PROJECT ABSTRACT-Harris County

Demographics

With a population of 4.8 million residents, Harris County Texas is the 3rd largest county in the United States. Harris County covers 1,707 square miles and is the highest in terms of foreign tonnage and second-busiest in the United States in terms of overall tonnage. The high-density population, numerous stadiums, universities, and other challenges to local law enforcement. The Harris County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) is the primary law enforcement agency for the 1,118 square miles and 13,500 unincorporated areas.

Budgetary Considerations

The unincorporated areas of Harris County have seen an unprecedented explosion in population. According to Rice University's Kinder Institute, the population grew from 1.0 million in 2000 to 1.5 million in 2010 and to 1.9 million in 2020. Over 80% of the county's growth in population since 2000 has been in the unincorporated areas (see Budget Management Department population report). Meeting the demands of a rapidly increasing population with limited resources is the primary challenge facing Harris County today.

Crucial Justice Assistance Funding

As stewards of federal funding, HSCO is reliant on JAG funding for the purpose of providing massive technology improvements as well as critical law enforcement which no local funding is available. The HCSO will look to continue providing excellent service to our community by requesting 2023 JAG funding for project

Project #4 – Helicopter Camera - \$518,000
