

Item II.a: Access Care of Coastal Texas (All Districts)

- ➤ (1) Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA); (2) Short-Term Rent, Mortgage, and Utilities assistance (STRMU); and (3) Supportive Services for 95 households affected by HIV/AIDS
- > \$629,500 in HOPWA funds totals 65% of program cost
- Contract extended: May 1, 2018 April 30, 2019

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
Item III.a: Approval to Submit the 2018 Annual Action Plan (All Districts)


- The application estimates a total of \$39,172,745.00 in federal funds and \$251,443.00 in program income

- Funds will be used to benefit income-eligible residents during the HUD Program Year (July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019)


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
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







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
Single Family Development - New Construction

- New program to construct affordable single-family homes
- Funded by CDBG, CDBG-DR and TIRZ funds
- Applicants must be at 80% or less of area median income
- Houston Land Bank partnering to provide land parcels
- New homes may be transferred to a community land trust for marketing/sale or sold to approved homebuyer
- Five initial home designs selected based on DR2 community feedback
- 17 initial lots identified for the first round of new homes

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
Item IV: Houston Land Bank (HLB) (All Districts)


- > HLB (formerly LARA) proposes expanding its scope beyond the acquisition of tax delinquent properties to include strategic acquisitions within Complete Communities and disaster-impacted areas
- > HCDD requests \$5,000,000 in TIRZ 2409 funds to create a reimbursement fund for property acquisition in support of the Mayor's vision for increased home construction and **Complete Communities**
- > HLB will return any unused or ineligibly spent funds to the City of Houston


