The Mayor's Office of Cultural Affairs now has an experienced and dedicated person in the role of Music + Cultural Tourism Officer.

To achieve this work of advancing Houston's music industry and local tourism, advocate and musician Gracie Chavez joined in January 2022.

The Houston-based artist parlayed her journalism background and musical talents into leading up Bombón, a national music collective and record label, and advocating for women in music.

The Music + Cultural Tourism Officer facilitates the annual global celebration Make Music Day Houston and maintains relationships with the seven (7) cultural arts districts to advance the City's Arts + Cultural Plan.

The next significant step in this role is to help design strategy for municipal support of Houston musicians and its music industry.
