 How long have you practiced immigration law? What type of immigration law do you specialize in? 	Notarios may cheat you or harm your case. ✓ Be WARY if a provider does any of these: • Asks you to sign blank documents
✓ If the individual offering representation avoids your questions, consider finding a different lawyer.	 Refuses to give you a contract for their services Refuse to show you their license or accreditation
 ✓ Call multiple attorneys before you hire one. ✓ YOU are the client and you get to decide who will represent your best interests. 	 Guarantees positive results Claims a special relationship to an immigration officer or judge that will benefit your case
