The proposed ordinance prohibits the oc	cupant of a "dwelling unit" from	accumulating "obje	ects or s	substances	of a nature or in a	
quantity reasonably likely to create a haz	ard to the safety or health of ar	occupant of anoth	ner dwel	ling unit on	the same or a	
contiguous property." If the hoarding b	ehavior has no impact outsid	e the hoarder's ov	wn prop	erty, the b	ehavior will not be	
unlawful under Article XX. The scope	of the ordinance is limited to re	sidents of apartmer	nts, con	dominium ι	units, and townhomes	
sharing an interior wall.

In addition, the ordinance clarifies the cir	cumstances under which an en	forcement officer n	nust obta	ain a warra	int to enter a dwelling	
unit in response to a hoarding complaint	and it prescribes specific proc	edures for such ent	tries. Si	gnificantly,	the ordinance also	
authorizes the enforcement officer to cor	isult with an approved mental h	ealth organization	in appro	priate circi	ımstances; an	
uncodified provision requires promulgation	on of an operating procedure to	r such consults. Fi	ınalıy, al	ithough the	Ordinance is	
enforced by criminal citation, the ordinar	ce declares Council's "expecta	tion that prosecutor	rs assigi	neu lo nano reico thoir	le (Such) citations
