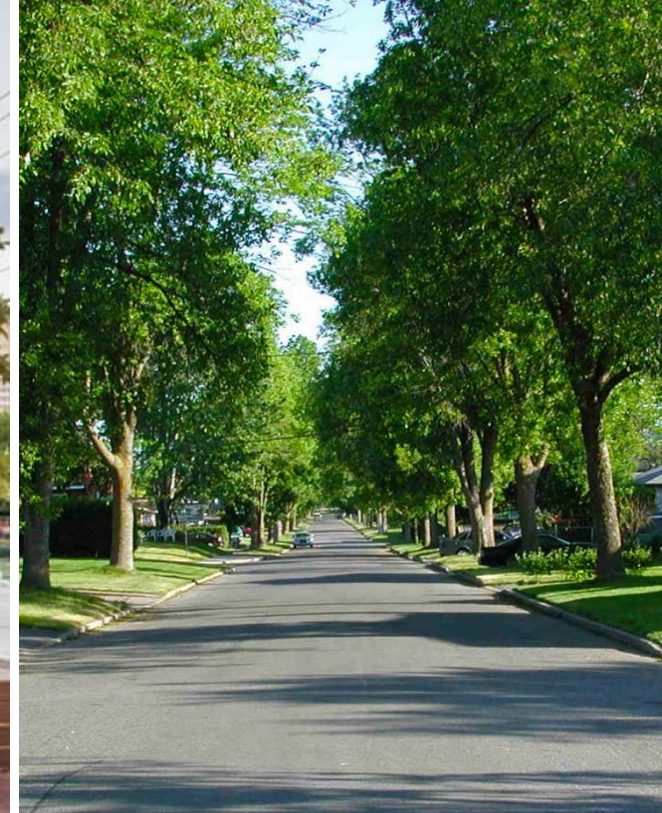




Neighborhood Traffic Management Program – Proposed Revisions

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Background



- June 17, 2015 Ordinance update split program into:
 - Volume Control
 - Speed Control
- Split intended to streamline Speed Control process
 - Reduce time to complete projects
 - Reduce number of Public Meetings
 - Reduce project schedule to 9 months



Speed Control Program Still too Slow



- ✘ Traffic Study Scheduling Delays
 - Data is skewed during summer & Christmas holidays

- ✘ Many Neighborhoods Don't Qualify
 - Speed control requirements not met
 - Utilizing volume control as an alternative

- ✘ Single Public Meeting Required
 - Scheduling time
 - Comment Period at least 2 weeks



Recommendations

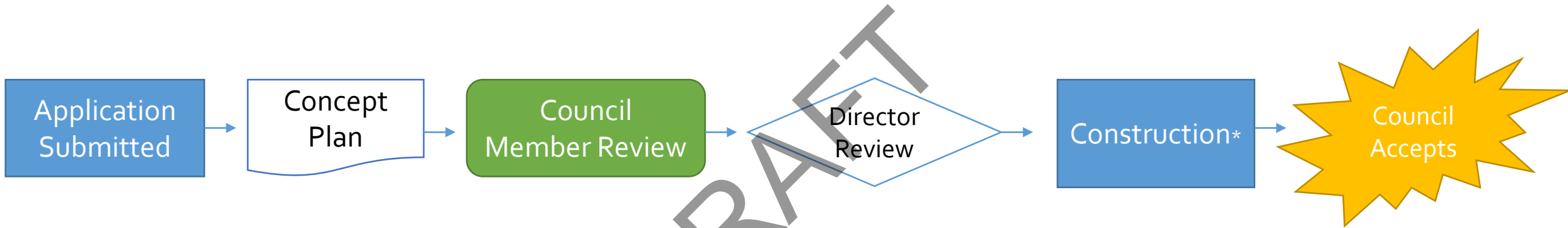


- ✓ Eliminate Traffic Study
- ✓ Qualify All Local Streets for Speed Control Program
- ✓ Replace Public Meeting with Council Member Review
(unless public meeting requested)

**Estimate 6 to 8 weeks from project initiation to Notice to Proceed with Construction*
