Your Options for Immediate Healthcare Needs



Call or see my doctor

- \$
- Medical copayment or coinsurance
- Access to medical files



Go to convenience care clinic

- \$
- Open Access and CDHP only



Go to urgent care

- \$\$
- 65 copayment or
- 20 30% coinsurance after the deductible



Go to ER or call 911

- \$\$\$
- \$400 copayment or
- 20-30% coinsurance
- After the deductible

Emergency Room

Urgent Care



- No appointment necessary
- Less wait times
- Equipped to handle non-life threatening situations
- Primarily treat injuries or illnesses requiring immediate care
- Staffed with doctors and nurses who have access to x-ray and a lab onsite
- Prescriptions
- Cost less than Emergency Room

Freestanding Emergency Room



- Must be staffed with experienced emergency medicine physicians.
- 24 hours a day
- Has the same diagnostic equipment as a hospital-based ER.
- Charge many times more than other providers for the same care.
- Cannot admit to hospitals

Hospital Emergency Room



- Medical treatment facility staffed with experienced emergency medicine physicians
- Available 24 hours a day
 - Usually found in a hospital or other primary care center
- Specializing in:
 - Emergency medicine
 - Acute care without prior appointment
- Direct hospital admittance

Conditions Comparison



Urgent Care

- Minor cuts, sprains, burns,
- Rashes, fever and flu symptoms
- Headaches
- Chronic low back pain




Emergency Room

- Uncontrolled bleeding
- Seizure or loss of consciousness
- Shortness of breath
- Chest pain
- Head injury/major trauma

Urgent Care and Children

- Not all Urgent Care facilities treat children
- Ask if the location services children and what ages before you go
- Visit myCigna.com for a list of all participating UC facilities




Need Help Assessing Where to Go?

- A team of registered nurses are available 24/7/365 to help determine if you:
 - Should call 911 now and seek care now
 - Can be treated at an urgent care clinic
 - Need to make an appointment with your Primary Care Provider
 - Could try home treatment

Primary Care Physician

- Lowest cost
- Medical copay or coinsurance

Urgent Care

- \$65 Copay Limited
- \$75 Copay OAP
- 20 30% coinsurance after deductible CDHP

Emergency Room

- \$400 Copay Limited
- 20 30% coinsurance after deductible OAP & CDHP
