Westcott Esplanades Receive a Forest Facelift

The City of Houston, together with Guaranty Bank and Temple-Inland Forest, will give two Westcott Esplanades a Forest Facelift on Saturday, November 4, 2006, at 10:00 a.m. Following a brief ceremony, Mayor Bill White and 200 volunteers will plant 2,006 Loblolly Pine Trees, native to Houston, on the medians near Westcott and Durford.

“When these trees grow tall, the Westcott esplanades will not only be beautiful but will provide environmental benefits for us all,” said Mayor Bill White. “Guaranty Bank and Temple-Inland have shown their commitment to Houston, it’s citizens and our City with their donation. They’ve been great corporate sponsors of Tour de Houston and now these trees are further evidence of their commitment to the city.”
