





Administration & Regulatory Affairs

Background

- Chapter 37 prescribes the regulations for investor-owned public utilities operating within the Houston city limits
- Most provisions in the ordinance have not been updated in more than 30 years and some in more than 40 years (1981 and 1994)
- Changes in State law over the decades are not reflected in the ordinance
- Majority of proposed amendments are intended to bring our ordinance into conformity with State law through updates, additions, and deletions



Proposed Substantive Amendments

Current

- Definitions are spread throughout the chapter
- Language for Cable Rate Regulation and State-Issued cable/video franchises
- Rate filing requirements generic for all utilities; no electronic filing
- Ambiguous process for hearings before City Council
- Standards of service that refer to outdated state law

Proposed

- Unified definitions in Article 1
- Eliminate local regulations for areas where local regulation has been preempted by the State
- Rate filing requirements for each utility type that mirror state filing requirements; allow for electronic filing
- Defined process for hearings before City Council
- Updated service standards to mirror standards prescribed by State law and PUC/RRC
 Commission requirements





Proposed Amendments (ctd.)

New utility relocation requirements

 Incorporating language from Chapter 40 regarding facility relocation

New Reporting Requirements

- Significant reports submitted to state are now required to be submitted to City
 - Electric outage summary
 - Electric storm hardening plan
 - Gas gathering, transmission, and distribution report
 - Water service interruption reports
