

Municipal Setting Designations (MSDs)

What is an MSD?



- A <u>voluntary</u> deed restriction that prohibits the use of impaired groundwater as potable water
 - A tool property owners can use to address environmental impairments to groundwater
 - Allows reinvestment and redevelopment of impaired properties
- A public health protection





It is a State Program


- Administered by the Texas Commission on **Environmental Quality** (TCEQ)





A MGD is the way the city can legally say that the contaminated groundwater at a property cannot be used for drinking water now or in the future, thereby protecting public health. It may also help a contaminated site develop or redevelop because the state's requirements to clean up contaminated groundwater may be set at levels based on this restriction. The MSD does not excuse the applicant from clean up activities such as removing the surfaces ofto or reducing other firsts to the public.





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
