


Program Years 2010 to 2016 Grant Allocations
















Why Is Fair Housing So Important?



Fair Housing Act

The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination against any of the following protected classes:



- Race
- Color
- National Origin
- Religion
- Sex
- Familial Status
- Handicap / Disability

Fair Housing Act Prohibits

Discrimination in the rental or sale of housing

Discrimination in the terms, conditions, privileges, services or facilities of housing

Making, printing or publishing discriminatory advertisements

Representing that housing is unavailable to a protected class when housing is actually available



Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing (AFFH)

Municipalities receiving federal financial assistance must take meaningful actions to:

- Promote fair housing choice
- Foster inclusive communities free from discrimination.
- Overcome historic patterns of segregation

Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing (AFFH)

AFFH includes all actions of the City that directly or indirectly connect to:

- Real estate
- Housing-related advertising
- Home insurance
- Lending
- Land-use

Assessment of Fair Housing (AFH)

HUD's Rule on Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing was published on July 16, 2015

AFH replaces the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI) and identifies four fair housing issues to assess

- Patterns of integration and segregation
- Racially or ethnically concentrated areas of poverty
- Disparities in access to opportunity
- Disproportionate housing needs
