Project Name and Number: Hurricane Harvey – TIGER Trail 4

Project Description:

In late August of 2017, the TIGER Trail 4 along Buffalo Bayou in downtown Houston sustained significant damage because of Hurricane Harvey. This project seeks an engineering design solution to stabilize the bayou embankment and to repair the damaged portions of the trail, including the existing irrigation, trail lighting, 3" waterline and landscaping. The scope also includes a review of three elevated decks for structural integrity. The selected design team will evaluate the hike and bike trail to develop the full project scope and provide design and construction level documentation to repair the trail. The City will provide as-built records and a geotechnical report to facilitate the design team's efforts. Services will continue through the warranty and post construction phases.
