




















THE REGION

The Houston-The Woodlands-Sugar Land Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) contains nine Texas counties:

Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Montgomery and Waller.


Within these nine counties are 124 incorporated cities and 33 Census Designated Places.

IMPACT OF CLIMATE CHANGE

Hurricane Harvey in 2017

In August 2017, here at home in Houston, we had 52 inches of rain in a 5-day period


- 31% of structures in 100- and 500-year floodplain
- 19% of structures outside the floodplain
- \$2.5 billion in damaged city facilities and infrastructure

From Extreme Cold to Heat

- Winter Storm Uri in Feb. 2021
 - ERCOT was four and half minutes away from complete collapse
- Heatwave July 2022
 - Record setting July comes on the heels of our hottest June on record and second hottest May





Building Codes Generate Big Benefits at a Low Cost



Average home construction cost: \$300,000 Average cost of code requirements to safeguard a new home

Hurricane: \$4,500 (1.5%)

Natural disaster strikes



Average losses avoided from natural hazards over 30 years

Hurricane: \$1,600 losses avoided per year \$48,000 cumulative losses avoided

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



WHAT TO EXPECT -**2021 SIGNIFICANT CODE CHANGES - HOUSTON**

ASCE 7-2022 Standard Update



Updates to rain, wind and tornado loads for more resilient construction

Improves roof underlayment in high wind regions and water infiltration in hurricane prone regions

Expands the Risk Categories for certain Institutional occupancies and other high-risk occupancies



WHAT TO EXPECT – 2021 SIGNIFICANT CODE CHANGES - HOUSTON

Break Tanks for Fire Pumps



Previous code required break tanks for any installation of a fire pump

Eliminates the mandatory requirement for a break tank with a fire pump installation



Perform hydraulic calculations to determine if city water supply will fall below 20 psi prior to needing a break tank



WHAT TO EXPECT – 2021 SIGNIFICANT CODE CHANGES - HOUSTON

Water Dispensers (Drinking Fountains)



Confusion on the requirements for installation of drinking fountains



Prior to 2015 drinking fountains could be eliminated



New amendment will allow substitution of 50% of drinking fountains with other water dispensing methods
