Purpose:	In 2016 HITS began to <i>consolidate Microsoft agreements</i> where possible, and to <i>co-term separate department agreements.</i> City Council was advised this process would take 2-3 years to phase-in (as existing agreements expired); annual true-ups would occur going forward. The upcoming council actions will: Provide spending authority through 9/30/2019; Comply with license true-up requirements; Growth for security & upcoming Dynamics deployments
