## **HOW DO I FILE A PETITION FOR A CLASS C EXPUNCTION?**

- **1.** What is a "Class C Misdemeanor? A Class C Misdemeanor is a classification of a criminal offense under the Texas Penal Code. A Class C misdemeanor is punishable by fine-only.
- **2.** What is the law and procedure for a Class C Expunction? The law for Class C expunctions is found in Chapter 55; the procedure is outlined in Chapter 55.02 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 3. Is my case eligible for expunction in the City of Houston? Not all cases are eligible for expunction. To be eligible, (1) you must have received an acquittal (found "Not Guilty") after a Trial by Judge or Jury, or (2) convicted but acquitted by Court of Criminal Appeals, or (3) the State's Attorney (prosecutor) recommends expunction before a trial on the offense. If you pled guilty, no contest, or were found guilty after a trial, you are likely not eligible for expunction. Some cases not eligible for expunction in the City of Houston may be eligible in the District Courts. Consult an attorney to determine if you are eligible.
- 4. What do I include with my Petition? The Houston Municipal Court does not provide blank forms for expunction. Your petition must include two (2) documents: (1) Petition for Expunction which includes the names and addresses of the agencies who will receive the Final Order, and (2) a Final Order of Expunction. If your case was not heard in the City of Houston Municipal Court, but in another city's municipal court within Harris County, your package must also include a certified copy of the dismissal Judgment from that court.
- **5.** How many copies of my petition should I bring? When you are ready to file your petition, you should bring three (3) copies. One copy for Court, one copy for the State's Attorney, and one copy for your records after it is file-stamped. File your Expunction Petition package, <u>in person</u> at:

**6.** What is the filing fee? The filing fee is \$100.00, per case, payable in cash, money order, or credit card. In some circumstances, this fee is refundable. Please check the statute or consult an attorney for refund eligibility.
