Houston's Pragmatic Studies Program - Justo Garcia, Admissions Counselor, Kolbe School of Innovation and Professional Services, University of Saint Thomas-Houston

- Kolbe School of Innovation and Professional Services has been around since 2019 and the University of St. Thomas has been around since 1947
- Chairman Dr. Torres and her team launched the Pragmatic Studies Program in 2021:
- Pragmatic Studies is a two year program that offers in person courses to students with disabilities.
- Pragmatic Studies course offers wrap-around services that are integrated into the program using their universal design learning module.
 - Based on three principles: Engagement, Representation, and Material
- Offers dedicated academic success coach, program support, time management, learning therapists, and access to resources.
- UST offers five online degree programs:
 - server security, network technology, general business, drug and alcohol counseling and general studies
- Housing is available on campus or individuals can commute.

- As the program expands, merit-based scholarships will become available.
- Applicants must have graduated from high school and complete a free application. No GPA requirements for online courses.
