




# What is an MSD?

- A <u>voluntary</u> deed restriction that prohibits the use of impaired groundwater as potable water
  - A tool property owners can use to address environmental impairments to groundwater
  - Allows reinvestment and redevelopment of impaired properties
- A public health protection







# What is an MSD?

#### • It is a State Program

- Administered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ)
- Requires Local Support
- Article 13 of Chapter 47
  - Public Hearing Required


# **Baker Hughes Incorporated**

- Continues to be used for oil and gas equipment repairs








# **Crane Energy Flow Solutions**


