## HPD and the Community: A Sampling of Notables<sup>6</sup>

"National Night Out" - On October 2, 2012, The Houston Police Department and Harris County Sheriff's Office participated in the 29th Annual National Night Out which encourages neighbors to get to know one another. National Night Out is intended to educate and bring awareness to citizens in regards to crime and drug prevention awareness, citizen support and participation in crime prevention programs, and strengthen police-community relationships.

"Run With Your Recruiter" - On October 19, 2012, The Department held another Run With Your Recruiter event. This provides potential cadets an opportunity to speak one on one with a recruiter, test skills, and prepare for the physical agility test.

"Academy Class 213" - On October 24, 2012, Police Chief Charles A. McClelland, Jr. welcomed Sixty-eight police officers to the city during a cadet graduation ceremony at the L. D. Morrison Police Training Academy. Cadet Class 213 graduated after 26 weeks of extensive training at the Houston Police Academy.

"Halloween & Sex Offenders" - HPD Juvenile Sex Offender Registration Unit continued to check residences of sex offenders on probation and parole during the month of October to ensure they are in compliance with their registration requirements and the provisions of their parole or probation. Sex offenders currently on parole or probation must follow specific rules on Halloween. Any violations of these conditions were documented and probation and parole notified. Any violations of these rules were grounds for their probation or parole to be revoked. On Halloween night, HPD officers partnered with the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles to immediately obtain arrest warrants for violators. HPD took these actions on Halloween to help ensure children remain safe while they were trick-or-treating. Sex offenders should be registered in the jurisdiction in which they reside. "Halloween Safety" - October 31, 2012: Officers at the HPD Sunnyside and Telephone Road storefronts invited the community to Trick or Treat with HPD. Residents were taught valuable Halloween safety tips before their children went door-to-door. Participants were encouraged to attend in costume while they enjoyed refreshments and live DJ music.
