GFE Policy

## **Pre-Bid Good Faith Efforts**



#### Contractor Engagement

- Contractor Training in July 2013 before implementation
- Requirements reviewed at pre-bid meetings
- Website: relevant policy, forms and training presentations are easily accessible
- Ongoing meetings with Houston Contractors Association and contractors whose GFE were denied
- August 2014 Seminar
  - Content based on feedback and questions received from contracting community
  - Website: Videotape of seminar; PowerPoint of presentation
- Ongoing conversations and re-evaluation of processes and policies.



# **Contract Compliance**



#### Post-Award GFE Monitoring

- Compliance monitoring with MWBE goal requirements done by OBO Contract
   Compliance team during contract
- Final GFE determination made at the end of contract

### Monitoring Labor Standards

- Prevailing Wage and Equal Employment Opportunity compliance
- Monitored 348 Construction contracts
- Conducted 1042 site visits to Construction projects
- Reviewed 27,817 Certified Payrolls on Construction contracts
- Collected approximately \$36,000 in prevailing wage underpayment penalties





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


